# Fruit Salas

### **Ingredients**

1 pint blueberries
1-2 quarts of strawberries, sliced
1 pint of blackberries
3-4 cups of green grapes
1 can peach pie filling

- Take the green tops off the strawberries and slice.
- Combine all fruit in a large bowl.
- Pour in the peach pie filling and mix gently.
- Refrigerate for an hour and serve chilled.

## Sweet and Spicy Pecans

### **Ingredients**

3 cups pecan halves 3 cups water

2 Tbsp brown sugar

1 Tbsp white sugar

3 Tbsp chili powder

### **Directions**

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.

Soak pecans in water for 20 minutes.

Drain pecans and place in large bowl. Add sugar, chili powder. Toss to coat.

Place coated pecans on a large baking sheet. Bake for 10 minutes, stirring midway through baking time. Remove from oven and cool.

It is salad season and these make the BEST salad topping! Sometimes I add a 1/2tsp of cayenne pepper for a little extra heat. SOOO yummy!



The Kansas State Assessment window opens March 18th-April 19th. All students in the following grades will engage in testing during this time accordingly:

Grades 3-8: Math and English
Grades 5 and 8: Science
Grade 10: Math and English
Grade 11: Science and Social Studies

While state assessments often get a bad wrap, with many questioning the relevance of these tests, the assessments are the one of the only comparative measures we have as schools to see how we measure up!

According to *Public School Review*, Lebo is in the top 50% of the 1,264 schools in Kansas. *US News Best High Schools* reports Lebo as the 40th best high school in Kansas and ranked us 5,489th in the Nation.

Our 2023 State Assessment Scores were above the state average in all areas, including the number of students scoring in the proficient range at levels 3 and 4. Reading is our strong area with science showing the most area for improvement.

As we move into the next month, teachers will share the schedule for when your student will be testing! As a team, we can work together to ensure our students feel prepare and are encouraged to do their best! Just like on the court... LET'S GOOOOOO!!! I cannot wait to see our students show up and show out in the BEST ways!

We will have sign ups for items needed, time slots for events that need sponsors and of course we would love your ideas as well!




