Tutor Tracks is a FREE seven-week, guided tutoring program designed to firm up SD elementary and middle school students' foundations in Reading, Grammar, or Math. Program tutors are Black Hills State University and Northern State University teachers-in-training.

## Quarter 2-Grades

Your learner's second quarter grades are now available to view on Canvas by accessing your parent Canvas account. Please take a moment with your learner to review his/her grades. Each course assesses learner progress on the standards of learning for that course. If you have questions about your learner's progress, please communicate those with the classroom teacher.

Grades are as up-to-date as possible to serve as a snapshot of your learner's progress in Harrisburg Middle School's year-long, standard-based grading policy. As a reminder, a learner has a grade for each standard, and each learner is held accountable for each standard in each class. Please know that any standard that is not 70% or higher may result in zero hour.

Feel free to reach out to your child's teacher regarding failing standards and ways learners can recover their grades. It is important that learners work hard and give school their very best to recover any failing grades or to maintain passing grades.

If you would prefer a paper copy of your learner's grades, please contact the HSMS Administrative Assistant (Kristin Krueger), by calling 605-743-2567 ext. 3007. If you have not yet set up a Canvas account, I encourage you to do so.

### **General reminder about MS grades:**

MS uses standards-based grading. This means students receive multiple grades for each course, one grade for each district standard. Any standard below 70%, is "Standard Not Met" and needs to be addressed in order to pass the course. 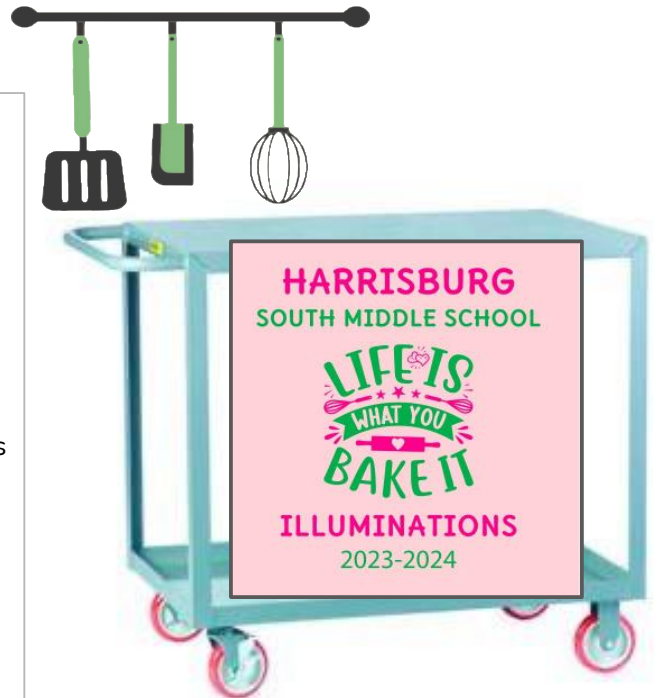
