

TESTING & APPLICATION FEE WAIVERS

A fee waiver is used to wave the fee associated with signing up for the SAT and/or ACT and the fee associated with a college application.

1. What kind of fee waivers are there?

- There are two common types of fee waivers: admission test fee waivers and college application fee waivers. Admission test fee waivers allow the student to sign up for the SAT and/or ACT at no cost (as long as they do so by the registration deadline). College application fee waivers allow students to submit a college application without paying an application fee.

2. Who qualifies to receive a fee waiver?

- To receive a fee waiver, a student must meet one of the following criteria:
 - Be enrolled in or eligible for the Federal Free or Reduced Price Lunch program
 - Family income meets the Income Eligibility Guidelines set by the USDA Food and Nutrition Service
 - Family receives public assistance
 - Student lives in federally subsidized public housing, a foster home, or are classified as homeless
 - Student is a ward of the state or an orphan

3. Where do I get my waiver, if I qualify?

- Students can pick up an SAT and ACT fee waiver or a college application fee waiver in the College and Career Center.

4. How many waivers can I receive?

- Students are allowed 2 SAT fee waivers and 2 ACT fee waivers.

5. How do I receive a NACAC college application fee waiver?

- Financially eligible students may request NACAC college application fee waivers in the College and Career Center.

6. Do all colleges accept college application fee waivers?

- No, not all colleges accept college application fee waivers.
