HOW CAN PARENTS BE INVOLVED?

- Frequently communicate with your child's teacher (s).
- Request your child's data and details on what interventions are being used for academic and/ or behavioral problems.
- Ask what techniques are being used to monitor your child's progress and the effectiveness of the implemented interventions.
- Ask for explanation of test scores, benchmark testing scores, and progress monitoring scores.
- When possible, make suggestions for strategies or interventions based on what you know works well at home.
- Attend school functions, including parent/ teacher conferences.
- Monitor and assist with your child's assignments.

INTRODUCTION

WHAT IS RTI?

RTI (Response to Intervention) falls under the umbrella of the Colorado Multi-Tiered System of Support (COMTSS). It is the practice of providing high-quality instruction/ intervention matched to student needs and using data to guide educational decision-making. RTI provides an improved process and structure for school teams to design, implement, and evaluate both daily instruction and specific intervention. RTI is a process that focuses on student growth. The goal is to have all students meet their potential academically and social/emotionally.

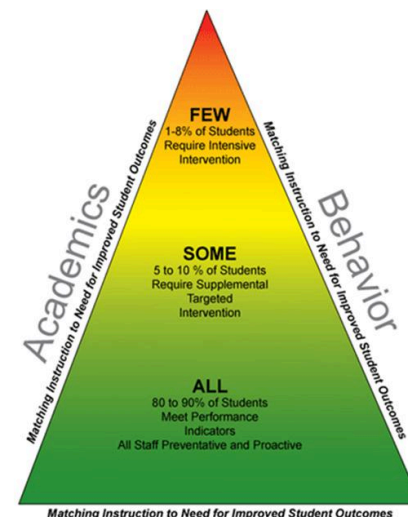
WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF RTI?

- Focuses on prevention, early intervention, and data-based decision making.
- Allows for parents to be informed regarding students' progress more frequently.
- Interventions are evidence based, systematic, and documented.
- Increases and improves all students learning.
- Provides ongoing support and monitoring for all students.
- Interventions are implemented and monitored.
- Promotes trust, collaboration, and shared responsibility for student learning.



WHAT IS THE RTI PROCESS?

RTI is based in the three tiered model which is depicted below:



Tier 1: - Core curriculum- 80-90%

- Whole group/ Core instruction
- For all students in the class

Tier 2: - Small group interventions- 5-10%

- For some students (At-Risk)
- Done in addition to Tier 1

Tier 3: - Intense Interventions -1-5%

- Customized interventions
- For a very small # of students
- Done in addition to Tier 1 & 2
