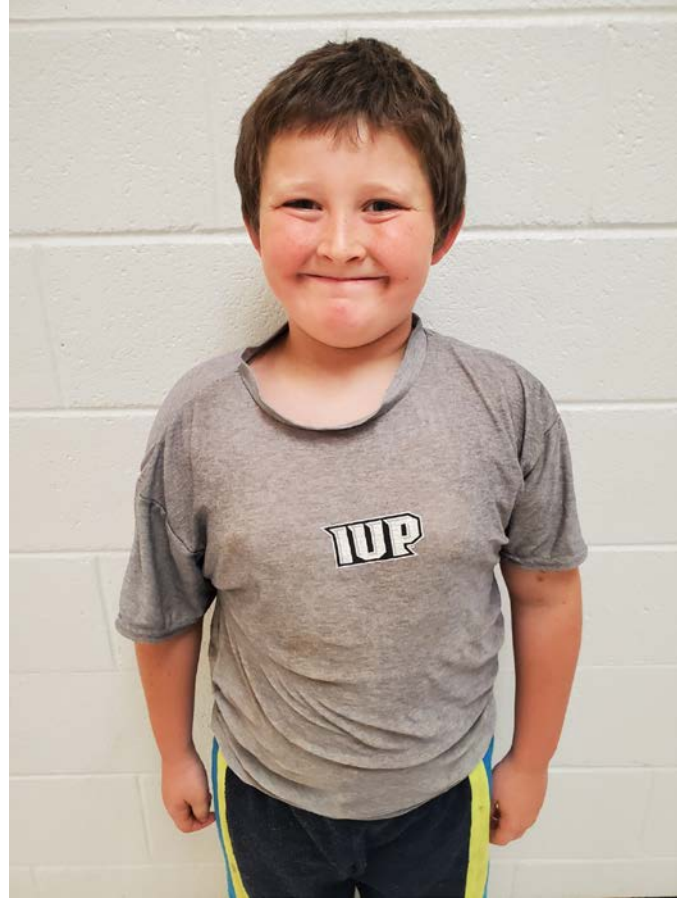
Owen Hamilton – South Branch Elementary
