A prolific author and consultant, Dr. McDowell is recognized as one of the leading authorities on integrating innovative and impactful practices into schools. Offering keynotes and executive coaching to heads of school around the world, he partners with educational leaders to implement high leverage strategies that will enhance teaching and learning in classrooms, schools, and systems.

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
## ABOUT JEREMY NUNES:

### DR. SHELDON BERMAN

Dr. Sheldon Berman is currently AASA's Lead Superintendent for Social-Emotional Learning after serving as a superintendent across 28 school years in four districts—Hudson, MA; Jefferson County (Louisville), KY; Eugene, OR; and Andover, MA.

He is the author of four books—*Implementing Social-Emotional Learning: Insights from Districts' Successes and Setbacks*; *The Ethical Educator: Pointers and Pitfalls for School Administrators*; *Children's Social Consciousness*; and the *Development of Social Responsibility, and Promising Practices in Teaching Social Responsibility*. He has been a contributor to the monthly "Ethical Educator" column in the *School Administrator* since January 2012.

Dr. Berman served as the President of the Massachusetts Association of School Superintendents and has been a policy leader in three states.

He received the 2003 Massachusetts Superintendent of the Year Award, the 2011 Sanford McDonnell Award for Lifetime Achievement in Character Education, recognition in 2011 by the American Association of School Administrators (AASA) as one of ten courageous superintendents for providing leadership for school desegregation, the Mary Utne O'Brien Award from the Collaborative for Academic Social and Emotional Learning (CASEL) for lifetime achievement in implementing social-emotional learning in 2020, and AASA's Distinguished Service Award for lifetime contribution to the field in 2022.
