Each year the State of North Carolina releases School Report Cards to ensure that stakeholders have access to performance data about our public schools. This requirement of the federal Every Student Succeeds Act includes information for all schools about student performance by grade level and subgroup, average class sizes, teacher qualifications, student absenteeism, and school safety among other categories. At King Elementary we are proud of the hard work our staff and students put forth on a daily basis, and we are encouraged by the testing outcomes that have been a result of those efforts. Within the NC School Report Card, schools receive an Overall Grade based on a combination of students' test score proficiency and their academic growth. During the 2018-2019 school year KES has received an Overall Grade of a C (68), which represents a two point increase from the 2017-2018 school year. Breaking that Overall Grade down into its component parts, our KES students' overall reading proficiency came in at a 62 with their math proficiency being a 70. Our school also Met Growth, with an overall growth score that was six points higher than the state average. This level of growth indicates that our teachers are doing fantastic work with students, and as a result those children met their yearly progress goals during the 2018-2019 school year.

While it is important to say that we are proud of the hard work and progress made by our students during the 2018-2019 school year, it is also important to note that we are certainly not satisfied. Our teachers are constantly seeking new ways to meet each child's instructional needs through collaborative decision-making and continual progress monitoring. It is through the dedication of our teachers and staff, the involvement of our families, and the support of our community that KES will continue to put our students first and be a source of pride for Stokes County residents.
