We are so excited to be back together and settling into another great school year! Over these first few weeks, our students and staff have been busy getting into our regular routines and procedures, building relationships, and learning what it means to show "The Wildcat Way" (**C**are for others, **A**ct responsibly, **T**ry our best, and **S**mile often) across all learning environments—whether in the classroom, hallway, playground, or on the bus.

One of the biggest factors in student success is daily attendance. When students are present and engaged every day, they are more likely to build strong academic habits, achieve at higher levels, and feel connected to their school community. - **Stop means stop**—if a peer asks them to stop a behavior, they should listen right away.
- **Bus expectations**—sit back-to-back and bottom-to-bottom, use an inside voice, and keep hands and feet to yourself.

Together, these reminders help ensure that every Wildcat feels safe, respected, and ready to learn. Thank you for your ongoing support and partnership as we move through this school year together. We are proud of the growth already happening and look forward to all that is yet to come!

Updates for All (NEW)

1. Car Rider Line - So far we have had more car riders at our PM dismissal. Please pull as far forward as possible and please use all three dismissal lanes. A staff member will walk the lanes just before 3:40 signaling to turn off car engines. This practice is in place to ensure a safe dismissal for all students. When we all work together, cars will begin exiting the front lot by 3:45 or 3:46. That is pretty fast considering 5-11 year students begin walking out of their classroom at 3:40. We usually have all cars on their way by 3:50-3:53. If you happen to be running late and need to park in the side lot between CE & Bonnie McBeth, please walk up to meet your student then wait at the side walk until all cars have exited the lot. This process is in place to add another layer of safety for all. If many cars park on the side lot, we would have cars exiting the car rider line and many people trying to cross to the side lot which can slow up the entire dismissal procedure and create a less safe process for all. Thank you for your attention to our safety procedures.

We have a bright sign out front communicating if it is past the drop off time and you need to bring your student all the way into the main office for check in. - Hispanic Heritage Month - Observed from September 15 to October 15, this national month celebrates the culture and contributions of Hispanics and Latin Americans to the United States. The anniversaries of many Latin American countries are held on or around September 15 hence why the start of the month starts mid-month. Take time to acknowledge how these communities impact society and foster understanding of their unique heritages.
- National Guide Dog Month
- Suicide Prevention Month - September is a time to remember the lives lost to suicide and people who are living with depression. In the United States, it's a leading cause of death and is an important topic to discuss with loved ones. Take time to raise awareness about mental health by sharing resources with loved ones or colleagues this month. It's also a great time to share inspirational stories of hope too.
- World Alzheimer's Month - This international campaign focuses on acknowledging the challenges of people living with Alzheimer's and dementia, their families, and those who care for them.
