Superintendent Report

Good News

Supt. Bailey congratulated the Girls' Cross Country team for qualifying for the State A Meet, Berklee Mills. Dulcie Veurink, Charlotte Qualm, Hannah Kirsch, Braelyn Qualm, Kala Maxon, and Charlie Veurink. The boys qualifiers, Walter Graesser and Carson Vanden Berge, were also congratulated.

The Cheer and Dance team was congratulated for their performances at the State Competition in Sioux Falls. They placed 2nd in Jazz, 3rd in Pom, 5th overall Dance, and 8th overall small group cheer.

Academy Pork and their seven team members have graciously donated \$1,000.00 to Mrs. Konechne's "Sack It" program. The "Sack It" program started in 2020 and continues to currently serve the families in the Platte-Geddes School District. In collaboration with the Helping Hands Food Pantry and generous donations, they are able to provide families in our district with food items over the weekends and long breaks along with other identified needs. The purpose of the program is to assist families in offsetting their weekly grocery expenses and support our local food pantry. The program runs October-May and any family can join at any time throughout the school year.

During the "Remembering Reece Reiser with Acts of Kindness Day" an anonymous donation of \$100.00 was given to the district to assist families with their school lunch accounts. Supt. Bailey thanked all those who make donations to help assist our students and their families.

Congratulations were extended to the Platte-Geddes Volleyball Team for qualifying for the 2023 State A Tournament in Rapid City on November 16-18.

Superintendent's Report

The district received its Fall Enrollment State Aid Report from the Department of Education. The 2023-2024 official enrollment is 513, which is a .35 increase from last year's enrollment of 512.65. Our enrollment continues to remain relatively steady. The 2021 state aid enrollment was 500.63.

The district has been working with Kyle Laughlin, director of TIE, to disaggregate data from the Smarter Balance Assessment. The assessment is not diagnostic in nature; thus, it is hard to identify areas of improvement. TIE was very eager to assist the district in this venture and hopes to use our feedback to help other districts as well. The goal of the initial meeting was to learn how the district could use AI technology (ChatGPT) to provide data for academic improvement. This is a very exciting opportunity and a great way to expand our working relationship with TIE.

At last month's board meeting, it was alleged that the district is paying Site Logiq \$2 million as the project manager for the renovations and elementary addition. The actual amount of their contract is \$703,481. This amount is based on the original contact when the district agreed to partner with them. At that time, the project amount was closer to \$6 million. The final project price is approximately \$8,000,000 and Site Logiq's percentage as the project manager is completion.

The South Dakota Bureau of Information and Telecommunications (BIT) is partnering with the DOE to offer school districts free risk assessments and vulnerability scans to help identify and evaluate risks that could be affected by cyberattacks and ransomware. BIT personnel were in the district on Monday, November 7 conducting the risk assessment. We are expecting the results in 3-4 weeks. It is a good security practice to conduct a risk assessment and security scan at least annually.

Supt. Bailey serves on the South Dakota United School Association Executive Board. The Fall Retreat was held on November 7-8 in Mitchell. As part of the retreat, presentations from economist, Jared McEntaffer, from the Dakota Institute, Dr. Doug Wermedal from ASBSD, and SD Senate Majority Leader, Casey Crabtree were heard. McEntaffer presented information on the exploration of recent K12 and Housing Trends. Wermedal and Crabtree's presentation covered potential legislation including, school vouchers, accountability, age-appropriate book policies, alternative teacher certification, and public school funding. Crabtree warned those in attendance to brace for an increase in K12 public school funding of only 2%.

The Buildings and Grounds Committee met prior to the board meeting. The committee reviewed the fiveyear Capital Outlay Plan and discussed potential upcoming projects which included the elementary parking lot, carpet replacement rotation, propane tank replacement and the purchase of school vehicles.

Supt. Bailey shared the District Report Card information with the Board of Education.

At the conclusion of the Superintendent's Report, President Ross Varilek congratulated the fall sports teams for their outstanding seasons. Being able to host football playoff and region volleyball games was a privilege and gave the district the ability to showcase our outstanding facilities.

Business Manager Report

Schoenfish & Co., Inc. will begin the audit of the 2022-2023 fiscal year on Tuesday, December 5th.

The district will be receiving their third fourth round of Supply Chain Assistance Funding in early December in the amount of \$14,236.80.

K. Holter presented several slides explaining the district's revenue sources and expenditure categories.

Secondary Principal Report

Mr. Hunhoff mentioned some of the current events taking place at the high school. He highlighted the activities and experiments in Mrs. Biddle's science classes.

The Educators Rising Group presented its first educator of the month to both buildings. Mrs. DeGroot is waiting to collaborate with the group about the results.

PAL kick off paired up 39 high school students with elementary students. The PALs and mentors meet weekly.

Mr. Hunhoff congratulated Tristen Petrik for being nominated the DAR Good Citizen.

On October 31st, Mrs. Hanson, Mrs. Larson, and the Student Council rented out the movie theater and selected Top Gun: Maverick for the 6-12 students to watch. Last spring, Mrs. Hanson and Mr. Hunhoff

partnered with the University of Michigan to conduct a survey on the student body. The school received \$1,000 as payment to do this survey. It was decided that those funds would be used to celebrate the students. Overall, it was a great experience and enjoyed by the students. Nate & Katy VanderPol and Aaron & Meghan Olson were thanked for donating popcorn. Mr. Hunhoff also thanked Mrs. Hanson, Mrs. Larson, and the student Council for organizing the activity.

Mrs. Nelson's Senior Experience Class has implemented a students of the week project. Questionnaires are distributed to the TAA advisor who then choose students who show panther pride, hard work, and leadership. This project has been conducted for four weeks.

Elementary Principal Report

Mrs. Knecht attended the Principal Mentor/Mentee Workshop in Sioux Falls on Friday, November 3. This year she is mentoring first year principal, Mrs. Beth Victor, K-12 Principal of the Plankinton School District. Rick Melmer was the featured speaker and his message on leadership, personality styles in learning and in the workplace, crucial conversations, and keeping balance in your work and life was outstanding. The mentoring program is sponsored through the DOE.

The annual Veteran's Day Program and Breakfast was held on Friday, November 10 in the Elementary Gym. The Veteran's Day Program was held on Friday afternoon at 1:00. The Elementary Student Council sponsored a "Fallen Comrade Table," to remind individuals of fallen, missing, or imprisoned U.S. Military Service Members.

The first Parent Advisory Committee Meeting was held in October. The committee discussed opportunities to have parents welcomed in the elementary building. The goal is to be a partnership school with parents and community members. The first event was a "Pumpkin Decorating Contest".

R. Summerville reported on the meeting of the Core Educational Cooperative on November 8, 2023.

R. Summerville reported on the meeting of the Mid Central Educational Cooperative held on November 7, 2023..

Approve Elementary Custodian Resignation

Motion T. Olsen, seconded M. Petersen approving the resignation of elementary custodian, John Oster. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve Platte Colony Paraprofessional Contract

Motion R. Summerville, seconded T. Schuman approving the contract of Katy VanderPol as Platte Colony paraprofessional at an hourly rate of \$15.65 per hour plus the special education differential pay. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve Elementary Custodian Contract

Motion M. Petersen, seconded T. Olsen approving the contract of Samantha Cole as elementary school custodian at an hourly rate of \$16.65 per hour. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve Contract Amendment of James Neuman

Motion R. Summerville, seconded T. Schuman approving the contract amendment of James Neuman adding the extra duty assignment of Junior High Girl's Basketball Coach at \$2,736.96. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve Contract Amendment of Calvin Hunhoff

Motion R. Summerville, seconded J. Veurink approving the contract amendment of Calvin Hunhoff adding the extra duty assignment of head girl's basketball coach at \$5,117.73. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Approve Contract Amendment of Allison DeHaan

Motion R. Summerville, seconded M. Petersen approving the contract amendment of Allison DeHaan adding the extra duty assignment of spring play assistant director at \$456.16. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

E-Sports

Superintendent Bailey wrote and received a Foundation for Rural Service Community Grant. The purpose of the grant was to fund a Platte-Geddes E-Sports Program. The grant awarded was \$5,000 and would cover the E-Sports school fee, 20-hours of E-Sports coaching, and student participation fees. A meeting was held on Monday, November 6 to gauge the level of interest in E-Sports. The initial meeting involved only students who will not participate in a winter sport. Twenty-five students attended the meeting, most of whom were middle school students. Since the practices and competition are very flexible, students who play winter sports would also able to participate.

Unfortunately, the E-Sports School Fee will only cover high school students or junior high students. There would be two \$1,000 fees if the district had a junior high and high school team. The administration and board would have to determine which grade levels to offer Esports.

Motion M. Petersen, seconded D. DeBoer offering an E-Sports program to high school students for the 2023-2024 school term. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Dakota Christian School Athletic Coop Discussion

Dakota Christian School administrator, Steve Randall, contacted superintendent Bailey to see if the district would be willing to discuss the possibility of an athletic coop and shared educational opportunities. Board members Tom Olsen, Dennis DeBoer, and Jared Veurink, along with Mr. Cutler, Mr. Hunhoff, and Mr. Bailey met with the Dakota Christian board committee comprised of Cassie Erickson, Randy Veurink, and Paul Baas. The committee met for about an hour. At the conclusion of the meeting, no decision was made regarding the athletic coop.

After considerable discussion, the board directed Supt. Bailey to conduct a survey to gather information/opinions from all constituents regarding an athletic cooperative. The results of the survey will be discussed next month, and a decision will be made at that meeting.

The Platte-Geddes Committee was informed that the SDHSAA would like a decision in December for football scheduling purposes.

Approve Increase to Imprest Fund Limit

The Imprest Fund is an account within the General Fund established to make payments immediately rather than monthly. The limit on this fund has been \$5,875.00 for more than 20 years. Due to a busy fall, which included hosting football playoff games, region volleyball matches, the Platte-Geddes Cheer and Dance Invitational, issuing student meal allowances for state events, the limit was not high enough to cover all the expenses. Holter is requesting that the limit be raised from \$5.875.00 to \$9,875.00. This will ensure that the district does not exceed the limit and be out of compliance. Motion R. Summerville, seconded D. DeBoer approving the increase to the Imprest Fund from \$5,875.00 to \$9,875.00. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Declare Electric Tilting Skillet Surplus

The district's kitchen has an electric tilting skillet that is not used and is taking up a lot of kitchen space. The kitchen staff has found another school that is interested in purchasing it. To sell the tilting skillet, the board must first declare it surplus. It is valued at \$9,000.00. Motion M. Petersen, seconded J. Veurink declaring the electric tilting skillet as surplus property at a value of approximately \$9,000.00. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

State-Bid Vehicle Purchase/Mini Bus Purchase

As reported at the October board meeting, the district has two suburbans reserved through the state-bid process. Beck Motors in Pierre was awarded the suburban bid and the price for a 2024 is \$55,816. The two suburbans the district currently owns that were also purchased from Beck Motors have been mechanically sound. They both have over 110,000 miles on them and are used several times each week throughout the school year. The district was also loaned a mini bus after the Econoline Van was hit by a deer and was in for repairs. Staff that used the mini bus were satisfied with that vehicle and felt that it would be a good addition to the district's fleet.

The Buildings and Grounds Committee evaluated the needs of the district and made the recommendation to purchase one new suburban through the state bid process from Beck Motors and also purchase the Mini Bus from Foreman Bussing in the amount of \$25,000.00. The committee also recommended that the 2009 Ford Fusion and the 2013 Dodge Caravan (previously declared surplus) be declared surplus and sold or discarded. Motion T. Olson, seconded T. Schuman to purchase one new suburban from Beck Motors through the state-bid process and to purchase the mini bus from Foreman Bussing in the amount of \$25,000.00. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Second Reading Section J Policies (Students) JA through JFCC-R

The board gave second reading to Section J Policies, JA through JFCC-R. Motion R. Summerville, seconded M. Petersen approving and adopting the policies as reviewed and revised. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

First Reading Section J Policies (Students), JFCD through JHCDE-E(1)

The board gave first reading to Section J Policies, JFCD through JHCDE-E(1) which contain policies, regulations, and exhibits related to students.

Amend School Calendar

The State Volleyball Tournament is scheduled for November 16-18. Platte Geddes' first match against Dell Rapids will be played at 12:45MT. The remainder of the schedule depends on how the first match plays out. It has been past practice for the school board to cancel school if a team qualifies for a state tournament and plays a first-round morning or afternoon contest.

If the board decides to cancel school, it is recommended to make up those days within the first semester of the school year, due to it being shorter than second semester. The recommended make-up days are December 21-22.

Motion D. DeBoer, seconded R. Summerville to amend the school calendar cancelling school on November 16 and 17 for the state volleyball tournament and adding December 21 and 22 as instructional makeup days. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Appoint Legislative Action Network Representative(s)

The board needs to appoint Legislative Action Network representatives who will serve as the point of contract during legislative session. These people will receive legislative information and may be contacted by elected officials regarding potential legislation. Motion R. Summerville, seconded J. Veurink appointing Tina Schuman and Dennis DeBoer as Platte-Geddes School District's LAN Representatives. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Declare 2009 Ford Fusion Surplus

Motion T. Olsen, seconded M. Petersen declaring the 2009 Ford Fusion car as surplus property. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

Set Time/Date for September Board Meeting

A boys basketball game conflicts with the regular scheduled December 11th School Board Meeting date. Motion D. DeBoer to reschedule the meeting for 7:00 a.m. on Monday, December 11th.
