





No information may be release to the parent concerning this situation. As a mentor, an appropriate response would be, "I am not able to disclose information about any student related issues."



A parent confides in you that your mentee is picking on her daughter. She asks, "Do you know this kid?" The mentor says, "Yes, I know this kid and you do too. She has red hair and glasses."

Has the mentor broken confidentially?



Yes! The mentor gave personally identifiable information concerning this student. This is a breach of confidentiality. An appropriate response could be, "Due to confidentiality laws, mentors are not permitted to discuss individual students."
