Roy L. Moore and Aleata M. Moore Scholarship

Roy and Aleata Moore were lifelong residents of Brown County, Kansas. They moved to Hiawatha in 1975 after retiring from a career of farming in the Robinson community. Roy passed away in 1992 followed by Aleata in 1995. In her Last Will and Testament, Aleata established a trust for the award of scholarships for Hiawatha High School graduates. The original scholarship program began with the graduates of 1997 and was in existence for 20 years. In 2016 the funds were transferred to the Hiawatha USD #415 Educational Foundation for the purpose of continuing the tradition of assisting Hiawatha High School graduates pursuing post-secondary educational opportunities.

Scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors of Hiawatha High School who plan to enroll in a university, college, community college, vocational or proprietary school approved by the selection committee. This is a \$2,000 one-time nonrenewable scholarship.

The selection of recipients will be based upon their successful completion of their high school education as well as pursuing a qualified postsecondary educational opportunity.

The selection committee for the Moore Scholarship Fund shall consist of members of the Scholarship Committee of the Hiawatha USD #415 Educational Foundation. The committee will decide annually the number of recipients of the Moore Scholarship Fund and the amount of each scholarship. Selection Criteria

- Recipient must be a graduate of Hiawatha High School.
- Recipient must demonstrate potential success in post high school education or training.
- Recipient must be enrolled as a full-time student (minimum of 12 credit hours) at a college or university.
- If a recipient is attending a vocational or trade school or proprietary school, the recipient must be classified as a full-time student in his or her program of choice. Absent evidence to the contrary a "full-time student" in a vocational, trade, or proprietary school is a student enrolled in a school which has a 180-day school year (1,116 hours per school year) or an average of 6 hours per day of instruction for a school year less than 180 days.
- Applicant must submit a completed application form.

Application Process

All applicants must submit a completed application and required documentation as follows:

- Include a high school transcript signed by the HHS counselor.
- In the case of applicant's request for a scholarship to attend a proprietary school, a completed and signed proprietary application must accompany the application.
- Submit the application by April 1st to the counselor at Hiawatha High School.

Payment Procedure

The total amount of the scholarship award will be paid as one installment directly to the recipient's educational institution for credit toward the recipient's tuition and expenses. Student must provide proof of enrollment by emailing a class schedule, including name of the school, to edfoundation@usd415.org by August 1st.
