We have listened to our community and are answering the call to align ourselves with the values and desires of Cascade.






OBJECTIVE #1: CORE ACADEMICS

Goal:

Develop a robust career and technical education (CTE) program that equips students with industry-relevant skills, hands-on experience, and direct pathways to high-demand careers through strengthened partnerships with businesses, apprenticeships, and certifications. Establish a local CTE center that supports local, state, and national industry needs by offering multiple vocational pathways, including but not limited to those aligned with the Agriculture Food, & Natural Resources (AFNR) career cluster such as welding, mechanics, mining, and pathways within AFNR like animal science, plant systems, and environmental sciences, ensuring students gain realworld training that prepares them for immediate employment or further specialized education.

Goal:








Goal:
