School

Upper Moreland High School is a four year comprehensive high school with the 2023-2024 enrollment approximately 1074 students. The total number of faculty at the high school is 75. Students have the opportunity to complete 32 credits with a four block a day AB model Block Schedule in a purple and gold day rotation.

Community

The School District of Upper Moreland Township is located in Montgomery County approximately fifteen miles north of Center City Philadelphia. The major portion of the Township is now developed and is primarily zoned for residential use. The area served by the district has a population of approximately 25,863 residents. Our district comprises Upper Moreland Primary School (grades K-2), Upper Moreland Intermediate School (grades 3-5), Upper Moreland Middle School (grades 6-8), and Upper Moreland High School (grades 9-12). These schools serve students and families from the Willow Grove, Hatboro, and Huntingdon Valley communities.

Curriculum

The comprehensive curriculum includes several instructional levels (AP, Honors, College Prep) for core academic courses as well as a wide range of elective offerings in English, social studies, science world languages, technology, business, family and consumer science, music, and art.

Athletics

The School District of Upper Moreland Township has 26 teams participating in the PIAA league. Students may participate in one sport each season. 42% of the students participate in the athletics program.

Activities

Clubs and activities are available to students. During the 2024 school year 21 have been offered including History Club, Chess Club, Debate Club, and Quizbowl.

The Arts

The School District of Upper Moreland Township High School offers visual arts, and performing arts including drama, marching unit, and Jazz Band as co curricular activities. 13% of students participated in color guard, jazz band, indoor percussion. 9% of students are in the State Champion Marching Unit.

Dual Enrollment with Montgomery County Community College (MCCC)

Students may participate in Dual Enrollment with Montgomery County Community College on a course by course basis. Also, Upper Moreland has a partnership with MCCC allowing students to enroll in a 2 year program beginning in the Junior year. Students take courses that are counted as credit at MCCC and at UMHS. Courses are offered at MCCC and at UMHS taught by Upper Moreland High School Teachers. Over the two years, students earn half of the credits needed to earn an associates degree at a reduced tuition rate with transportation and support from UM.

Eastern Center for Technology and Arts

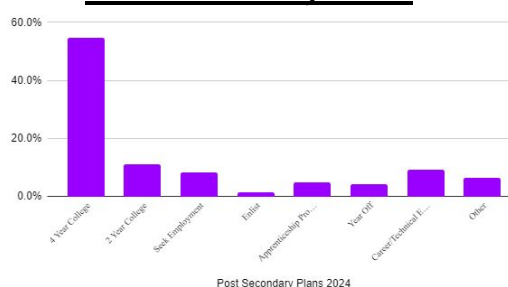
Students may also attend the Eastern Center for Arts and Technology to pursue focused career training in lieu of the regular elective program. EASTERN is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools. Clusters of programs (16) available include Arts, Human Services and Hospitality; Business, Computer and Public Safety; Construction; Health Sciences, Transportation and Manufacturing. Students are admitted through a competitive selection process.

UM Cyber Program

Upper Moreland offers a K-12 Cyber Program. For our high school students, this program provides the opportunity to enroll in courses in person at UMHS and through the UM Cyber Program.

Advanced Placement Results 2024

234 total AP exams were administered. The average AP score was 3.2%. 77% had an average score of 3 or higher.



Course Levels

Advanced Placement (AP): The most academically demanding course level requiring students to complete extensive reading, writing, problem-solving and critical-thinking. An additional 1.0 weighted credit is applied to AP level courses.

Honors (H): Honors courses require a high level of academic maturity, interest, ability, reading, and study skills. The pace is rigorous, and enrollment is selective. An additional 0.5 weighted credit is applied to Honors level courses.

College Preparatory (CP): College preparatory courses are designed to provide the rigor and relevance to prepare students for college enrollment.
