


## Behind the Scenes

What an exciting time to be a Fayetteville Lion! The 2013-2014 school year has been labeled "The Year of Opportunity!" The 2012-2013 school year brought about a lot of change from new curriculum to new technology to ultimately a new cafetorium that opened just after this school year started. The school district hired several new staff members including Ms. Marburger and Coach Krebs from the previous December along with Mr. Kilpatrick, Ms. Okruhlik, Coach Dusek, Ms. Davidson and Mr. Statham over the summer.

The Fayetteville Education Foundation made a huge impact at FISD over the last year. They awarded four different grants to staff in the amount of nearly \$32,000! The science department was able to get several new electronic measurement tools to help conduct experiments, Pre-K was granted money to purchase two touch screen computers, Mrs. Elam put together an amazing plan for a renovation of the courtyard that was also granted by the Foundation. Finally, the Foundation awarded the 80 Google Chromebooks for our high school students to utilize in their classes.

The addition of the Chromebooks placed FISD as one of the few districts in the state that have implemented a one-to-one laptop to student initiative. I can't say that it didn't take a lot of hard work and planning from all of the staff to make this initiative happen. The "behind the scenes" preparation and training have been critical to keep the staff ahead of the game and trying new teaching and instructional techniques. I'm very proud of the way the students and staff have become trailblazers with the opportunities that have been implemented at FISD. There is no reason that this school district should not be a leader in how we prepare our students for their future.

Fayetteville ISD continues to make leaps and bounds forward and we are continuing to make a name for ourselves statewide in academics and athletics. We want our students to be prepared for life after they walk across the stage and receive their diplomas. I feel that over the past few years we've helped move toward this goal. We have great students, great staff and a supportive school board that can see where we need to be.
