LAUNCHING 3DE AT CHAVEZ: REAL-WORLD LEARNING IN ACTION

This quarter marks the official launch of our first year of 3DE at Cesar Chavez High School, in partnership with Junior Achievement! 3DE is an innovative educational model that connects real-world business challenges to classroom learning—helping students build the critical thinking, collaboration, and problem-solving skills they'll need for future success.

Our amazing 3DE students recently partnered with global consulting firm Deloitte to tackle a real business challenge. Over five weeks, they researched, collaborated, and developed professional-level solutions, and on October 23, the top teams will present their final proposals to Deloitte leaders at the Culminating Event.

Next up, students will launch a new case challenge with local entrepreneur Scooptacular on November 5, followed by a visit to Deloitte's Tempe offices on November 7. A huge shout-out to Ms. Corona, along with Ms. Hegstrom and Ms. Sanchez, for leading this incredible new learning experience. We are so proud of our 3DE Champions!

Back to School Open House

CHAVEZ HOSTS FIRST-EVER BACK-TO-SCHOOL OPEN HOUSE!

Cesar Chavez High School made history this year by hosting our first-ever Back-to-School Open House before the start of the school year! For the first time, students and families were able to visit campus, meet teachers, and get familiar with schedules and classrooms before the first day of school.

2025-2026 Schoolwide Academic Improvement Goals

FINETUNED GOALS

We're committed to ensuring that every Champion learns, grows, and achieves. This year, our two schoolwide academic goals focus on strengthening instruction, collaboration, and alignment to boost student achievement in Math, ELA, and ACT scores.

Goal 1: Strengthen Common ELA and ELL Instructional Practices

We're building stronger readers, writers, and thinkers by using schoolwide strategies like Marking the Text and Finding the Main Idea.

Target Outcomes:

- Increase ACT English and Reading benchmark scores by 5%
- Increase the percentage of students scoring Proficient or higher on AZELLA by 5%
- Ensure 60% of students meet or exceed Lexile growth goals on NWEA
- 100% of teachers will implement and submit quarterly evidence of strategies

Goal 2: Boost Schoolwide Math Interventions

We're enhancing math achievement by focusing on targeted interventions in Advisory, utilization of Edmentum, consistent practice, and ACT prep support.


Target Outcomes:

- Improve overall math performance by 5% compared to the 2024–2025 school year
- Reduce failure rates in Algebra 1–2 and Geometry by 10% or lower.

These shared practices strengthen learning across every classroom, creating a consistent, supportive, and engaging environment for all Champions.



FEATURED LITERACY STRATEGY: MARKING THE TEXT




One of our schoolwide literacy focuses is Marking the Text — a strategy that helps students actively engage with what they're reading. When students underline key ideas, circle unfamiliar words, and annotate important details, they're learning to think critically and connect more deeply with the material.

You can encourage your student to practice this at home by marking up reading passages, articles, or even instructions. This strategy is used in all subjects, from math and science to art and PE, so students see and use it often to strengthen comprehension and focus.

FEATURED LITERACY STRATEGY: FINDING THE MAIN IDEA

Another key Chavez literacy strategy is Finding the Main Idea — helping students identify the central message or key point of what they read, hear, or view. This builds strong comprehension skills and helps students summarize, analyze, and communicate more effectively.

Encourage your student to ask themselves, "What is this mostly about?" after reading or watching something. Teachers across every department, including electives and performing arts, are reinforcing this strategy to support strong reading and thinking habits in every Champion!



ACT Prep

ACT PREP OPPORTUNITIES FOR JUNIORS!

We're committed to helping our juniors prepare for success on the ACT, one of the most important college readiness assessments. The ACT not only measures academic skills but can also open doors to college admissions, scholarships, and career opportunities.

This year, all junior Advisories will have assigned days to log in and complete timed ACT practice tests, helping students get comfortable with the format, question types, and pacing of the real exam.

Behind the scenes, our ACT Prep Committee is working hard to design opportunities and resources to support every student in reaching proficiency—a composite score of 19 or higher in the state of Arizona.

We're also hosting a series of Saturday ACT Prep Workshops open to all juniors:

Advanced Placement Courses

CHAMPIONS EXCEL IN ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) COURSES!

We are proud to share that Cesar Chavez High School offers the largest number of AP courses in all of PXU—an incredible 18 college-level classes for students to choose from! These courses give students the opportunity to experience college-level rigor, build confidence, and potentially earn college credit by passing the AP Exam at the end of the year.



Why take AP? AP classes help students save money on college tuition, qualify for scholarships, and prepare for the pace and expectations of college classrooms. They also boost GPAs, as AP courses are weighted for academic rigor.

Last year, we strengthened our AP program by welcoming Mrs. Wells as our AP Coordinator, increasing funding for AP tutoring, and sending teachers to the AP Summer Institute for specialized training. The results were outstanding—our AP exam pass rates saw the largest jump in nearly every subject in school history!

We're excited to continue this momentum and can't wait to see what our AP Champions achieve this year!











INSTRUCTIONAL LEADERS DRIVE CHAVEZ SCHOOLWIDE SUCCESS!



WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT "I-DAYS" AT CHAVEZ

At Cesar Chavez High School, our I-Days (Independent Learning Days) are virtual learning days designed to help students stay on track and get extra academic support. On these days, students work from home but still participate in school—they can connect with teachers on Microsoft Teams in the afternoon for help with assignments or questions.

Attendance counts on I-Days! To be marked present, students must complete and submit their Advisory participation form, which includes uploading evidence of their work and completing a short reflection.

- 9th Grade: Can work on make-up assignments or earn a Math trophy in Edmentum
- 10th & 11th Grades: Choose from Edmentum Math, make-up work, or MvACT practice.
- **12th Grade:** Focus on make-up work or complete college, career, or scholarship tasks.

I-Days give students time to catch up, reflect, and strengthen learning habits while teachers engage in professional development and learning in the mornings and provide virtual support for their students in the afternoons. Thank you for helping your student stay engaged and accountable on these important learning days!




IMPORTANT UPDATE: END OF COURSE EXAMS


This year, PXU has shifted from end-of-semester finals to end-of-course finals, meaning most classes will not have final exams in December. Only a small number of courses that officially end this semester will give finals. Instead, students will complete end-of-unit assessments or projects, and the traditional December testing days will be used for NWEA Round 2 testing—a key measure of student growth and learning. Student attendance is extremely important during the last week of the semester, as students will be completing final projects, assessments, and NWEA testing. Please make sure your student is present and engaged so they can finish the semester strong!

UNDERSTANDING PXU'S NEW GRADING PRACTICES

This year, Phoenix Union has adopted a new districtwide grading policy designed to make grading more fair, consistent, and focused on learning. We recognize that this transition has come with some adjustments, and we want to thank our students, teachers, and families for their patience and understanding as we fine-tune the process.

Our amazing Cesar Chavez teachers have been working collaboratively to ensure that grading systems truly reflect student learning and mastery of state standards—not just completion or behavior. You may notice that in the gradebook, a single assignment sometimes appears with multiple scores. This simply means the assignment was aligned to more than one standard, and each score shows how well the student performed on those specific skills. Our goal is for grades to reflect what students know and can do, giving everyone a clearer picture of academic progress.

NWEA TESTING AND WHY IT MATTERS

At Cesar Chavez High School, we use the NWEA test three times a year as a key part of our schoolwide academic improvement plan. This important assessment helps us measure each student's individual growth in Math and English over time. Unlike traditional tests, NWEA is adaptive—it adjusts the difficulty of questions based on each student's answers to find their exact learning level.

NWEA is not a pass-or-fail test; it's a tool that shows teachers and students how much progress is being made and where extra support might be needed. We encourage every student to take it seriously and do their best so we can celebrate true growth and success. These are important school days, so please make sure your student is present and on time for all NWEA testing sessions. With a growth mindset, every Champion can see how their hard work is paying off!

EDMENTUM: SUPPORTING STUDENT GROWTH IN MATH!

We're excited to continue using Edmentum as one of our key strategies to improve math achievement schoolwide! Research shows that adaptive learning programs like Edmentum help students grow by meeting them exactly where they are—offering lessons that adjust to each student's individual learning level. Students can log in to Edmentum anytime—especially during I-Days and Advisory when they don't have other assignments. Each time a student completes a lesson, they earn a trophy, a fun way to track progress and celebrate success! Edmentum is a powerful extra tool that helps students who need to catch up while also challenging those who are ready to move ahead. We've already seen great results—after launching this initiative last year, our math scores improved schoolwide! Keep logging in, Champions—your effort makes a difference!

ATTENDANCE TODAY, ACHIEVEMENT TOMORROW!

At Cesar Chavez High At Cesar Chavez High School, we take pride in teaching and learning from bell to bell! Help every Champion start the day strong by arriving on time—1st period begins at 7:30 a.m. (8:15 a.m. on Wednesdays). For safety, students are not released before 2:25 p.m., and must wear their school ID daily.

Parent/Guardian will be notified at 3 unexcused all-day absences through the district communication platform (e.g., phone, email, text).

Content teachers will make a reasonable effort to conference with the student regarding their absences.

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The **Content Teacher** will contact the Parent/Guardian at 4 unexcused absences in their class.

The **Advisory Teacher** will contact the Parent/Guardian by phone at 5 unexcused all-day absences.

Content/Advisory teacher may assign student to academic interventions.

The **Student Liaison** will notify the Parent/Guardian at 6 excused/unexcused all-day absences.

The **Student Liaison** will conduct a root-cause analysis to identify underlying factors contributing to absenteeism and will implement targeted, individualized interventions using Check & Connect strategies to support student re-engagement.

The **Student Liaison** may collaborate with the Engagement Team and/or Attendance Committee for ongoing support.

The **Student Liaison** will notify the Parent/Guardian at 9 excused/unexcused all-day absences via regular posted mail and electronically by email or the District adopted communication platform.

A student's Counselor will be notified at 9 excused/unexcused all-day absences.

Admin will conduct a review of academic progress, interventions received, behaviors that may impact learning, and attendance.

Collaboration with the **Student Support Team (SST)** may be initiated to provide sustained or more intensive support, depending on the student's level of need.

Continued absences may result in a referral for an Attendance Hearing.


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Understanding Attendance continued...

WHAT IS CHRONIC ABSENTEEISM?

Chronic absenteeism is defined as a student missing 10% or more of the school year, for any reason, whether excused or unexcused. This level of absenteeism often reflects a pattern of repeated absences that goes beyond occasional illness or emergencies. Over time, these missed days can create significant gaps in learning, disrupt academic progress, impact classroom connections, and contribute to disengagement from school altogether. Even a few absences each month can add up quickly and have lasting consequences on a student's ability to stay on track for graduation.



Advanced Weapon Detection

As part of our district's commitment to safety and learning, Cesar Chavez High School has successfully implemented the Advanced Weapon Detection System (AWDS) on campus. We are committed to creating the best possible learning environment for all students. In alignment with the new Arizona state statute, cell phones are not permitted during instructional time in any class period. Students may use their phones only during passing periods and lunch.

Since implementing this expectation, we've already seen a significant increase in student learning and engagement across classrooms! While we understand that students enjoy their phones, research nationwide continues to show the negative impact of cell phone distractions on focus and achievement.




Department Highlights


CHAMPIONS EARN ENGLISH COLLEGE CREDIT THROUGH DUAL ENROLLMENT!

Cesar Chavez High School is proud to celebrate our students participating in Dual Enrollment this year! A total of 87 juniors are earning college credit in English 101, and 27 seniors are taking English 102 for advanced credit. These dedicated students are getting a head start on their college journeys while still in high school—way to go, Champions!

DUAL COLLEGE MATH STUDENTS SHINE IN DISTRICT COMMON ASSESSMENT

Dual college math students at Cesar Chavez High School are off to a remarkable start this quarter, excelling in the District Common Assessment (DCA). Their performance highlights the impact of a guaranteed and viable curriculum and the dedication of both students and teachers. At CCHS, 45% of students scored Highly Proficient, compared to the district average of 28%. Another 40% reached Proficient, surpassing the district's 34%.

These results demonstrate not only academic achievement but also the strong learning culture that supports student growth. A solid foundation in mathematics is equipping learners with the skills they need for college, career, and life success. Students themselves emphasize perseverance and focus as keys to success. "College math isn't as difficult as it may seem. Pay attention, keep an open mind, and don't give up after one mistake. Instead, learn from it and use it to grow," shared Abdon Woods. Similarly, Henry Lane added, "College math becomes much easier when you take proper notes, use the resources available, follow instructions, and listen closely to the teacher. With focus and effort, this class can be very manageable."



BEGINNING DRAWING & PAINTING STUDENTS CREATE "CHARCOAL ANIMALS"




ADVANCED DRAWING & PAINTING STUDENTS SHINE WITH "GLASS" PROJECTS
