



WTC to Celebrate 50th Anniversary in 2019

Plans Include Unearthing Time Capsule

Western Texas College is celebrating 50 years of student success this year!

During the 10th Anniversary celebration in 1979, almost 40 years ago, Western Texas College students, faculty and staff buried a time capsule to be opened on the 50th anniversary of the College in 2019.

With this in mind, WTC has commenced planning for the celebration.

An event to unearth the time capsule is planned for Monday, November 18, 2019, at 11:00 a.m. In addition, the College will bury a new time capsule, to be opened in 50 years, with items representing the current culture.

Alumni, former and current faculty and staff, and the community are welcome at the event.

A Quick History

On October 20, 1969, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board gave approval for holding an election to create a junior college district in Scurry County.

An election was held on November 22, 1969 to create the Scurry County junior college district, approve a \$3,225,000 bond, and elect a Board of Trustees.

The bond issue passed by a 10-1 margin.

The first trustees elected were M.L. Broman, Dr. Robert Hargrove, L.A. (George) Patterson, R.C. Patton, Edwin Parks, W.A. (Bill) Jones and W.H. (Bill) Wilson, Jr.

On December 1, 1969, the College hired its first employee: an administrative secretary, Mavis Brumbelow. The College office opened in the basement of Snyder Savings & Loan Association.

The Board of Trustees named Dr. Robert Clinton President of the College on December 20, 1969.

WTC Foundation Awards INSPIRE Grant Funds for College Projects

The WTC Foundation Inspire Program provides a straightforward method for staff and faculty to directly request funds from the WTC Foundation for projects supporting education and cultural activities or campus improvements and development.

The program has grown each year since its inception in 2016, and the fall 2018 round of applications was the largest yet with a total of 9 applicants.

The fall 2018 Inspire applications were thoroughly discussed and reviewed at the 2018 October WTC Foundation Board of Directors Meeting. The Foundation generously awarded \$26,400.00 to faculty and staff for various projects to benefit WTC.

Sand Volleyball Court.

A new sand volleyball court will be built in the East Courtyard between the Fitness Center and Barkowsky Hall. The Athletics Department plans to establish a sand volleyball team as a women's sport. The court will also be available for student recreation. The Foundation will supply supplemental funding for the project.

Phi Theta Kappa Dues.

The Foundation established a need-based assistance fund for new Phi Theta kappa members not able to afford the membership dues.

VTE for Petroleum Technology.

The Foundation will give funds to

create a custom process model for Virtual Training Equipment at the Cavender Energy Field Lab. The model will be designed to work in conjunction with the Polaris Hands On Trainer currently used by students.

New Murals for Cafeteria Installed

Artist and Former WTC Art Instructor Creates New Murals of Student Life

If you've ever eaten in the WTC Cafeteria, then you've probably seen the murals on the east wall of the dining area.

The murals were created by Ben Sum, a former art instructor at Western Texas College and current professor at Angelo State University in San Angelo.

During his time at WTC, Sum created murals that captured the heart and experience of WTC. Sum based his imagery on actual students, so the paintings have a familiar and authentic feel to them.

When the cafeteria expansion was completed in 2016, the Administrative Staff approved adding additional murals in the new section.

The new murals were installed on the west wall of the expansion by Sum, his wife, Cycris Ho, and TD Industries.
