The 2024-25 school year marks the second year Copperas Cove ISD has had educators earn TIA designations, recognizing the top performers in Texas public schools. To earn a designation, educators are evaluated 60% on student achievement through the STAAR test, with the remaining 40% based on T-TESS evaluations for classroom instruction and student growth.

In the 2023-24 school year, CCISD surprised 92 educators with TIA designations at 10 campuses with designations, totaling more than \$1.1 million in state-funded pay increases valid for 5 years.

In the 2024-25 school year, CCISD surprised 42 new educators with TIA designations across those 10 campuses, and 11 more who moved up in designation levels, totaling more than \$345,000 in state-funded pay increases valid for 5 years.

Data is submitted to Texas Tech each November for validation and qualifying educators are able to earn a higher designation level each year.

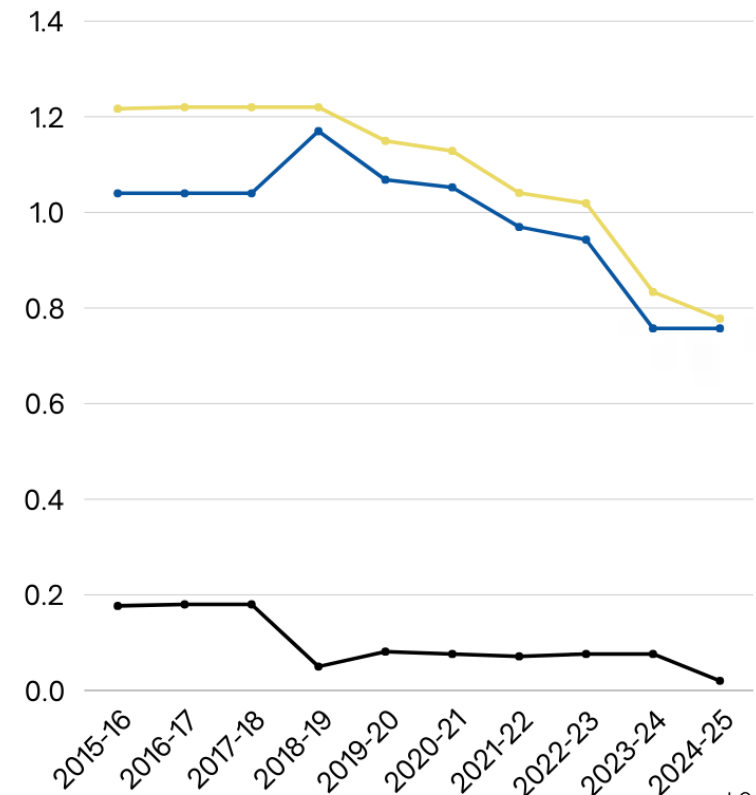


DISTRICT TAX RATE & FINANCIAL INTEGRITY

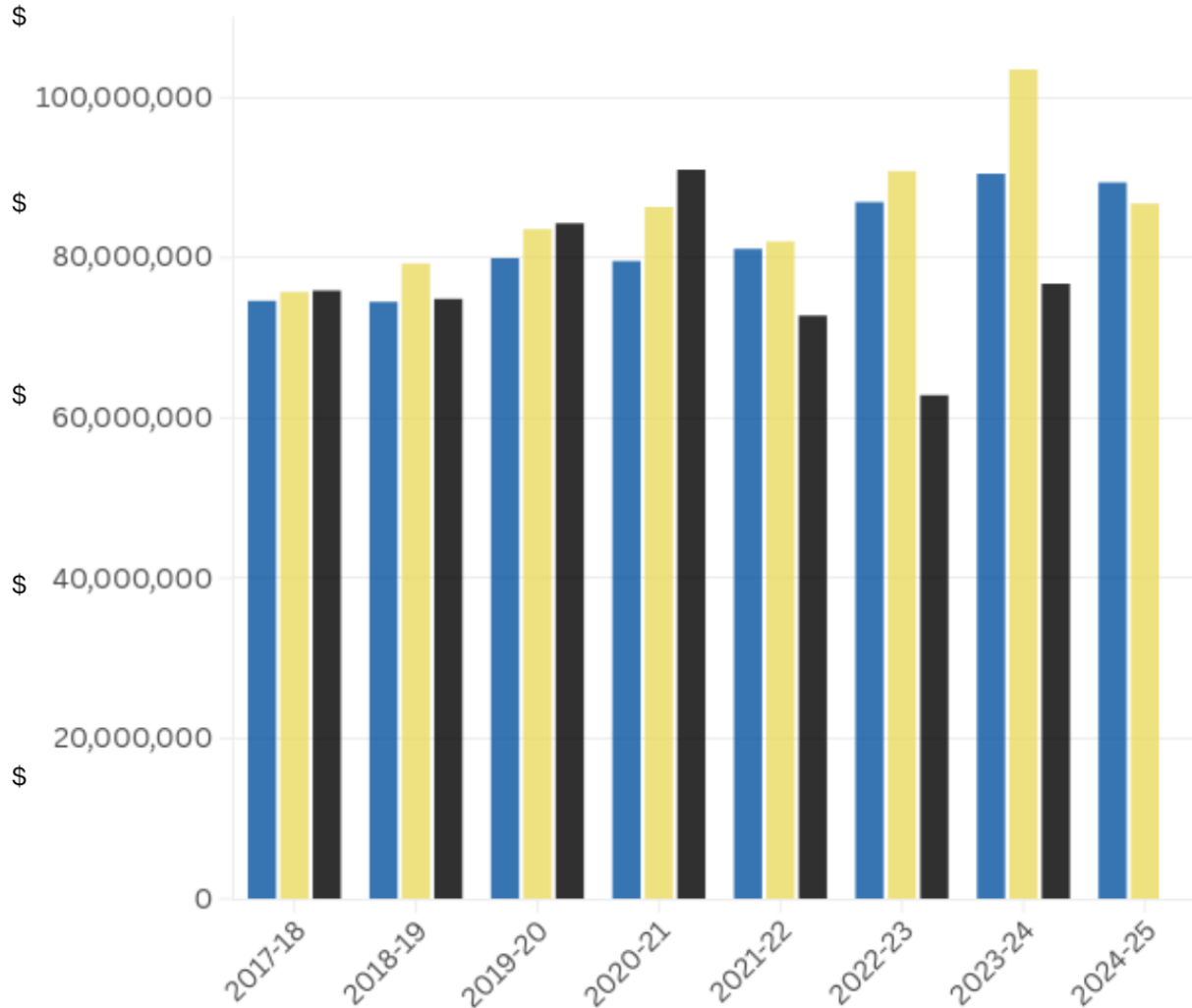

Fund balance is revenue that a school district keeps in reserves to responsibly manage cash flow, acting as an emergency fund for the district.

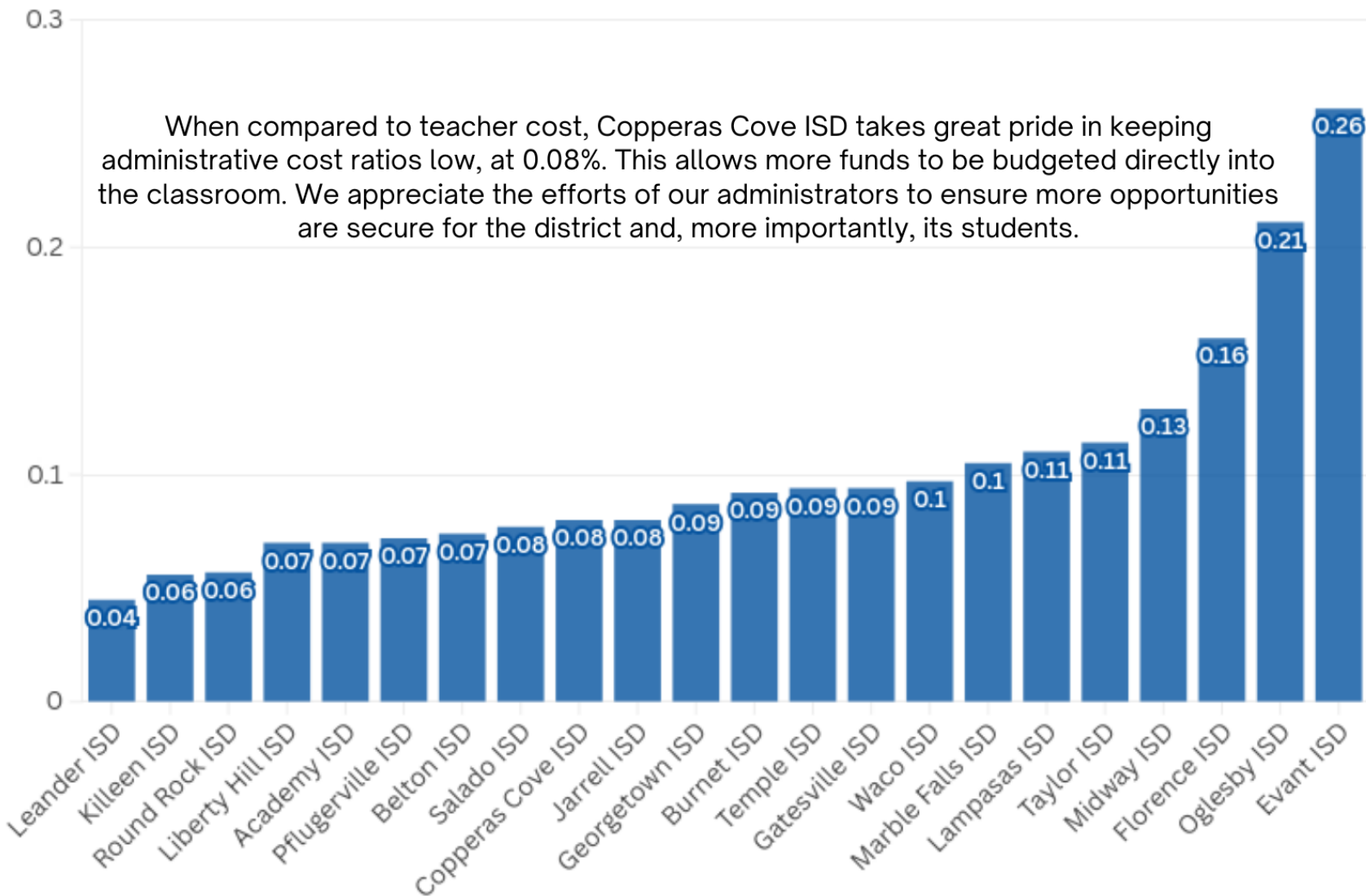

CCISD continues to out-pace the state and region in Reading/Language Arts, based on STAAR results.

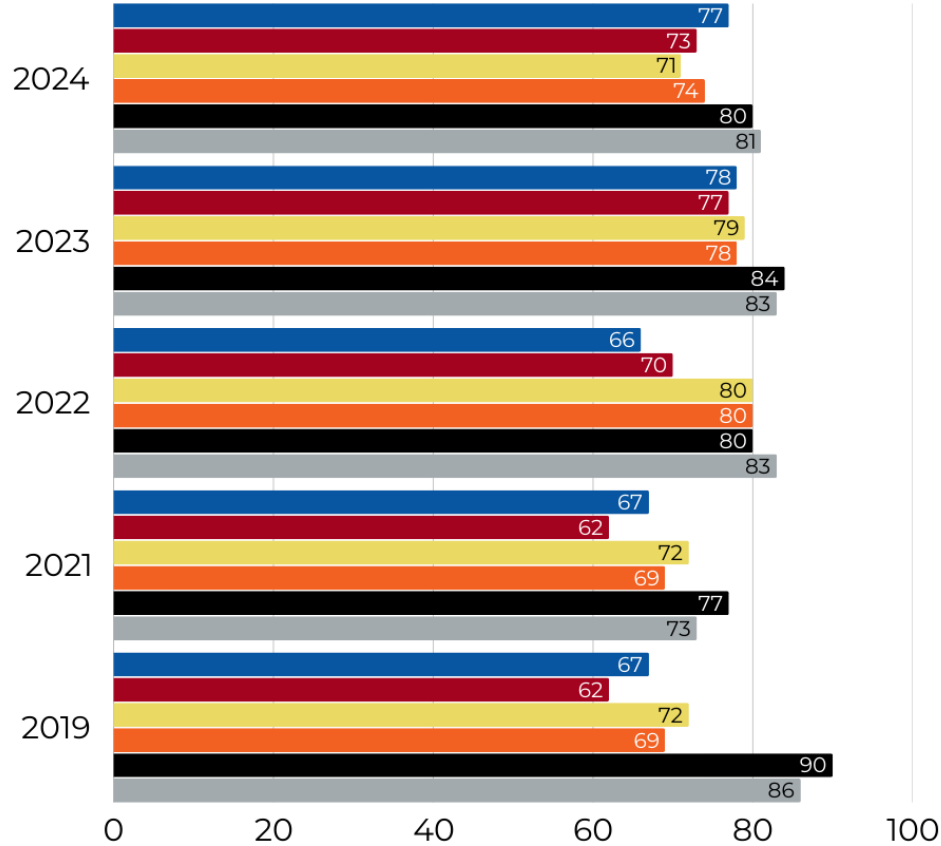

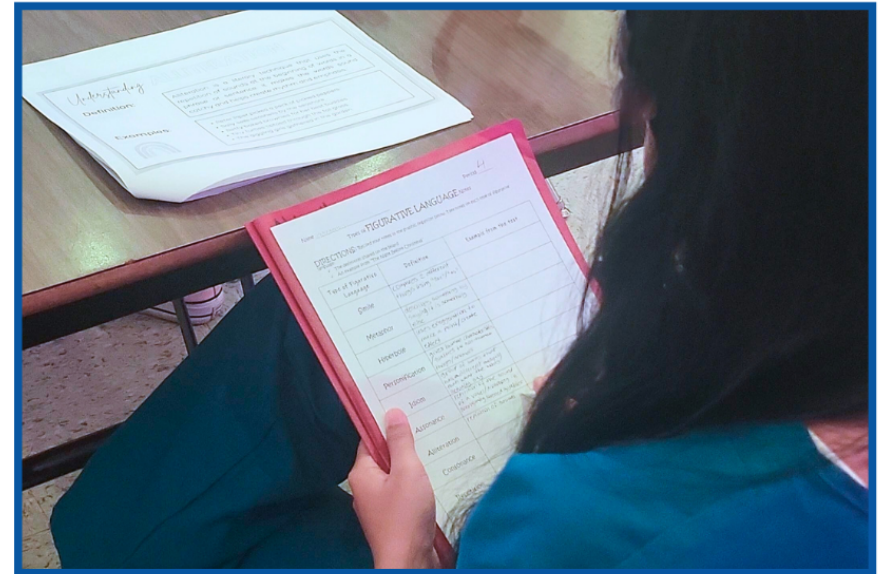

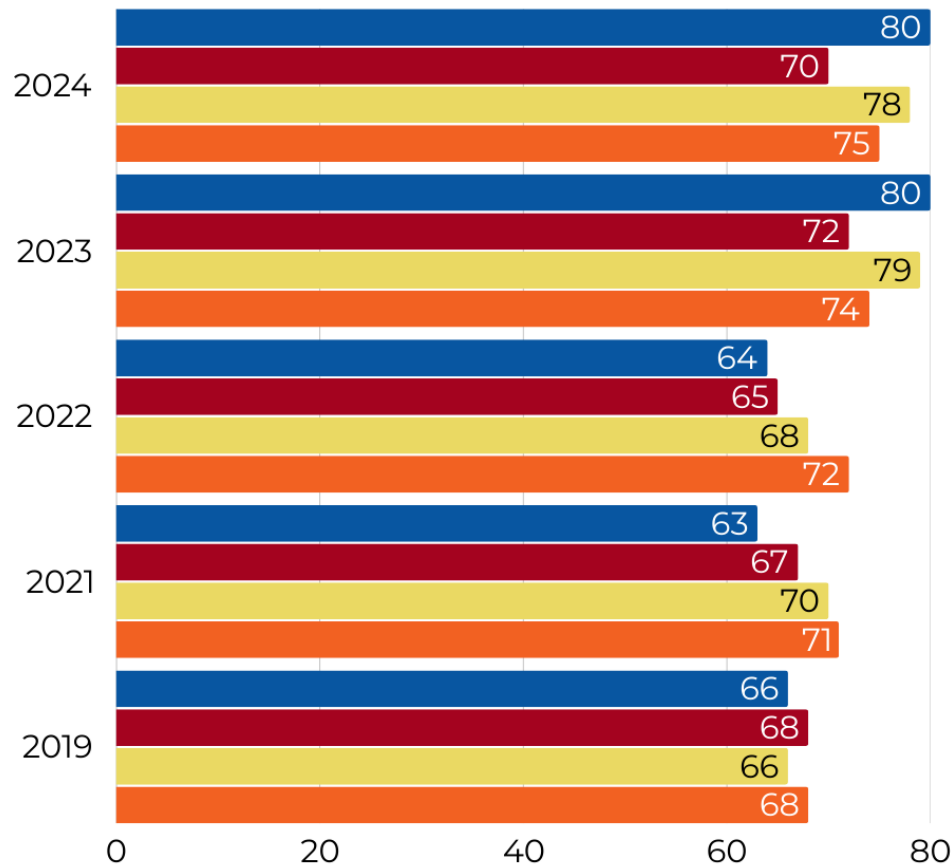

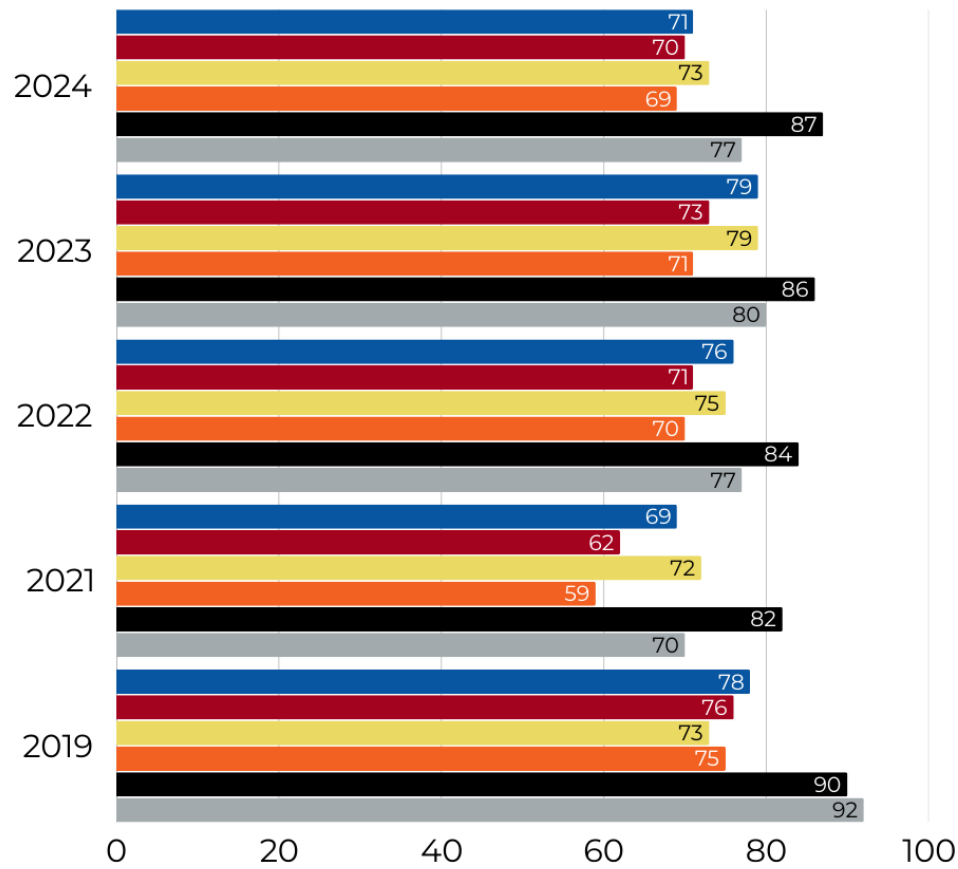
In high school English I & II end-of-course exams, students in Copperas Cove have shown exponential growth post-pandemic, now far out-pacing students across Texas.

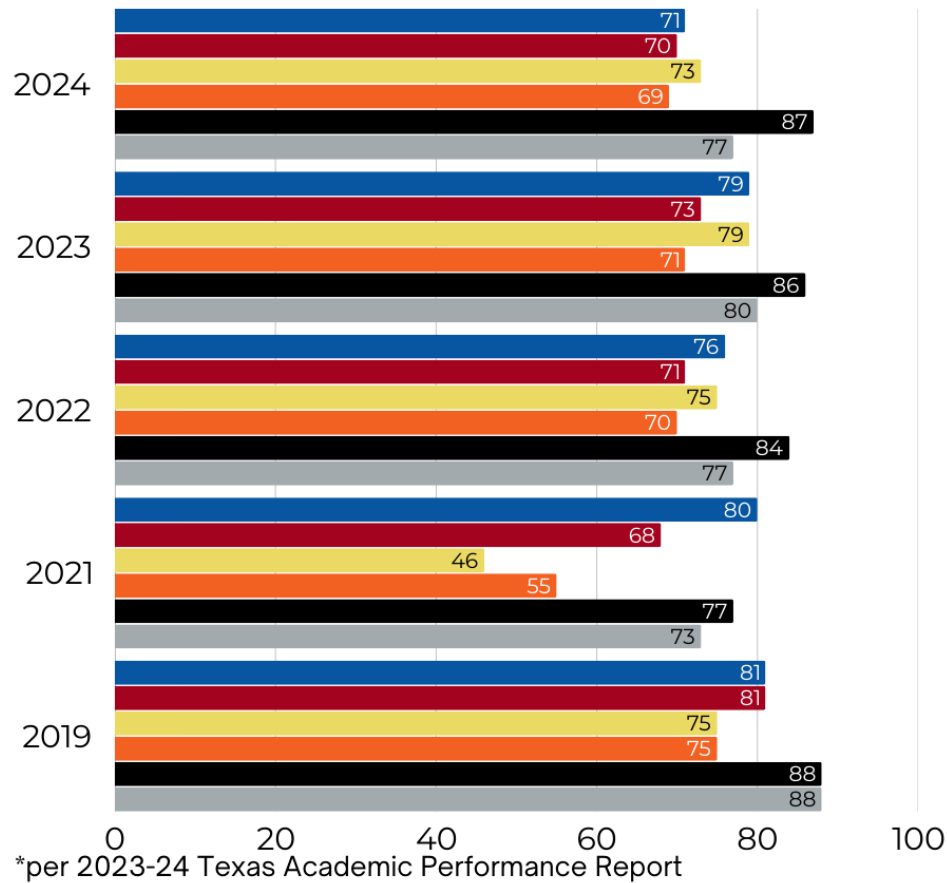
In elementary math, CCISD students largely outpace state averages in STAAR exams. Additionally, 4th-grade scores are back on-pace with pre-pandemic scores.



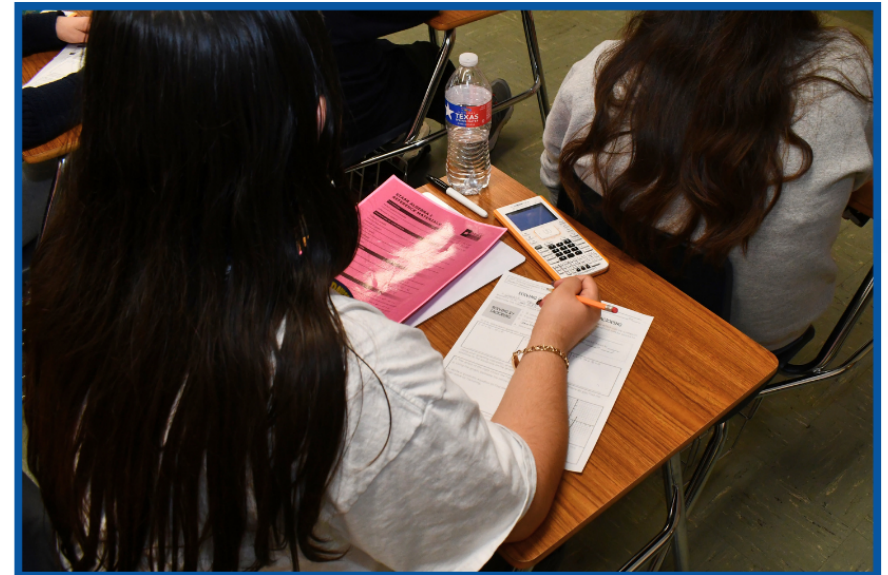

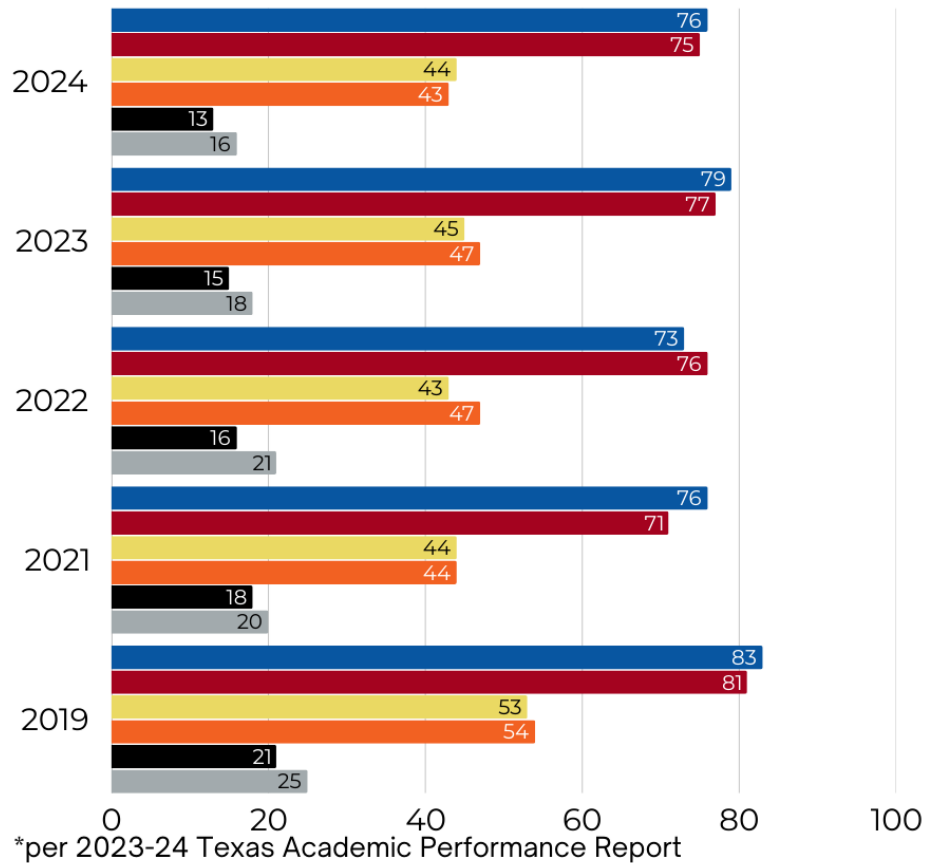

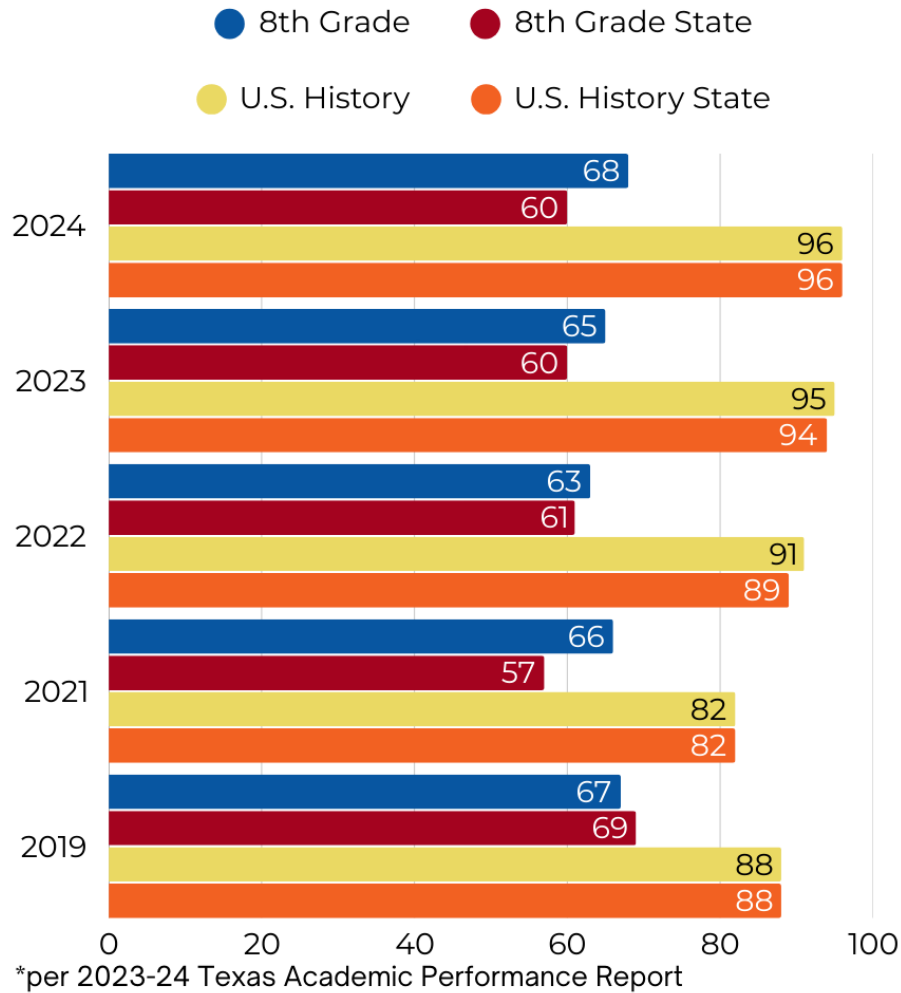

SOCIAL STUDIES



Students in Copperas Cove not only out-pace state averages in Social Studies, but they have shown improvement upon pre-pandemic scores in both 8th-grade STAAR & U.S. History end-of-course scores.





TECHNOLOGY SERVICES



Copperas Cove ISD implemented a 1:1 technology initiative in 2021, ensuring each of the district's almost-8,000 students are equipped with their own device to learn in a modern setting.



Copperas Cove ISD employs 475 wireless access points across each of its 11 campuses and its department offices, ensuring every student & staff member has a reliable network connection.



CCISD closes approximately 250 technology work orders per week, on average, plus phone calls or walk-ins to the Technology office.



Technology Services employs a team of student interns every summer, giving CCISD students the opportunity to get hands-on experience and work alongside district technicians.





TRANSPORTATION



District Size

Copperas Cove ISD is approximately 57 square miles. Mostly in southern Coryell County, the district extends into a small section of Bell County.



Distance Driven

Copperas Cove ISD buses drive approximately 3,000 miles per day. In a year, they total approximately 532,395 miles.



Students Served

CCISD Transportation serves approximately 4,800 students per day on 59 routes.



Fuel

CCISD transportation services use approximately 3,100 gallons of fuel per week. In a school year, this totals approximately 114,700 gallons of fuel.

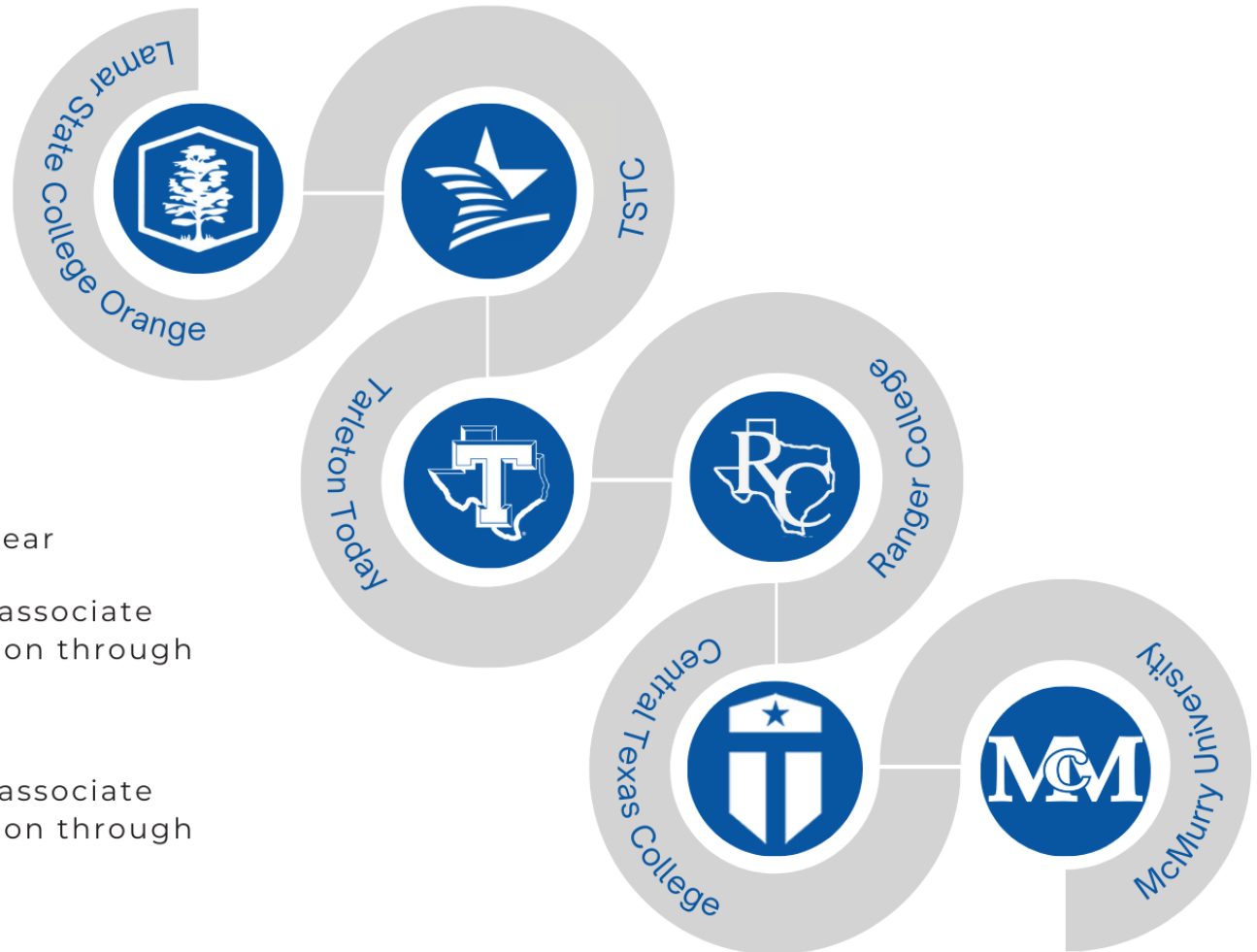
