The city of Claremont is in a suburban setting 30 miles east of Los Angeles. The community of approximately 36,000 has seven colleges and traditionally provides outstanding support for the school system. A high quality education is a priority for the schools and the community.

Claremont High School is a public four-year comprehensive high school with a present enrollment of 2190 students, with 577 seniors. It maintains a traditional two-semester calendar with varied summer school offerings. Claremont High School was first authorized as an International Baccalaureate (IB) World School in 2009-2010; the Class of 2024 will be the 14th class to complete the full diploma program. In the Class of 2023, 32 students earned the full IB Diploma. The school has extensive co- and extra-curricular programs in athletics, theater, music, speech, debate, and numerous clubs.

The designation of "IB Diploma Candidate" on the transcript indicates that the student is on-track to complete all requirements for the IB Diploma.

Claremont High School has three Grade Point Averages (GPAs) and class ranks: Class ranks are computed at the semester.

- State – all grades earned from Grade 10 through Grade 12 (excluding physical education)
- Overall – includes all grades earned after Grade 8 through Grade 12
- Overall Weighted - includes all grades earned after Grade 8 through Grade 12 and UC approved Honors, AP, and IB courses are weighted.
- *****Ransomware Information****Claremont Unified School District suffered a ransomware attack in November 2019. Email and other electronic systems were unavailable to students and staff from November 8, 2019 through January 2020. This impacted communication and learning for CHS students.
- *****COVID-19 Pandemic Information*****Claremont High School suspended in-person learning on March 13, 2020. Remote learning occurred from March 20, 2020 to June 11, 2020. During the 2020-2021 year, distance learning occurred from September 2, 2020 to April 9, 2021. Partial in-person learning occurred from April 12 to June 16, 2021. Claremont High School offered students letter grades as well as Pass/Fail grading options during spring 2020 and summer 2020 terms, as well as during the entire 2020-2021 academic year.
