EDUCATION IS THE 'SEED OF HOPE'

Think back for a moment on your high school years and remember the joy and hope that accompanied you in this stage of your life's journey. I know for myself, those memories are cherished and the experiences I shared with my classmates resulted in some of my most lasting friendships.

Now, picture your high school experience with only half of your classmates present in the learning environment with you. Picture those friends wearing a mask all the time, covering their smiling face and distorting their ability to freely communicate with you. Picture yourself going to school for half the day and then working the other half in semi-isolation from your own home. These pictures might conjure up a sense of despair or hopelessness, but we would argue that these pictures, which are a reality in Kapaun Mt. Carmel's "hybrid" model of school operations, under which we have operated so far in the 2020-2021 school year, represent anything but despair. In fact, we believe they represent what Pope Francis recently referred to as "the seed of hope," as he advocated for the importance of education in the face of today's issue-laden world.

What hope has come from our hybrid educational model, where one half of the student body is physically present in the school building in the mornings and the other half is present in the afternoons? Firstly, students have a new appreciation for the gift of a Catholic education. They do not take this education and its accompanying experiences for granted. They know that they missed so much at the end of last year, when they had to finish their schooling remotely, fully isolated from their friends and their teachers. Students now exhibit excitement about being in school, and they see firsthand the benefit they are getting over their public school counterparts, who still are learning remotely and have not returned to their schools since March.

Secondly, when KMC students are at home, their learning continues using electronic devices issued to them by KMC. All students have or will soon be issued Chromebooks, bringing KMC for the first time to a 1:1 ratio of computer to student. Online resources accompany these computers, and the depth and speed in which the students have adapted is amazing. This technology focus will continue long after the retreat of COVID, and it brings great promise for the future of the KMC legacy.

Thirdly, KMC students continue to show great generosity and empathy in our community. Even in the face of this health crisis and the restrictions it has brought, KMC students recently donated and cajoled their families and friends to donate over 10,000 jars of peanut butter to the Our Daily Bread Food Pantry, run by The Lord's Diner here in Wichita. Giving to those in need has never taken on a more clear meaning to our students, and they responded in a way that set records over any prior similar drive.

These are but a few examples of the seeds of hope that come from our hybrid educational model. We at Kapaun Mt. Carmel know that we would not be able to offer this educational experience for these great students were it not for the incredible faith, support and generosity of our broader KMC community. We remain truly grateful to all of the KMC community for its unfailing generosity, and we pledge our very best to continue on with our mission and traditions even under the restrictions with which we currently deal.




PEANUT BUTTER DRIVE



I oversee programming and resource development around the McGrath Institute's new Heritage Edition of The Saint John's Bible, and I serve as Managing Editor of, and regular contributor, to the McGrath Institute blog. 










How would you describe your life as a high schooler at KMC?



What is one memory that stands out from your own high school experience?



"I was involved in journalism and was on the Paladin staff, which created a lot of great memories with Mrs. Stegman and my classmates. I also played volleyball, basketball and softball and loved being involved in those sports. The memory that stands out was guarding Kendra Wecker from McPherson in the KMC basketball tournament we used to host. She was an amazing player and went on to play at KSU and in the WNBA. She was averaging 50 some points a game. Our coach, Rod Browning, told us if we could keep her to 30 points, we'd win. I was in charge of guarding her. She guarded me on defense, and so I just literally ran around in circles trying to tire her out. Someone else eventually guarded me. She scored exactly 30 points. "Playing Salina Central in the state semifinal football game. I have never forgotten that game, both from an excitement standpoint and from a disappointment standpoint. I can still remember walking on that field and playing and believing that we were going to state. "I remember causing havoc in Mrs. Burnett's AP History class. We played all kinds of pranks on her. The most memorable was when we found out her cell phone number and kept calling her phone during class. She had her ringer on that particular day, and her ringer was the 'Star Spangled Banner'. At one point the class stood up when the ringer went off. She never figured out it was us and kept asking why she had so many calls from outside numbers." – *Brian Carrillo '08*

"Sr. Eustasia frightened me to no end. She had such high expectations, and I rarely lived up to them. When I was a sophomore, I received my driver's license in April, and my mother volunteered me to pick up Sr. Eustasia from the convent and take her to the Newman Center on campus at WSU so that she could play the organ for Sunday Mass. The big problem was that my mom forgot to tell me this until Sunday morning, and I was really perturbed that my mother would require me to spend any time with the teacher who scared me the most out of any adult I knew. Moreover, I was short on time and would likely be late, adding to the negative opinion that I was sure Sr. Eustasia had of me."

On the way to the KMC convent, which was in the old Vickers mansion where the softball field is now, I got stopped for speeding. The cop asked me where I was going in such a hurry on a Sunday morning. When I told him I was headed to pick up a nun to play the organ at church, he busted up laughing. He followed me all the way to KMC. I ran up to the door of the mansion/convent and rang the doorbell. Sr. Library (Mary James Paul) opened the door and when I told her I was there to pick up Sr. Eustasia for Mass, she looked at me sideways and said, "Sr. Eustasia doesn't live here. She lives at the Mount." With the cop still looking on, I panicked, and I think, although I can't actually be sure, I said, "Well, Sister, would you mind at least coming and getting in my car with me?" Regardless of whether I said it, I was thinking it as the door closed in my face.

No ticket, but a really amused cop drove away shaking his head." – *Rob Knapp '82*

"There are so many memories for me, like the time we won another state championship in football and my teammates carried me off the field, or when I won a Grand State Championship in wrestling. However, what really strikes me the most was how all the students, teachers, staff, and administrators all were so enthusiastic about how we were the best of the best.
