

## BOARD COMMITTEES

The principles of good board procedure indicate that the use of standing committees is not desirable inasmuch as standing committees set up by any type of board tend to make decisions that are properly made by the entire board, and to assume administrative responsibilities that should properly be delegated to the professional administrator. Therefore, the Board shall have no standing committees.

Special committees, however, may be created for special assignments. Such special committees shall be appointed by the president, subject to Board approval. A special committee shall be dissolved upon completion of its assignment, or it may be dissolved by a vote of the Board at any time.

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
