- Tina Reeve asked Caitlin Johnson to be the note taker.
- We discussed what the agenda for each meeting will look like.
  - She discussed how our meetings will go. She also discussed what our agenda will look like for each meeting and what we will be discussing.
  - The agenda will be posted on the website.
  - Meetings will be on November 13<sup>th</sup>, February 5<sup>th</sup>, March 4<sup>th</sup>, and May's meeting will be through email.
- We will hold our elections in the fall to include new parents.
- We discussed the Rules of Order and Procedures and what it looks like.

- Our Curriculum Goal
  - K-6 reading growth goal:
    - Elementary target is for at least 65% of all students to make typical growth or better as determined by EOY (End of Year) Acadience Reading Pathways of Progress.
    - Staff will monitor the Pathways of Progress for each student to ensure that all students can meet the goal.
- Current Funding:
  - 2024-2025 53,894.49
    - This year we will be using this money to pay for three aids that will work at our school.
- Action Plan:
  - Employ and retain Language Arts Academic teacher assistance funded by Land Trust.
  - SIPPS Reading Intervention

- o Teachers meet in PLC meetings to discuss reading data and plan instruction and interventions in response to data.
  - o Centerville Elementary will participate in the Schools Cubed program through Daivs School District.
- Math Goal:
  - o We will increase the end-of-year percentage of students in 3<sup>rd</sup> through 6<sup>th</sup> grade proficiency levels according to RISE math scores by three percent, EOY 2024 compared to the prior 2023- year data.
    - We will employ and retain Math academic teacher assistant funded by Land Trust
    - Math facts intervention program will be used by teachers and teacher assistants.
    - Teachers will meet in regularly scheduled PLCs to discuss math data and plan instruction, interventions, and extensions.
- Time was turned to Christine Sgo the new ELA coach
  - o She talked about the beginning of year reading data.
    - 67% of students at our school are reading at proficiency.
    - We discussed the District Literacy Goals
    - What we are doing:
      - Community Council 10-9-2024 Notes1 Our new reading program is CKLA.
      - SIPPS and Sound Partners are the district intervention.
      - Teachers will meet in PLCs at least twice a month.
- The best resource for our school is the teachers.
