First of all, WELCOME or WELCOME BACK to all of you and your children!

Following are a few items for you to know and I will attach a separate intro letter.

- If your child has any medical conditions including food allergies or sensitivities that we should be aware of please contact me to discuss and determine what further information/action may be needed (unless we have already been in contact).
- 2) If your child hits their head while here at school, and I see them, you will get a call from me to at least let you know what I assessed and how they are doing.
- 3) In order for us to administer any prescription or OTC medication at school there is a form to be completed/signed so please reach out to discuss if you are interested (Tylenol, etc).
- 4) Any child who vomits, has diarrhea, or has a fever of 100.4 or higher, should not attend school until they are fever-free (with no fever-reducing medicine) and/or have not vomited or had diarrhea for a full 24 hours.
- 5) Any child who vomits, has diarrhea, or has a temperature of 100.4 or higher while at school will need to be picked up and is able to return when fever free for 24 hours (see above).
- 2.4% of children worldwide suffer from Didaskaleinophobia, which is the fear of school or fear of going to school. See childmind.org for back to school tips and resources.
