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## **PREFACE**

The purpose of bringing together each extra-curricular activity under the umbrella of one handbook is to ensure standardized implementation of general rules and guidelines. We have many students participating in multiple extra-curricular activities and it is our intent that each student understands and embraces the guidelines that bind all of these activities together. This will instill among the coaches and sponsors a cooperative effort to promote a fair and equal set of standards as we work together to achieve success in each activity.

As discrepancies arise, the Principal, Athletic Director and Sponsor may meet in order to amend or use discretion if two or more activities have conflicting guidelines or rules. This will ensure that each student is treated fairly and that our policies do not contradict themselves.

# **PARTICIPATION**

**No student is obligated to take part in extra-curricular activities nor is participation required for graduation.**

It is to be stressed that participation in these programs is a privilege.

The Athletic Director, Principal and/or Superintendent have the authority, upon request from the coach/sponsor, to suspend or revoke this privilege whenever a rule, regulation and/or standard of the athletic program is violated, whether it is after a first offense or the last offense.

The rules, regulations and standards set forth in this handbook are designed to give each student a road map to success in life.

It must be stressed that a student who chooses to enter these programs must be committed to the program at all times, both in and out of school, in season and out of season. This means the expectations of the particular program are in effect for as long as a student is part of the program.

## ***General guidelines for participation***

1. Students must notify the appropriate coach/sponsor of an absence from any practice that occurs outside the normal school day prior to the beginning of the practice. Failure to do this will result in any form of discipline that the coach/sponsor of that activity deems appropriate for the individual.

2. Students will refrain from the use of alcohol or other abusive substances (drugs and or tobacco products).

Students that are involved in the consumption of those substances will be subject to the punishment set forth in this document. Hearsay is not a valid conviction of wrongdoing. An issued ticket from a law enforcement official, admittance of guilt from the athlete, and or a failed school alcohol/drug test is a valid conviction of wrongdoing.

3. Team dress code rules will be set by the Athletic Director/Sponsor.

Violation of the dress code will be handled by the coach/sponsor of that contest in a manner deemed fitting.

4. Head coaches/sponsors of each individual sport/contest may have additional team rules that will be addressed in other sections of this handbook.

If a team rule is violated and deemed by that team coach/sponsor as detrimental to the good of the team, to the school, or to the students themselves, the head coach/sponsor will have the discretion to handle it as they see fit (however the consequences must be pre-approved by the Athletic Director and Principal prior to the administration of such consequences).

## LETTERING POLICY

Athletes may receive from the school only one major award (letter jacket) during their high school career. In order to letter, an athlete must be on a varsity team and satisfy the following requirements of each sport in which they are to letter.

- **A State Qualifier** in any activity automatically meets requirements for a letter jacket
- **Cross country**-Run in the district meet and participate in 70% of the meets.
- **Football**-Participate in at least 16 varsity quarters
- **Basketball**-Participate in at least 50 varsity quarters
- **Track**-Earn a point at the District Meet and participate in 70% of the meets.  
Golf-Participate in District Tournament and participate in 70% of the tournaments.
- **Tennis**-Participate in District Tournament and participate in 70% of the meets.
- **Band** - Selected to appropriate All-District Band, be awarded 1st division on a solo or ensemble in UIL contest, or by qualifying for any state level contest. In a non-advancing year, if a sweepstakes rating is earned then this will qualify for a letter. Those meeting these requirements will be awarded a letter or by participating in the band 3 high school years (9-12)
- **UIL** - Score at least one point at the district level
- **OAP** - Any cast or crew member that advances at any UIL contest, including Zone.  
OR Any cast member who receives Best Actor, Best Actress, All-Star cast or Hon. Mention All-Star cast at any level of UIL competition
- **FFA** - Any student placing in the top 4 teams or individual for LDE, CDE or Public Speaking at the Area level plus 1 livestock or ag mechanics show.

## TRANSPORTATION GUIDELINES

All participants are to travel to each contest with the team. However, under certain circumstances alternative means of travel to a game may be approved by the administration, Athletic Director or FFA Advisor and parent /guardian of that student. Travel home after a contest is recommended to be with the team. However, if the coach/sponsor deems it appropriate for a participant to travel home after a contest trip separate from the team then the parent/guardian of that student must give a signed written consent to the coach/sponsor **24 hours before** each contest.

Each coach/sponsor reserves the right to enforce the travel arrangements however he/she sees fit with the understanding that the Athletic Director, administration, and parent/guardian are notified of the expectations prior to departure for that trip.

# DRUG AND ALCOHOL POLICY

## ***Procedure for violations of the Drug/Alcohol policy and or local and State laws.***

*Violation can be through local drug testing, law enforcement and or self-admittance by the student athlete.*

Each student participating in an extra-curricular contest will be required to sign a random drug testing form in which their name will be placed into a pool to be randomly drawn upon a scheduled drug test. If the student and or parent are not willing to consent to this random screening then participation in an extra-curricular contest may be denied.

1) Upon each violation of policy the Principal, Coach and/or Sponsor needs to meet with the student and parent/guardian to discuss the violation and growth plan to help the student.

2) Discipline for 1<sup>st</sup> offense, 2<sup>nd</sup> offense, and 3<sup>rd</sup> offense.

- Upon a first offense of receiving a confirmed positive violation of policy the student shall be suspended from participating in and attending extracurricular activities for **15 calendar days** (calendar days start on the first day of classes and end on graduation). The student may (at the discretion of the coach and sponsor, if participating in other extracurricular activities.) be permitted to participate in practices during their suspension. Extra conditioning by the coach may be added and must be approved by the Athletic Director
- Upon the second offense of receiving a confirmed positive violation of policy the student shall be suspended from participation in and attending extracurricular activities for **30 calendar days** (Which starts on the first day of classes and ends on graduation). The student may (at the discretion of the coach and sponsor, if participating in other extracurricular activities.) be permitted to participate in practices during their suspension. Extra conditioning by the coach may be added and must be approved by the athletic director.
- Upon a third offense of receiving a confirmed positive violation of policy the student shall be **suspended from participation in any extracurricular activity for the remainder of the student's enrollment at the particular campus level** (middle school or high school).

**Violation of policy** - If the student is in athletics, but not participating in a sport when they violate policy then their suspension of calendar days begins on the first instruction day of the next sport in which they participate.

**Nicotine testing is now mandated to test (as of June 2019). The legal age to purchase tobacco products was raised from 18 to 21. If a student tests positive for nicotine, whether through the use of cigarettes, vaping, or dipping, punishment will be at coaches' discretion and with superintendent approval.**

## Social Media Policy

Student-athletes are held in the highest regard and are seen as role models in the community. As leaders you have the responsibility to portray your team, your school and yourselves in a positive manner at all times. Sometimes this means doing things that are an inconvenience to you, but benefit the whole team.

Facebook, Twitter and other social media sites have increased in popularity globally, and are used by the majority of student-athletes here in one form or another. Student-athletes should be aware that third parties - - including the media, faculty, and future colleges- - could easily access your profiles and view all personal information. This includes all pictures, videos, comments and posters. Inappropriate material found by third parties affects the perception of the student-athlete, the athletic department and the school. This can also be detrimental to a student-athlete's future school or employment options, whether in professional sports or in other industries.

Examples of inappropriate and offensive behaviors concerning participation in online communities may include depictions or presentations of the following:

- Photos, videos, comments or posters showing the personal use of alcohol, drugs and tobacco e.g., no holding cups, cans, shot glasses etc.
- Photos, videos, and comments that are of a sexual nature. This includes links to websites of a pornographic nature and other inappropriate material.
- Pictures, videos, comments or posters that condone drug-related activity. This includes but is not limited to images that portray the personal use of marijuana and drug paraphernalia.
- Content online that is unsportsmanlike, derogatory, demeaning or threatening toward any other individual or entity (examples: derogatory comments regarding another institution; taunting comments aimed at a student-athlete, coach or team at another institution and derogatory comments against race and/or gender). No posts should depict or encourage unacceptable, violent or illegal activities (examples: hazing, sexual harassment/assault, gambling, discrimination, fighting, vandalism, academic dishonesty, underage drinking, illegal drug use).

If a student-athlete's profile and its contents are found to be inappropriate in accordance with the above behaviors, he/she will be subject to the following penalties:

1. Written warning
2. A meeting with the Athletic Director and Coordinator
3. Penalties as determined by the athletic department, including but not limited to possible suspension from his/her athletic team.

For your own safety, please keep the following recommendations in mind as you participate in social media websites: Set your security settings so that only your friends can view your profile. You should not post your email, home address, local address, telephone number(s), or other personal information as it could lead to unwanted attention, stalking, identity theft, etc. Be aware of who you add as a friend to your site – many people are looking to take advantage of student-athletes or to seek connections with student-athletes. Consider how the above behaviors can be reflected in all Facebook applications. If you are ever in doubt of the appropriateness of your online public material, consider whether it upholds and positively reflects your own values and ethics as well as TCISD's. Remember, always present a positive image and don't do anything to embarrass yourself, the team, your family or the school.

**Conduct Expectations**

**The following conduct is expected of all student-athletes. Failure to meet these expectations can result in disciplinary action:**

- Student commitment to a team or organization is expected for the entire season or activity. Students are encouraged to participate in more than one extracurricular activity; however, students may not quit one sport or organization in order to participate in another while the sport or club that he or she quit is still active.
- Students who participate in extracurricular activities that involve competition among schools and school districts will conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner at all times. This includes behavior toward visiting teams or hosting teams as well as the opponent's fans. Throckmorton Collegiate ISD participants will be noted for clean, tough, competitive play. Theatrical outbursts will not be tolerated. Praise your opponents and play beyond your ability.
- Students should arrive at practices (including workouts), meetings, and events on time and prepared.
- Students who cannot be present for a practice (including workouts), meeting, or event should call the coach, sponsor, team captain, or club president as soon as they are aware that they will be absent. The Head Coach/Sponsor will decide when missed practices, meetings, or workouts will be made up; however, disciplinary action may still be taken by the Athletic Director if a participant is absent more than multiple times in a semester.
- Injured or ill students who are unable to participate, but are able to attend a practice (including workouts), meeting or event are required to dress appropriately and sit or stand with the rest of the group.
- Students are required to show respect at all times to coaches and sponsors, teachers, mentors, staff and administration. Disrespecting any authority figure will have consequences. Consequences will be enforced as needed.

- Students should refrain from wearing hairstyles or hair colors that draw attention to themselves. Male students participating in sports will refrain from wearing earrings while representing Throckmorton Collegiate ISD.
- Students should follow the rules promulgated in the Throckmorton Collegiate ISD Student Code of Conduct.

## **Prohibited Conduct**

**Throckmorton ISD students who participate in athletics are prohibited at all times from:**

- possessing, smoking, selling, or otherwise using tobacco products;
- possessing or using electronic cigarettes or other non-tobacco nicotine-delivery products or accessories;
- possessing or using drug paraphernalia;
- possessing, selling, giving, delivering to another person, using, or being under the influence of marijuana, alcohol, a controlled substance, or any dangerous drug;
- riding in a vehicle containing alcohol unless a parent, guardian, or other responsible adult is present and aware of the presence of the alcohol;
- stealing;
- conduct that causes injury or harm to persons or property;
- using profanity, lewd or vulgar language, or obscene gestures;
- fighting;
- any conduct resulting in arrest and/or citations from law enforcement officers;
- inappropriate touching, including “making out” in public places; sexual gestures; or exposing parts of the body that are ordinarily covered up in public; and
- inappropriate behavior in public places.

Upon determination of an *Extracurricular Code of Conduct* violation, the following individuals will be notified:

- the student and the student's parent(s) or guardian(s); and/or
- the school counselor to provide counseling, support, and guidance in dealing with issues associated with alcohol, drugs, mood-altering chemicals, and other prohibited activities.

### **Throckmorton Collegiate Boys/Girls Athletics**

#### **Athletic Structures and Procedures**

#### **Entering Athletics:**

- Must sign agreements to what is expected of the coach and administration. Any violation or refusal to cooperate will result in a failing grade in athletics, to removal from athletics altogether.
- Once school has started, a student can enter athletics only up to one week into the school year. After that point, it is at the Superintendent and Athletic Director's discretion.

Once entered into High School and Junior High Boys/Girls Athletics the requirements, as they are stated, must be met:

- Must maintain a 2.0 GPA to remain in Athletics
- Expectations in the Classrooms, as well as other Extracurricular activities

#### **Athletics Throughout the year**

- All student-athletes must participate in off-season, in-sport workouts regardless if sport is being participated by the student-athlete
- All student-athletes will be required to inventory all sports equipment, clothing, and accessories at the beginning of each season and throughout the year
- All student-athletes are required to take part in a weekly cleaning of the locker room
- All student-athletes are required to continuously keep locker and personal items in their locker
- All student-athletes must protect and maintain the athletic facilities and all trash must be cleaned up after every practice, competition, and/or game
- All facilities must not be tampered with in an inappropriate way

- All equipment must be maintained throughout the season  
(NO HORSEPLAY WITH EQUIPMENT)

**End of the year clean out:**

- All equipment, clothing, and/or accessories given to Student-Athlete at the beginning of the year will be returned
- All returning players will receive their issued equipment, clothing, and/or accessories after it is inventoried by the Coach
- Freshman upcoming will be assigned a locker, equipment, clothing, and/or accessories at the discretion of the Coach due to their participation.

The Coach will be the one to assign all tasks and commands needed to maintain order and structure throughout the year.

Practice and Games: Required by ALL Student-Athletes (Only a signed and written Dr.'s note will be assigned an excused absence)

Absences will be at the discretion of the coach and or sponsor.

Missed Practices (Unexcused):

- 1 practice: coach consequence
- 2 practice: suspension from the next competition.
- 3 practice: Consideration from removal from athletics

Missed Games (Unexcused):

- 1 Game: Suspension from next event
- 2 Games: Consideration from removal from athletics
- 3 Games: Removal

ALL MANAGERS (JH to HIGH SCHOOL): MUST meet requirements of each Student-Athlete. They adhere to the same rules and consequences of JH and High School Athletics

### **Music is a means of communication that plays a vital role in an individual's development. The Throckmorton Greyhound Band:**

- Provides an environment that develops musical skills through individual and group performances.
- Provides performance experiences which develop creative self-expression.
- Provides an instructional music program, which provides opportunities for a personal vision with high expectations, development of mental and physical discipline, cultural growth, and citizenship through group endeavor.

### **General Membership Guidelines**

- In order to be a member of a performing group, each person must decide if he or she wants to make the commitment of time and dedication. For all school activities, the faculty and administration work together to ensure that students have the opportunity to participate in many different activities. However, non-school activities must not interfere with the student's commitment to band because your absence affects other members of the organization. Please do not register for Band unless you are willing to make this commitment.
- This is an advanced band which is made up of students who have attained a high degree of proficiency on their instrument. Members of this organization will perform at UIL competitions, contests, and concerts and should be prepared to spend time outside the school day preparing for these performances (all year).
- Students are expected to come to a minimum of *one rehearsal* per week OUTSIDE of the classroom through the end of marching season (early November) and attend all football games, parades, concerts and competitions. Extra practices in the spring semester are rare, but if needed will be scheduled in advance and attendance will be required.
- Students not complying with the class requirements or not maintaining performance standards or discipline levels commensurate with an honors class will be removed from the program at the earliest opportunity at the discretion of the director.

### **Conduct Expectations**

- Our band will be the most disciplined band we encounter all year. There is a zero-tolerance policy for disruptive behavior or attitudes.
- Throckmorton CISD policies and procedures and consequences for extracurricular activities will be enforced in band.
- Being a member of the Greyhound Band is a privilege and the band director reserves the right to remove any student who displays undesirable behaviors and

attitudes. This includes negative behaviors while participating in any rehearsal, travel, football game and/or performances.

- Behavior that interferes with what we are trying to accomplish will not be tolerated.
- Because of the many contacts a band member makes in public, he/she must act as a goodwill ambassador for the school. It is expected that each student act like a lady or gentleman at all times. Polite and courteous behavior is a credit to the organization and to the school.
- Throckmorton CISD students who participate in band are prohibited at all times from:
  - possessing, smoking, selling, or otherwise using tobacco products;
  - possessing or using electronic cigarettes or other non-tobacco nicotine-delivery products or accessories;
  - possessing or using drug paraphernalia;
  - possessing, selling, giving, delivering to another person, using, or being under the influence of marijuana, alcohol, a controlled substance, or any dangerous drug;
  - riding in a vehicle containing alcohol unless a parent, guardian, or other responsible adult is present and aware of the presence of the alcohol;
  - stealing;
  - conduct that causes injury or harm to persons or property;
  - vulgar language or any comments that could be construed as racist/sexist or degrading to any individual will not be tolerated.
  - fighting;
  - any conduct resulting in arrest and/or citations from law enforcement officers;
  - inappropriate touching, including “making out” in public places; sexual gestures; or exposing parts of the body that are ordinarily covered up in public; and
  - inappropriate behavior in public places.

## Attendance Expectations

The greatest single factor in school success is regular and punctual attendance. This is especially true for the success of our Band Program. Attendance is automatically a part of membership in the Greyhound Band.

### **GENERAL NOTES REGARDING ATTENDANCE:**

- Each Band member receives a calendar for the entire year in August. Students are held accountable to this schedule. Please check this calendar regularly to help avoid conflicts. The calendar is subject to change, so please keep this in mind and be flexible if it is necessary to change a date or event.
- Band is a *participation* activity. *Everyone* participates.
- All students enrolled in the Throckmorton Band program are required to participate in the Marching program in the fall semester. Students will not be allowed to enter to perform solely during concert season except under special circumstances.
- All students are required to participate in all band activities including rehearsals (both in school and before/after school), football games, pep rallies, parade, concerts and

group competitions. Repeated absences from rehearsals and performances may result in the student being removed from the program.

- Students will receive grades for participation in all curricular/extracurricular performances, which take place both inside and outside the school day.
- PERFORMANCES may NOT be made up! A missed performance will result in a grade of zero being recorded.
- Attendance and reliability will be considered when the directors make chair placement, officer selections, and Band placement.
- Work is not an excuse for missing a Band rehearsal or a performance.
- Certain extra-curricular activities that you might be involved in may conflict with band activities. If this happens, you must notify the Band Director immediately! There is a solution to every problem. That solution starts with communication between the student and the sponsors involved.
- Every band member must comply with all TCISD and UIL attendance regulations in order to attend official Band functions.
- All absences from Band functions require a written note from the student's parent or legal guardian following the Band function to be considered excused.

## Travel Expectations

- Except under special circumstances, all students will travel with the band to events with the exception of varsity football players and cheerleaders who are playing/performing in the game.
- A student may ride home from an event with a legal guardian, provided that the PARENT or LEGAL GUARDIAN signs the student out with the band director at the end of the game. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- A student may ride home with someone other than a parent or legal guardian if the director receives both a phone call and a written note giving permission.

## Equipment Guidelines

- Students are not allowed to use anyone else's property or to play on anyone else's instrument other than the equipment assigned.
- If a school instrument is checked out to you, you are responsible for its playing condition, which may include repairs to the instrument or case. The instrument will be checked out in good playing condition. Please see our instrument rental agreement for further information.
- Any intentional destruction of property may be grounds for dismissal from the program and a referral to the school principal for further disciplinary action.
- Any instrument that needs repair work should be brought to the director's attention immediately.
- Keep this in mind, "If I touch it, I am responsible for it!"
- School instruments are very expensive and should be handled with extreme care. We are fortunate that Throckmorton CISD offers instruments to every child so that they may experience the joy of creating music.
- Instruments will be issued the first week of school. All instruments will be issued in good mechanical condition. It is your responsibility to maintain the instrument while

it is in your possession. Any damage due to negligence will be repaired at your expense. Bills not paid in a timely manner will be turned over to the principal.

- The school will cover repairs due to normal wear and tear of the instrument. The *director and/or the repair shop* will have the final say as to whether or not any repairs needed are due to normal wear and tear or are due to misuse of the instrument. If it is deemed that the repairs are due to neglect or misuse, you will be held liable for all costs for repairs.

## Competition/UII Guidelines

- The band follows all UII rules governing music programs. Please refer to the UII website for further information concerning specific rules and regulations.

- The band competes each year in the following UII competitions: Region Marching Contest, State Marching Contest (if certified), Solo/Ensemble Contest (individual), Concert /Sightreading Contest.
- No pass-no play is part of House Bill 72 that was passed by the Texas Legislature around 1984 and became Texas State Law at the beginning of the 1985-1986 school year. Being ineligible does not excuse a student from after school practice. Students are still required to attend all rehearsals. Eligibility is not just one individual's problem. Each time we lose a student due to grades, it affects the entire group. Making a commitment to the Band Program also involves each student making a commitment to pass all of his or her courses.
  - Activities affected by no pass/no play include: football games, marching contest, solo/ensemble contest, marching/concert band festivals, ATSSB auditions, band trips, parades, and pep rallies.
  - Activities NOT affected by no pass/no play include: Concerts on Throckmorton CISD campus, banquets, and before/after school rehearsals.
- 8-Hour Rule: In order to prevent rehearsing that was not productive for student life, UII established the 8-hour rule. This rule simply means that the band will not rehearse for more than 8 hours outside of the school day during a calendar week. The 8-hour rule does not include football games, rehearsals before leaving for a contest or performance, competitions, travel time spent traveling to or from an event. All parents and students must sign a form at the beginning of the year agreeing to comply with this policy per UII guidelines.

## **CHEERLEADING/MASCOT - Britnee Woods**

The purpose of the cheerleading squad is to act as spirit leaders of the school and community, to uphold the reputation of the school, to build character, and to encourage scholarship. A cheerleader is a spirit leader at all times, and should accept this responsibility even when she is not in uniform or at a school function.

**Candidates for high school cheerleader or mascot must currently be in grades 8-11. Jr. High candidates must be currently in grades 6th or 7th.**

**Up to six cheerleaders will be selected by out of town judges counting 50%, student vote counting 20%, and faculty vote counting 30%. Tryouts will be held in front of the student body and judges. Students will vote on a google form with names of all students who try out. All students in grades 8-11 will be allowed to vote for six candidates of their choice for HS cheerleader and one candidate for mascot. Students in grades 6-7 will vote for JH. The highest combined score of judges, student body and faculty will select the cheerleaders and mascot. (Scoring system will be applicable based on the number of candidates trying out.)**

All cheerleaders and mascot will be required to attend a summer camp. The individual will pay the fees for camp and any needed clothing.

The individual cheerleaders will purchase uniforms and accessories. This will cost around \$400. (We will have fundraisers, but uniforms are expensive and you will probably have to pay for part of it out of your pocket. Be prepared to do that!)

Game duties include:

Football games—all HS/JH cheerleaders and mascot will cheer at all varsity/JH games and pep rallies.

Basketball games--- all cheerleaders will cheer at all district and playoff varsity girls' and boys' regular scheduled games unless she is playing. Mascot will suit up for play-off games.

Cheerleaders and mascot will cheer at all additional functions deemed necessary by the sponsor and the high school principal.

Cheerleaders and mascot will be governed by UIL eligibility rules involving grades. A 70 average or above must be maintained in each class.

Cheerleaders and mascot will be expected to follow **all** Student Codes of Conduct for Throckmorton Collegiate Independent School District as well as the Extra-curricular Handbook.

## Cheerleader Roles and Responsibilities

One of the most enjoyable times in your life will be your cheerleading years. You are the leaders of THS and role models for many students. This is a big responsibility, so keep this in mind regardless of whether you are at a school function or a non-school function. You will be watched and observed constantly! Always think before you act! Take pride in your squad, school, community, and of course, yourself.

You will be expected to follow these guidelines:

1. Be on time. I expect you to be at the games at least 30 minutes before it starts to hang signs and cheer the team on the field. You may go get the opposing cheerleaders at the beginning of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter. DO NOT stay gone the entire 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter. You are at the game to cheer for the boys and not to visit extended periods of time with the girls from the opposing team.
2. Be aware of game action and apply chants accordingly.
3. When we are about to run a play-do not cheer. The fans are watching the play. As soon as the play is over or while we are in a huddle you may do a chant.
4. When not performing, stay in a simple, organized formation. Do not huddle up to chitchat!
5. Cheer to the entire crowd, moving around if necessary.
6. If the fans start a chant, go along with them.
7. Display continuous enthusiasm, regardless of the score! A crowd will follow a squad that they enjoy watching.
8. Know the chants you will be using. EVERYONE should be doing the same motions.
9. Do not leave the game until it is completely over.
10. Smile It is important that you act like you are enjoying what you are doing!
11. No gum chewing.
12. Take ALL jewelry off before the game begins or don't wear it to the game. ALL means ALL, including NO nose studs.
13. Do not lead a cheer or chant while a player is injured on the field.
14. If the band plays a song that you want to dance with, everyone must know the movements. (NO VULGAR MOTIONS!) There are many people watching you and remember--you are not the Dallas Cowboy Cheerleaders.
15. No disagreements in front of the crowd.
16. Do not leave your hair down if it is long. It is not appropriate when performing. You are at the game to cheer and promote spirit!

**17. When it is your turn to be in charge of the signs, TAKE CARE OF BUSINESS! THERE WILL BE CONSEQUENCES FOR NOT DOING YOUR JOB APPROPRIATELY!**

### Throckmorton FFA Code of Conduct

The goal of the Throckmorton FFA is to instill premier leadership, personal growth and career success in all participants. With the community's help, encouragement and positive communication, this year will prove to be successful. We will conduct ourselves at all times in order to be a credit to our organization, chapter, school and community by following the FFA rules for appearance, behavior, and membership.

### Code of Ethics:

FFA members conduct themselves at all times to be a credit to their organization, chapter, school, community and family. FFA members pledge to:

- Develop potential for premier leadership, personal growth and career success.
- Make a positive difference in the lives of others.
- Dress neatly and appropriately for the occasion.
- Respect the rights of others and their property.
- Be courteous, honest and fair with others.
- Communicate in an appropriate, purposeful and positive manner.
- Demonstrate good sportsmanship by being modest in winning and generous in defeat.
- Make themselves aware of FFA programs and activities and be an active participant.
- Conduct and value a supervised agricultural experience program.
- Strive to establish and enhance their skills through agricultural education in order to enter a successful career.
- Appreciate and promote diversity in our organization.

### Membership

- Students within the 9-12th grades must be in an Agriculture Science Class each year to **be an active member and** participate in Throckmorton FFA.
- All students must follow UIL Side by Side ruling on eligibility, **TCISD student/extracurricular handbooks, and the livestock handbook** for classes and showing.
- Active Junior membership eligibility is considered 3rd-8th grade.
- Students younger than 8 years old or below the 3rd grade are not eligible for any Major Jr. Livestock Shows. However, they may participate in the "open" classes.
- Active Senior membership eligibility is considered 9th grade and older.
- FFA Contest teams are eligible starting in the 9th grade.
- Every FFA student is expected to participate in all fundraising activities. A minimum sales amount will be outlined for each event.
- All members must be in good standing with Throckmorton FFA and Throckmorton CISD academically and financially.
- Membership may be temporarily or permanently denied for failure to abide by the code of Ethics, Bylaws or Livestock Handbook.

## Livestock

- Advisor must approve all show projects prior to purchase and/or arrival to the barn.
- Quality Counts programs must be completed by each student. If student was younger than 14 years of age in a prior show season and completed QC in prior years, they must complete the senior test and pass. As of **July 2023**, all students must complete a new Quality Counts program. Please check with Ag Teacher to confirm eligibility.
- Students will be required to attend any and all livestock meetings, weigh-ins or clinics that pertain to their species requested by Throckmorton FFA.
- Use of Throckmorton FFA equipment will be at the Ag Teacher's discretion. A check out form will be required by individuals in advance. Forms will be available in teacher's classroom.
- Charges will incur with any lost, damaged, or late return of equipment.
- Validation tags will be required on steers, heifers, wether goats & sheep, barrows/market gilts, breeding sheep & goats and any other species as required.
- All breeding animals must be registered per deemed association into the student's name before the respected major show deadlines.
- To insure a Team mentality, all students entered with the Throckmorton FFA will be required to stall, show and load home with the Throckmorton FFA.
- Stall assignments will be determined by Ag teacher prior to stalling.
- Only approved shows will be signed for.
- Students must report at designated times during the attended event.

## Contests

- Contests will be considered as any Leadership Development, Career Development, Public Speaking and or Agri-Science Fair and Invitational competitions set out by the State or National FFA Organization.
- Members of a team will be selected based on practice time and accuracy of the determined competition.
- A team member may be removed at any time for lack of commitment to a team or actions including insubordination or violation of Throckmorton ISD student handbook.
- Transportation will be provided by the FFA Chapter and the team will travel to and from the event together as a team. In case of extenuating circumstances, arrangements will be made through TCISD administration.
- Any team member that is removed/withdraws from their competition prematurely or in an untimely manner will result in any ramifications that are deemed necessary by the chapter advisor.
- Ramifications include but are not limited to: reimbursement of entry fees, training of a replacement, & postponement of future FFA activities.

### **Practice and Contests:**

Required by ALL students participating in contests (Only a signed and written Dr.'s note will be assigned an excused absence).

Absences will be at the discretion of the Advisor and TCISD administration.

### Missed Practices (Unexcused):

1 practice: Advisor consequence

2 practice: suspension from the next competition.

3 practice: Consideration of removal from contest

### Missed Competitions (Unexcused):

1 Game: Advisor consequence

2 Games: Consideration of removal from contest

3 Games: Removal

### **Officers**

- The officers of the chapter shall be as follows: President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Reporter and Sentinel. Additional offices may be held according to local, state and national bylaws as necessary.
- The advisor shall be the teachers of the Agricultural Science program. Officers shall perform the usual duties of the respective offices as listed in the Official FFA Manual. Other officers may be selected as the situation warrants.
- Student holding the Greenhand FFA Degree may be eligible to run for an elected Chapter Officer position.
- Officers shall be elected annually, according to chapter officer election processes.
- An individual interview will take place.
- An FFA knowledge quiz will be given.
- A vote will be taken amongst chapter membership.
- The officers of the chapter together with the chairman in charge of the major sections of the annual program of activities shall constitute the Chapter Executive Committee.
- The Executive Committee shall have full power to act as necessary for the Chapter in accordance with actions taken at chapter meetings and various regulations or bylaws adopted from time to time.
- The terms of office shall be for one year, ending after the newly elected officers are installed.
- District and Area officer candidates shall follow the respected outline of qualifications from the respective association(s).

## **Officer Qualifications**

- All officer candidates are to know and agree to abide by the FFA Code of Ethics.
- All officer candidates are to have knowledge of The Mission and Strategies of the FFA Organization.
- All officer candidates are to have commendable citizenship and conduct records.
- Chapter officer candidates must have an overall average of "C" or better in all classes.
- All officer candidates are to display a sincere desire to carry out the duties of the office to which they are elected.
- All officers must abide by the Chapter FFA Officer Rules and sign a statement agreeing to abide by them.
- Officers are to carry out their duties as outlined in the official FFA Manual, and as assigned by the President and approved by the Advisor.

## **Removal from office**

- Officers may be removed from office for failing to meet the qualifications stated in the Bylaws, Officer Contract, and at the discretion of the advisor.

## **Awards & Degrees**

- Students who are actively enrolled in an Agriculture Science class and meet the minimum qualifications will be eligible to earn their Discovery, Greenhand, Chapter degrees at the local level.
- Students who are eligible to apply for the Lone Star State degree or American FFA degree may do so via the State and National guidelines
- Students who are actively involved and meet the minimum qualifications are eligible to apply for advanced awards at the District, Area, State and National levels.
- Team awards won remain the property of the Throckmorton FFA for display purposes.

## **Senior Scholarships**

- Awards are granted to graduating seniors who meet the following requirements:
- The student must be a graduating senior at Throckmorton High School.
- Must currently be an active member of the Throckmorton FFA, complete a minimum of one year of an accredited Agricultural Class at Throckmorton High School, and have participated in the Agriculture Science and FFA functions during their high school years.
- Must show one involvement in FFA participation in three of the following areas: leadership development event; career development event; FFA officer/voting delegate; received accomplishment award; top 10 sales person; or stock show participation.
- Must be planning to attend college or a technical school.
- Any other requirements on the scholarship application.
- Scholarship recipient will receive payment after he/she has provided proof of enrollment to the agriculture science teachers. The scholarship is good for one year from date of FFA banquet when it is awarded.
- The amount of the scholarship will be determined by the amount of money set aside that year for scholarships divided by the number of recipients.

- Texas FFA Scholarships and National FFA Scholarships are available for those who apply.

## **Conventions**

- Throckmorton FFA shall attend the District, Area IV, and State FFA Conventions each year as well as the National Convention when someone is participating.
- Attendees will be selected from the current chapter officers.
- Students participating in any capacity at the convention will have first available position to attend over other participants
- Graduating seniors may attend the conventions only if they are receiving an award or participating in a contest or running for a state office.
- All members wishing to attend the State or National convention must fill out an application.

## **Official FFA Clothing Equipment & Accessories**

- Each individual member takes upon themselves the responsibility of wearing FFA Official Dress and accessories with dignity and pride so as not to reflect any bad criticism upon themselves, the school, the FFA Organization, or the Local chapter.
- All members will show pride in the FFA Organization in his/her school by properly caring for and using the facility, its equipment, and official paraphernalia in a proper, dignified manner.
- Each individual FFA member is to realize that they are a personal representative of their school and FFA Chapter. The image of their school and chapter are reflected through and by them as an individual. Aim for and achieve excellence.

## **Amendments**

- If a student obtains multiple disciplinary write-ups including but not limited to detentions, ISS or DAEP a student's punishment (suspension, expulsion, etc.) will be at the discretion of the advisor with administrative approval.
- Throckmorton FFA Bylaws may be amended or changed at any regular chapter meeting by establishing a quorum in accordance with chapter constitution and bylaws providing it is not in conflict with the State Association Constitution or that of the National Organization.

### One Act Play Handbook

Eligible Participants: Students who are full time students as designated by the University Interscholastic League guidelines in grades 9-12 are eligible to participate. (As of the 2016-2017 School Year, 8th grade students may serve as alternates and replace students who may no longer participate due to grades or discipline issues.)

**Auditions:** Audition times will be posted on the school Web Page and Facebook Page. Students are expected to attend each of the auditions. Should the student have a conflict with the audition times, he / she is expected to make arrangements with the director ahead of time to audition. Once the director closes auditions no further auditions will be added unless the need to re-cast arises.

**Cast / Crew Size:** The cast or crew number will vary from year to year dependent upon the casting needs of the script. The UIL rules stipulate a maximum number of 15 cast and 5 crew with 4 alternates. These are the maximum numbers, but not the required number of students.

**Rehearsals, tardies, and absences:** Students will be given a rehearsal schedule once the play is cast. All students will be asked to turn in dates of prior engagements and school activities at auditions. The director will take these dates into consideration when scheduling practices and will create a rehearsal schedule that will attempt to accommodate the majority of students. If a student cannot attend a practice due to a school activity, it is the student's responsibility to inform the director in advance. If a student becomes ill and cannot attend practice, the student must inform the director as soon as possible. Students are expected to miss no more than 3 rehearsals due to a non-school related event. Students with excessive absences will be replaced with an alternate. Students are expected to be on time for rehearsals, three tardies will count as one unexcused absence. The number one consideration is for students to be considerate of the full cast and director(s) in notifying the director of their absence in advance.

**Rehearsals Memorization and Blocking:** Students will be given a deadline for memorizing lines and blocking in a scene. Should students not meet these deadlines and put the play in jeopardy, they may be replaced. This is not an ideal situation for anyone, but each of the students has a responsibility to learn the material and be prepared so that rehearsal time is not wasted.

**Critiques:** This is educational theater. The point of educational theater is for students to learn theater decorum, improve personal performance, and learn to communicate a message as a team. This process involves critique. The director critiques the students, festival judges, and contest judges critique the students. Students must be receptive to

critique and willing to work with their peers, the director, and the judges with proper decorum. “They should respond toward the adjudicator with the same respect that they would give a guest teacher in a theatre arts classroom. (See C&CR Section 1034)” (High School One Act Play Handbook).

**Procedures:** Students will follow the school dress code when travelling to and from the festivals and contests. During Awards assemblies students will dress in nice clothing (Sunday dress). We will travel to and from contest as a team. Under extenuating circumstances paperwork must be completed at the school in advance of the competition. All students must attend the oral critique after contest, this is a UIL rule. UIL Rules may be accessed at <http://www.uiltexas.org/theatre/high-school-one-act>

## Rules and Expectations

All esports students must maintain passing grades in all of their classes in order to play. Students unable to manage passing grades may be removed from all esports teams for the remainder of the season to ensure that they have ample time to apply themselves to their regular school work. Furthermore, esports students must uphold the expectations outlined below when engaging in contest or practice to ensure their success in our program:

1. **Students must use respectful language** when practicing in the game room. During competition a lower volume is also required for players to perform and communicate optimally. Vulgarities and profanity will not be tolerated.
2. **Students must follow directions from the coach without argument** and within a timely manner. This is to ensure an orderly and safe environment for all students.
3. **Students are responsible for cleaning up after themselves** and preventing game room messes. This means that food in the game room is prohibited and drinks must be contained in tightly lidded containers to avoid spills.
4. **Students must attend every regular season game** unless they have an excused absence, such as for sickness or injury. Students who do not attend games may be removed from their teams. Furthermore, since failing students cannot play, they may also be removed from their teams.
5. **Students must attend practice for at least 2 hours each week** during the regular season. Inability to attend for at least 2 hours will result in removal from the team, and students who arrive late or leave early will have to make up time. The game room is open during the following times for students to practice and earn their hours:
  1. After school from 4-5pm, Monday-Thursday (1hr)
  2. Before school from 7:30-7:55am, Monday-Friday (30 minutes)
6. **No student may be a part of more than 2 teams as a starting player** unless he or she attends an additional hour of practice. However, any student may be expected to fill in as an alternate if/when students are unable to attend games. This allows us to make the most of our small roster and avoid forfeits.
7. **Students are responsible for any guests that they bring to practice.** If a student's guest breaks any of the game room rules, the student who brought the guest will be held responsible. This will ensure that accountability within the game room is maintained and that the game room environment remains productive.
8. **Students will be held responsible for any equipment they damage** in the game room. If a student cannot replace equipment that he or she has damaged, then the

student will be removed from the program until the damaged equipment is replaced.

9. **Students must listen to and respect their team captain's decisions.** Team captains hold certain privileges and responsibilities that other team members do not and should be respected as leaders and decision makers. Team captains hold the following responsibilities:

- a. Deciding the order of play for esports where turn taking is necessary.
- b. Communicating with the opposing team during competition.
- c. Communicating concerns to the coach regarding team compatibility or attendance.
- d. Communicating results for completed games or sets to the coach.
- e. Making sure that rules are followed during practice and competition and that players are exhibiting proper sportsmanship.
- f. Reminding teammates of upcoming games or practices.
- g. Ensuring that games run smoothly in an event where the coach is unable to attend.
- h. Holding an A/B average in all of their regular classes.
- i. Demonstrating exemplary character and leadership.

## CHEER - CODE OF CONDUCT CONTRACT

In addition to the school policies set forth by Throckmorton Early College High School, the following rules hereby apply to all THS cheerleader/mascot candidates. Please read them carefully. Before you will be allowed to tryout, the signature portion of these rules must be signed by you and your parent/ guardian and returned to the cheer sponsor.

1. Squad members will report to **all** cheer activities on time.
2. If you will miss a practice or any cheer event for any reason notify the **coach** in advance. Excused absences are death in family, funeral, or religious holiday. Missing for work is not an excused absence. Unexcused absences will result in disciplinary action (see attached demerit system).
3. Maintain good grades. You must maintain a 70% average for each class. "No pass-No play". If a member fails the 1<sup>st</sup> six weeks and does not regain eligibility at the end of the three week period, she will be dropped from the cheer squad. If you are on a failing report, you will be required to attend school tutoring (morning, afternoon, or evening) until the next report date.
4. **Cheerleaders are role models and need to set a good example for the student body at all times (in/out of school).**
5. Work and transportation are invalid excuses for tardiness or absences.
6. Absolutely no profanity, alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs are tolerated!
7. Absolutely no cell phones, drinks, candy, gum, or food of any kind during practice or games.
8. If you are assigned to ISS/Suspended for any reason, you will be benched for the next cheer event.
9. If you are placed in DAEP for any reason, you will be dismissed from the squad.
