We've overcome so many challenges together in Community Unit School District 200 and put our district on a positive path forward that will continue to inspire in everyone a passion to excel.

As a result of this collaborative work, our students achieve high levels of academic success in one of the best-ranked school districts in the entire state of Illinois.

Our board continues to honor the commitment they made in 2017 to invest at least \$7 million per year into capital facilities projects, culminating in more than \$56M of capital improvements since 2017. This has made our schools safer and more cost-efficient while ensuring all students are able to learn in the best possible learning environments. We have completed much of the work needed in our elementary and high school spaces and remain on track to replace all elementary school playgrounds by 2027, and have begun renovating library learning centers in the district.

We are in the final step of a decade-long effort to catch up on our district's infrastructure needs, and put our district on a sustainable path with safe, efficient, and up-to-date buildings. All that remains is to address significant needs at three of our four middle schools, which will start in the summer of 2025 after the overwhelming approval of the November 2024 referendum.
