 - i. Elementary: School-wide assembly to raise funds and keep active. Family dance will be tomorrow (2/13) from 5 to 7. Pictures available and T-shirts for sale. Links on website have been updated and JOM section on district

- and school websites. Special JOM class from k-4 to do valentine's cards, listen to a legend, and color. The kids were very happy and got to see and know each other. Will have two different classes or go by grade level. The middle school provided a space for elementary students. Will continue to do this monthly to have access to work on their language and have cultural activities.

- iii. High School: Planning college trips (CWU, WSU, PLU). There will be a legislation day (3/10). Expanding course offerings (partnering with Heritage to offer more language courses). Current JOM students playing in Moses Lake. Videos up on our social media. Friday there is district wrestling in Granger. Boys wrestling will be on Saturday. Our girl's wrestling team has expanded over the years. State boy's basketball will be in Spokane (first week of March).
- iv. District: Preparing for the next school year. Will be sending out to staff three calendar options and Board will approve at the end of the month. Staff will vote for a week and the top choice will go to the Board. Ms. Tanewasha asked about adding Treaty Days to the calendar. Will look into our calendar to see when we are out of school. Mrs. Umtuch asked about acknowledging a *Native American Day on 9/26*. Dr. Hart has attended legislative updates to advocate for full school funding. All of athletics come out of Levy and we do not get funded through the state. We have also advocated for Safety Officer funding. Continuing with our professional development days (alignment on math standards). Will continue with ELA.
