Superintendent Report

Good News

Due to forecasted inclement weather, the Region Cross Country Meet has been rescheduled for Wednesday, October 11 instead of Thursday, October 12 in Chamberlain.

The Boys Cross Country Team was recognized for placing first at the Parker Invitational and Walter Graesser was acknowledged for winning the individual title.

Supt. Bailey congratulated the following students for receiving their FFA Jackets: Aspen Strand, Taylor Schrank, Cassie Groon, Ava Olson, Tanner Larson, Jasmine Tschumper, Dulcie Veurink, Montana Petersen, Isabelle Suits, and Nathan DeHaan.

Congratulations were also extended to Miss Platte-Geddes High, Emerson Ringling, and Homecoming Marshal, Joey Foxley.

Superintendent's Report

The district's waiver to offer credit to students before grade 9 for Principles of Engineering was approved by Secretary of Education, Joe Graves.

The Department of Education has released the National School Lunch Program Equipment Grant Application. Supt. Bailey will be writing the grant to purchase an additional electric convection steamer. Three quotes have been received that vary in price from \$26,825-\$28,258.72. If the grant is not received, Supt. Bailey would still like to submit a waiver to the state that would allow the district to use Food Service Funds to purchase the steamer.

The Platte-Geddes School District Expectations Survey was sent out recently. This was an opportunity for staff, students, parents, and community members to share their input. Information from the survey will be evaluated during the professional development day on October 20 and used to set performance goals.

The district's 12-passenger van struck a deer while on the way to Vermillion last week. There is just over \$4,800.00 worth of damage. The replacement parts have been ordered and the van should be back on the road without much downtime. A huge thank you to the Bon Homme School District for the use of their 12-passenger van that allowed the students to get to Vermillion and back home. Foreman will be providing the district with a replacement vehicle until the repairs on the van are completed.

The district's suburbans are both over 100,000 miles. Beck Motors in Pierre received the state bid for new suburbans. The proposed cost to the state is \$55, 816.00. The state still needs to approve that price. The district can trade-in vehicles to lower the purchase price. KBB's trade-in value is \$14,549. The district has two new suburbans reserved; however we are not obligated to purchase them. The district has budgeted \$75,000 per year for the past few years for new vehicle purchases but has not made any purchases.

An update of the building projects was given. At the high school, the roof replacement and metal wall panels are completed as well as major interior work. At the elementary, the additional roof and flashing are complete. Items still to be completed at both buildings include air balancing and JCI control work.

The 2-week look ahead items include: Elementary addition: finish installation of storefront, install blacktop where the sanitary sewer and water main was installed, install sidewalk from curb to new entrance, RTU start-up Oct. 9, final painting, bathroom tile work, flooring and casework in the elementary addition. MS/HS: install the exterior blacktop where the water main was installed, install windows on the east side on October 19 & 20.

Supt. Bailey shared results of a survey he recently administered asking how many districts utilize administrators as either route or activity bus drivers. The results showed that over 62% of the districts that responded to the survey did ask their administrators to drive buses. Other districts did not have administrators with CDL's, however if they did, they would also do so. Supt. Bailey went on to say that school district employees, including administrators, step up to fill the need wherever there is one, even if that duty is not assigned to them. That is just the way small school districts work, everyone works together to get the job done.

Business Manager Report

The district received notification that it successfully submitted the FY2023 annual financial report that included the reporting of the district's financial data, monthly cash balances, and teacher compensation. Based on this data submission it has been determined that the district has met the teacher compensation accountability. The teacher compensation accountability for FY2024 requires the district to meet or exceed the average teacher compensation accountability of FY2017.

Secondary Principal Report

Mr. Hunhoff congratulated the Middle School football team and Coaches Jared Veurink and Ryan Leader on an undefeated season. He also wished good luck to the rest of the fall sports as they are wrapping up their regular seasons and preparing for post season play.

The band and choir both performed in Vermillion last week. Congratulations were extended to the band for Marching in the D-Days Parade Saturday Oct. 7th. The following students also were recognized for participating in the All State Choir workshop on Wednesday, October 4th: Clayton Gustad, Nathan DeHaan, Alec VanDerWerff, Presley Meyerink, Nikki VanDerWerff, Charly Veurink, Piper Rasmussen, and Aspen Strand.

Mr. Hunhoff congratulated Charly Veurink for being selected to sing the National Anthem at the Football State Championships in Vermillion in November.

Mrs. Wynia was congratulated for being accepted to the Dakota Dreams Leadership Academy. This program offers teachers the chance to develop their leadership skills, explore other roles and responsibilities within the educational system.

The Shop II class and Mr. Daum have begun construction on a shed. Mr. Daum and the Shop II class have teamed up with Summit to configure blueprints to build the shed, along with the Summit team to utilize a crane, trailer, and miscellaneous tools to drop the shed into its destination when construction is completed.

Parent Teacher Conferences were held at the High School Thursday, October 5th. The teachers did a fantastic job of communicating with parents/guardians both by email or in-house. In-person attendance was 58%. Teachers are still waiting on confirmation of parents/guardians contacted via email.

Elementary Principal Report

Parent/Teacher Conferences were held on Thursday, October 5, 2023. Teachers have reported nearly 100% attendance at conferences. Mrs. Knecht thanked the parents for their continued support of the teachers and school and for their partnership in educating the youth.

The Parent Advisory Committee will meet this month to begin working together to make Platte-Geddes Elementary a more parent and community friendly school. The committee consists of interested parents meeting with the school district administration regarding events for our students and topics of interest. Any elementary parent is welcome to join the Platte-Geddes Elementary Parent Advisory Committee.

Core Educational Coop Report

Supt. Bailey reported on the meeting of the Core Educational Cooperative on October 5, 2023.

Approve Resignation of Platte Colony Paraprofessional, Pamela Hallman

Motion M. Petersen, seconded T. Schuman approving the resignation of Platte Colony Paraprofessional, Pamela Hallman and authorizing the administration to advertise the position. All members present voted aye. Motion carried. Supt. Bailey thanked her for her service to the district.

Second Reading Policies BD, DJ, DJC JFCL

The board gave second reading to the following policies BD: School Board Meetings, DJ: Purchasing Procedures, DJC: Bidding Requirements, and JFCL: Student Registered Sex Offenders. The recommended changes are a result of action taken during the 2023 Legislative Session. Motion D. DeBoer, seconded M. Petersen approving the revised policies. All members present voted ave. Motion carried.

First Reading Section J Policies (Students), JA through JFCC-R

The board gave first reading to Section J Policies, JA through JFCC-R which contain policies, regulations, and exhibits related to students.

Approve Change Orders #5 and #6

Change order #5 (Blackhawk Roofing) is for painted metal panels to cover the exterior unit ventilator openings at the high school. The amount is \$2,909.93.

Change order #6 (Scott Doom Contracting) is for additional soffits above the kitchen refrigerator and first floor men's bathroom at the high school, and the addition of a furred-out wall in the elementary addition to accommodate new domestic lines to the sinks so they are not located in an exterior wall. The amount is \$4,375.15.

Motion D. DeBoer, seconded M. Petersen approving Change Orders #5 and #6 for a total amount of \$7,285.08. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Appoint Delegate Assembly Representative
