Introducing the new Western Texas College Alumni Association

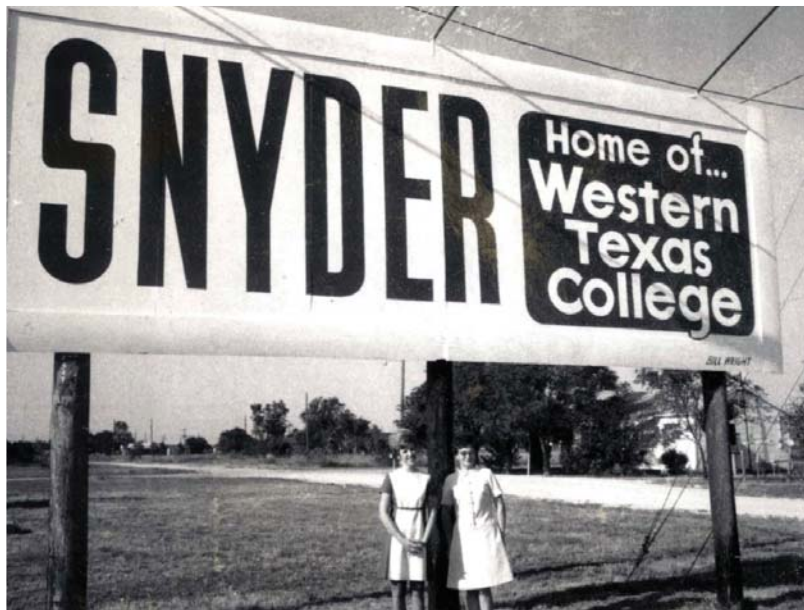

## Your update on the WTC Foundation

The WTC Foundation is another step closer in their mission of providing meaningful support for Western Texas College. September 2015 was the culmination of a ten year, matching grant opportunity provided through two U.S. Department of Education Title V grants.

Gifts to the Century Club (2005 – 2010) and the Legacy Fund (2010-2015) were matched dollar for dollar by the Title V grant thereby doubling their impact. These generous contributions established a formidable endowment totaling over \$1.16 million dollars.

The entire principal amount plus the matching funds has been invested and the interest will be used to provide ongoing support for WTC. Part of the Fund has been designated

for student scholarships. The remaining proceeds from the Fund will be used for educational and cultural activities, campus improvement, and development projects benefiting students, educators and the community.
