Viroqua Area Schools summer school programming is for elementary, middle, and high school students. The high school has a different start and stop date than the elementary and middle school and is mainly utilized for high school students seeking credit recovery. The elementary and middle school includes a morning classroom experience for resident students with **no enrollment fee**, and a variety of classroom enrichment classes available for the afternoon with **no enrollment fee**.

ATTENDANCE: While students are encouraged to attend all summer sessions, we understand that family trips are often planned during the summer and that some absences are inevitable. Please let your child's teacher know ahead of time of any planned absences. If you sign up for one of the enrichment classes (e.g., camping or canoeing), please note the date so your child is in attendance. These classes are dependent on enrollment and often have a waiting list. Please notify Brenda Haugrud as soon as you know your child will not be attending to allow another student to have the opportunity. **For HS students, absences could jeopardize their ability to recover lost credit.**

BREAKFAST AND LUNCH: All food will be served in the MS/HS cafeteria at the times listed below.

Breakfast and lunch will be available to all summer school students aged 18 and under who wish to participate (at no cost to families).

[Note: The Summer Food Program is open to the public daily during summer school from 7:30 - 8:30 for breakfast and 11:30 - 12:30 for lunch. The meals can be eaten in the cafeteria.]

TRANSPORTATION: Transportation to and from summer school is a parent responsibility. Please utilize the parent pick-up and drop-off area located at **Door #25** of the **MS/HS building** (picture located on the next page). It is important that children are here on time and picked up promptly. Students can be dropped off at the MS/HS Door #25 as early as 7:45. Students will be able to enter the building at around 7:50. Students leaving at the conclusion of the morning session can be picked up anytime between 11:30 and 11:50 at Door #25. The first afternoon enrichment session starts at 12:00 and the last session ends at 2:50. **All students need to be picked up promptly at 2:50.**

Tuition for Non-Resident Students

Any student seeking entrance into the Viroqua Area Schools Summer School Program must reside within the established boundaries of the district or participate in Open Enrollment. The child's parent or legal guardian must reside within the Viroqua School District boundaries. Non-resident students will be charged tuition in accordance with state tuition laws (121.77). Non-resident students who have applied to the Board of Education by April 30, 2024, for the *Public School Open Enrollment Program*, and have been approved to enroll for the 2024 – 2025 school year, may be waived for tuition for summer school enrollment. Summer school tuition is \$1,117 for the 30 day morning session, and \$266 for each of the afternoon 30 day enrichment classes.

Tuition can be calculated (if requested) for the extra classes (fishing, camping, canoeing, Outdoor Adventures, Sports Performance Camp, etc.).


NOTE: Non-resident students are students who reside outside of the district and do not attend Viroqua Area Schools.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

MORNING CLASSES: 7:45-11:30

CLASSROOM PROGRAM: GRADES PK-K-1-2-3-4

Students are assigned to classrooms with students of their age and peer level. Daily activities include academics which are enriched by library, art, and physical education.

CLASSROOM PROGRAM: GRADES 5-6-7-8

Through a variety of activities in and out of the classroom, students will have the opportunity to strengthen their reading and math skills.

AFTERNOON ENRICHMENT CLASSES:

Each class is 50 minutes long, unless otherwise indicated. Please see grade level registration forms for sessions and times offered.

THE ABCs OF SUMMER PLAY: GRADE PK

Students will work on fine and gross motor skills and will explore the alphabet through crafts, books, music, games, and activities.

ARTS AND CRAFTS: GRADES 5-6-7-8

Students will complete a variety of age-appropriate projects - time to get creative and crafty!

BASKETBALL OPEN GYM: GRADES 3-4-5-6-7-8

Students will play games, shoot baskets, and do challenge activities.

CAN YOU GUESS OUR THEME TODAY?: GRADE PK

Students will enjoy activities based on a new theme each day.

COOKING WITH THE ALPHABET: GRADE PK

Students will make a snack each day that follows the alphabet and create a cookbook of their recipes.

DRAMA: GRADES K-1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8

Students will learn performance warm-ups, characterization, stage movement and voice, and improvisational story creation and performance.

ESCAPE ROOMS: GRADES 5-6-7-8

Students will practice academic, teamwork, and problem solving skills while completing escape room challenges in a given time.

FISHING: GRADES 4-5-6-7-8

This fishing class is for any child in 4th grade and up who would like to learn more about fishing and enjoy the outdoors. Fishing trips will focus on the man-made lakes near Viroqua. A note with further details will be sent home prior to the class. Students are required to furnish their own fishing equipment and bait.

Note: This class runs all afternoon- please do not choose a 1:00 and 2:00 class. Also students should be aware that there might be days when they will not catch a fish.

FUN WITH CARDS AND DICE: GRADES 2-3-4

Students will play cards or dice, teach each other new games, and learn from each other. These games will allow students to use many skills including math, problem solving, and working together.

FUN WITH FABRIC: GRADES 4-5-6-7-8

When is a quilt "Knot a Quilt?" Students will use fleece fabric to create an individually designed tie blanket. Then, we will create sock owls, rag rugs, and crafts to wear. Tap into your creative side and personalize your crafts.

FUN WITH NATURE: GRADES 4-5-6-7-8

Rock painting, stepping stones, and bird feeders, oh my! Come join us as we use nature to inspire our creative side. Students will collect sticks to make yarn-wrapped mobiles and you will craft your name with outdoor items too! We can't wait to see your creations and have some fun!

GARDENING: GRADES 3-4-5-6

Students will learn the basics of growing a successful garden. Students will start and care for their own garden plants from seeds.

HEALTHY SCIENCE AND SNACKS: GRADES 3-4-5

Students will love to learn about the amazing and surprising things that happen in their bodies, along with healthy eating and snacks. This course will teach about the nervous, digestive, and circulatory systems of their bodies through reading and hands-on activities. Students will also learn about the food groups and how they can create simple healthy snacks. They will learn to write a recipe and create a "Healthy Snack Guide" recipe book to take home with them.

IMAGINATION, EXPLORATION!: GRADES K-1-2

In this class, students will spend time playing and exploring the world around them. We will engage in hands-on learning through play with peers. We will spend time outside, playing with manipulatives, making crafts and other activities.

LET THE GAMES BEGIN!: GRADES 4-5-6 (ALL AFTERNOON)

Students will build using different materials, such as Legos, Lincoln Logs, cups, paper tubes, etc.

LET'S COMPETE!: GRADES 6-7-8 (ALL AFTERNOON)

Students will create solutions to problems and show off their STEAM (science, technology, engineering, the arts, math) skills using LEGO Education Spike™ Prime sensors, motors, hubs, and other elements. Students will solve weekly challenges that will be posted to VAS social media sites and will discover lessons about math, science, and the arts.

MINI CHEER CAMP: GRADES 2-3-4-5

Students will work together to learn basic cheer and dance moves, while enjoying a fun way to exercise and show school spirit!

MOVING MINDS: GRADES K-1-2-3-4-5

Bubbles, yoga, and nature walks, oh my! Build a kite, go on a scavenger hunt, and play lawn games. Experience many ways to relax and restore your mind.

NATIONAL PARKS EXPLORATION: GRADES 2-3

Are you ready for an adventure? Calling all Junior Park Rangers! Join us as we "travel" to different National Parks across the United States. Explore the active volcanoes at Hawaii Volcanoes National Park, tiptoe around the hot springs at Yellowstone National Park, hike in the mountains at Glacier National Park, and swim with the alligators at Everglades National Park. Fire up your imagination – adventure awaits!

ORDINARY INTO EXTRAORDINARY: GRADES 5-6-7-8

Students will use their imaginations to be inspired by some regular household items to design one of a kind creations! A duct tape pouch, coffee filter flowers, and some cool bookmarks are a few of the pieces that we will create. Join us to learn how to take everyday items to a new level!

OUTDOOR ADVENTURES: GRADES 4-5-6 (ALL DAY)

Our adventures will include outdoor educational learning experiences for 4th, 5th, and 6th grade students. These learning experiences will include both environmental and historical related topics with lots of fun along the way. We plan to take daily ALL-DAY field trips to many exciting places. Join us and you'll spend your days outdoors!

NOTE: This class will <u>not</u> be available to students involved in Park & Rec because we will be traveling every day. Also, students who sign up should commit to all 15 days.

READ ALOUDS: GRADES K-1-2-3

Students will listen to old and new read alouds and then talk about them while learning vocabulary and strengthening comprehension.

READ IT AND MAKE IT!: GRADES K-1-2

Students will listen to stories and make crafts to go along with them.

READING RELAXATION: GRADES 3-4-5-6-7-8

Students will read silently to maintain their reading skills and take their mind on a journey. There will be time at the end of each session to share about what was read.

SCIENCE SCHOOLYARD: GRADES 3-4-5-6

Students will use STEM building skills, cooperation, and the scientific process to complete experiments and activities.

SCRAPBOOKING: GRADES 2-3-4

Students will create a book of memories by designing scrapbook pages to share pictures from their birthdays, vacations, and other special memories.

SOCCER SKILLS: GRADES 3-4-5-6-7-8

Students will work on fundamental soccer skills: passing, dribbling, shooting on goal, trapping/stopping, defense, and teamwork. Students will also learn the rules of the game and positions in scrimmage games.

STORYTIME, SUNSHINE, MUSIC AND SNACKS: GRADE PK

Students will listen to stories, learn songs, play outside, and share a snack related to the books for the day.

SUMMER CAMP GAMES: GRADES 3-4

Students will learn the rules of some common outdoor games and how to keep score. Students will also experience friendly competition with others and show good sportsmanship through team building activities.

Basic water safety will be taught, with the opportunity to swim afterwards. This course will run from 1:00-2:50.

WONDERHUNT: GRADES 5-6-7-8

Students will accomplish a photo challenge and reflect on the "I Wonder" prompt with the photos they capture. Students should be able to walk half a mile, two to three times a week.

YOGA AND MEDITATION: GRADES K-1-2-3-4-5

Students will learn yoga poses and meditation techniques, and listen to read alouds to help find peace and well-being.

MS CAMPING: GRADES 5-6-7-8

Students will be fishing, cooking, hiking and swimming at Sidie Hollow. Students wanting to fish need to bring their own poles and bait. A letter will be sent prior to the trip with additional details for all registered students.

4thGRADE CAMPING: GRADE 4

Students will have an introduction to camping, setting up their own tent, campfires, hiking, nature exploration, swimming, and cooking over a fire. A letter will be sent prior to the trip with additional details for all registered students.

CANOEING THE KICKAPOO: GRADES 5-6-7-8

Students will participate in a day of outdoor activities including hiking, canoeing, and other nature experiences. A letter will be sent out prior to the trip with additional details for all registered students.
