How will bond projects enhance the learning environment at the elementary school?

Interior/Exterior Site Improvements

The elementary school was constructed in 1977, and its footprint has not changed since it opened. While some renovations have been completed, it is the building with the greatest potential for improvement. Simple infrastructure improvements such as replacing the original windows with energy-efficient windows and converting hallways and the cafeteria to LED lights are projected to help with energy savings.

Expanding and Enhancing Interior Spaces at Boyne City Elementary

Since 1977, the methods of teaching children have evolved significantly, and the proposed updates to the school aim to address both instructional needs and structural improvements. The addition of four classrooms will enable a reorganization of instructional spaces, allowing smaller “corner rooms” to be dedicated to students needing pull-out academic assistance. Currently, some of this instruction takes place in hallways, leading to distractions and a lack of privacy for students working with staff to improve their reading and math skills.

The updates also include improvements to the office space at the elementary school, which is currently too small to accommodate private meetings for school leaders and secretaries. The redesign will relocate the nurse’s station from the hallway into the office, enhancing both privacy and functionality.

Lastly, a canopy will be added to the front entrance of the building. While not directly tied to instructional improvements, this feature will help clearly identify the main entrance and provide protection from bad weather. These updates together reflect a commitment to creating a more effective and welcoming learning environment.
