UPDATES: MOVING

ITS TIME!! They have completed the work on the other side of the building. We will begin some of the 'moving back' process on Monday, Oct. 6 and finish on Friday, Oct. 10 with a NO SCHOOL day for students. The HVAC was cleaned and serviced as well as all classrooms, the office, and hallways cleaned. Environmental testing has shown better than expected numbers for our return.

Our moving in plans will accompany this newsletter in an email and with Friday Folder information. Please read them carefully.

Many classroom and office items were not salvageable and had to be discarded. When teachers return, classrooms will be a blank slate and will need to be unpacked and reset before students arrive on Monday, Oct. 13. The Knights of Columbus and Field Bros Moving have volunteered to help move items for the teachers next week. Teacher and staff members that have lost items in the mitigation process have created lists with links to needed items. If you, someone you know, or a grant opportunity is able to assist with their replacement, we would be deeply grateful for the support. Teachers and staff will get a sneak peak this afternoon so they can best be prepared of what they need for learning that will need to be replaced. We ask for prayers for a successful transition.

5 minutes	~3 days	Misses important instructions: disrupts morning routine	
10 minutes	~6 days	Can teel rushed, stressed, or fall behind in classwork	
15 minutes	~9 days	May miss key lessons, announcements, or activities	
30 minutes	~18 days	Falls behind significantly; harder to catch up	
60 minutes	~36 days	Major gaps in learning; affects confidence and grades	

WHY IT MATTERS:

- Being even a few minutes late adds up over time.
- Late arrivals distupt both your child's learning and the classroom.
- Consistent punctuality builds routines, responsibility, and confidence.

QUICK TIP:

Set on earlier bedtime, prep backpacks and lunches the night before, and plan for traffic every minute counts!






