ELA

We will begin our next theme:
Marvelous Me. We will discuss and explore the questions- What makes me special? Who am I?, What do my senses tell me about the world? Why are friends and families important? and What are some of my favorite things?

MATH

We have been working on counting from 1-10 and recognizing numbers 1-10 in written form. We have also been identifying small groups and comparing their quantities. The students have been working on simple repeating patterns using connecting cubes, shapes and rhythms, and begun to identify and match two dimensional shapes. They will continue to us one-one correspondence to count objects and sort them into larger groups

SECOND STEP

We are learning how to listen and how to focus our attention. We will learn to follow directions, ask for what you need and how to identify your feelings.



7th & 8th Grade Accelerated Algebra:

Students have been selected to be in the advanced Math class this year. This means they will be working on a curriculum that is a combination of their current grade level and the next grade level.

The 8th graders will be taking the Algebra Regents exam in June. They have the opportunity to go to high school with a regents credit. The 7th graders are working to prepare to take the Algebra Regents exam at the end of their 8th grade year.



7th Grade Science

This month we are working our way through our cells unit. Currently your children are learning about cell transport with a focus on the cell membrane. We have been able to use microscopes to look at slides of both animal and plant cells. Everyone was very exciting to see cells. After our cells topic we will be moving on to the cell cycle and photosynthesis. IF you ever have any questions or concerns you can always message me on dojo or send me an email.

Accelerated Biology

This month we will be focusing on ecology. We'll be looking at weather and climate first followed by biomes and aquatic ecosystems. Please remind your children to study more for quizzes and tests. Reviewing notes and using the review book on a nightly basis will ensure your child is successful. If you ever have any questions or concerns you can email me or message me on class dojo.

7th & 8th Grade English Language Arts Mrs. Douglas

The students are continuing to work on Literary Elements and Techniques, simultaneously delving into increasing the required 50,000-word vocabulary exposure for grade and age level acquisition. Students are acquisitioning mood and tone, theme and characterization in any given literary piece. Students are also being introduced to Modern Language Association style writing along with research and data. Students will begin to be introduced to Greek and Latin Roots, along with a wide-ranging focus on integrating grammar instruction into reading and writing, making lessons contextual, communicative, and engaging, and ensuring subject knowledge is strong. Students have also been provided with information on their TED Talks that are being presented on November 14, 2025, during class time.

Each month we will have a topic of special interest. This month's topic is receptive language.

Receptive Language

Q: What is receptive language?

A: Included the understanding and use of:

- Grammar
- Vocabulary
- Comprehension of auditory and written material

Q: How does this affect my child's performance at school?

A: Students with receptive language deficits have difficulty understanding auditory and written information. Common behaviors include:

- Difficulty following directions
- Being off task
- Inability to focus
- Poor reading comprehension
- Difficulty understanding "wh" questions
- Difficulty retaining information

Q: How do we develop receptive language skills in speech therapy?

A: Based on standardized testing, professional judgement and teacher/student collaboration we are to develop appropriate yearly goals. These skills help the students participate appropriately in the classroom and access curriculum successfully.


