School Accountability Data

 Includes information on schools' performance on various measures such as student proficiency and growth on state assessments, graduation and attendance rates.
 Performance is measured on a 0-100 index scale. Reports schools identified under three federally required categories for further support: Comprehensive Support and Improvement, Targeted Support and Improvement and Additional Targeted Support

For the 2023-2024 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-2023. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-2022. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-2022. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no status label is given.
