Accelerated classes offered as well as Physical Science, Algebra 1, Spanish I & II, and French I & II. 94.8% of our identified Gifted and Talented population are enrolled in Middle School advanced classes 	 All students should be showing greater growth in Literacy and Math Achievement scores K-8 should show significant increases.

 Elementary school counselor pushes into the classrooms on a regular basis. Middle School counselor works with groups of students to remediate conflicts. SBIT meets with students and parents using a restorative behavior model to create a behavior plan when needed. Teachers serve as mentors for middle school students who need extra support. 1.3% of discipline issues occur during morning arrival. 5.5% of discipline issues occur during afternoon dismissal. 	 We have several families impacted by death in their immediate families. Middle School Counselor has to pull students from class to provide counseling sessions. SBIT students reappear before the team while the classroom teacher is unaware of previous strategies or weaknesses needing support prior to SBIT referral. 51.1% of behavior incidents requiring parent contact occur on the playground. 28.9% of behavior incidents requiring office referrals occur in the classroom.

 PTSA is very active and supports FHSA. PTSA provides grants for the teachers to help with purchasing supplies for their classrooms. Parents are involved in STEM Showcase night, Elementary Choir performances, Middle School Fine Arts night. Teachers on average have 80% of parents who attend Parent Teacher Conferences.
