

St. George Harbor Committee

Ensuring access to the working waterfront has long been a priority for this coastal community, and this year we celebrate a milestone achievement with the opening of the renovated Port Clyde Landing. This project could not have been realized without the contributions of so many – the leadership of Select Board members and town managers during the last decade, harbormasters Dave Schmanska and Ryan Cline, Ulbrich family members who sold the property at 10 Cold Storage Road to the town at less than market value, those who helped obtain the federal grant to help fund the project including our federal Congressional delegation, engineers and consultants, and the residents of St. George who voted to buy the property and contribute tax dollars to make it happen.

But this year's annual report is dedicated to the volunteers who spent countless hours wrestling with decisions about every aspect of this project in painstaking detail – from the size, design and configuration of the renovated space, to the number, type and location of hoists, floats, and utilities, what to charge users of the landing, parking issues, meeting with engineers and consultants, traveling to other coastal towns to investigate their landing uses and policies, deciding how to address problems encountered during construction, and reviewing bills and change orders from contractors, engineers, and consultants.

Bill “Shoo-fly” Iliffe

Bill, or more commonly known as Shoo-fly or Shooey, was a fisherman by trade, mainly lobstering. When he wasn't catching lobsters you could find him at the Tenants Harbor General Store, drinking coffee and having friendly conversation with whoever happened to be there.

Bill was a longtime member of the Fire Department and Ambulance. He wasn't one to go running into burning buildings or putting bandages on people, but you could count on him to be at the controls of the fire engine when needed, and he probably had more time driving the Ambulance than anyone else on the service. His knowledge was invaluable. He could run any piece of the Fire Department's equipment and knew exactly where everything was located on the Ambulance. He brought about a sense of assurance whenever he was on scene in any type of emergency.

He served many years on the Harbor Committee, where he was regarded for his knowledge of and insight into the fishing industry and the coastal communities it served. If he didn't know it, he certainly knew someone that did.

Bill was one of those people that made this town such a great place to live. His presence is deeply missed, and always will be.

In Memory of



Sherman “Sherm” Hoyt

Sherm was an educator and an environmentalist who instilled a curiosity in the natural world in his daughters. He extended that impact out to every child in St. George through his involvement with the Town Education Committee, a group that evaluated the education of St. George students and explored opportunities for improvement. Their findings turned into the Withdrawal Committee, which facilitated the withdrawal from RSU 13 and the formation of St. George MSU. He then continued his efforts on the St. George MSU school board. Today, students in St. George are fortunate to attend a cutting-edge community-based school because of the efforts of Sherm and other members of these committees.

Additionally, Sherm was involved in the early days of the Georges River Regional Shellfish Management. Through a thoughtful licensing, and limitations program, including mandatory conservation work, as well as river opening and seeding programs, the GRRSM has successfully managed the shellfish resources that continue to contribute to our local economy, as the shellfish industry has for centuries. Sherm served on the Shellfish Committee for 19 years.

In a further extension of his environmentalism, Sherm was a “regular” at the transfer station and an avid recycler. The transfer station staff recall that he often left with more than he brought in as an attempt to reuse and repurpose. He is, and will continue to be, missed.

Select Board

Planning for our future, protecting our heritage

The Select Board, town boards and committees, the school, and our local non-profit partners are working hard to protect and preserve the natural resources, culture, and historic maritime economy of our community.

The Harbor Committee's decade-long effort to ensure long-term access to the waterfront for both commercial and recreational users will soon be realized with the grand opening of the new Port Clyde Landing in the spring of 2025. The Landing has 2 hoists for hauling seafood harvests, as well as over 40 free parking spots for visitors and reserved spots for commercial users. During the spring and summer of 2025, the town will develop a picnic area in the lot above and to the north of the Landing, allowing residents and visitors to relax and enjoy spectacular views of Port Clyde harbor.

Building on the work of Sebago Technics' Report and the *Mid-Coast Council of Governments' St. George Working Waterfront Vulnerability Survey*, the Resilience Committee continues to plan for infrastructure improvements to ensure long-term resiliency. The Committee has obtained grant funding that will allow us to conduct engineering studies and planning for Cold Storage and Factory Roads in Port Clyde, and has applied for a grant to help us prepare a Climate Action Plan for St. George. This Plan will require input from all of you.

In its two-year effort to develop a Comprehensive Plan to guide town leaders for the coming decade, the Comprehensive Plan Committee conducted three surveys of residents and business owners, interviewed dozens of community leaders, and held public meetings to elicit input from residents about our priorities and concerns. Once approved by the Select Board and the State, the final plan will be shared with the community at a public meeting in the summer of 2025 and submitted to the voters at a special town meeting in the fall.

The Conservation Commission continues to increase the quality and number of opportunities for the public to enjoy the natural bounty of St. George. The Fort Point Trail was improved significantly, including allowing for handicapped access, and in 2024 with a combination of philanthropic donations, grants, and town funding, the town acquired a parcel in the Old Woods Farm subdivision in the village of Tenants Harbor on which trails are being developed. The planning, development, maintenance and fund-raising to make all of this happen is done almost exclusively by Conservation Commission volunteers.

2024 saw the formation of an Emergency Services Committee to monitor the challenges facing our Ambulance and Fire Departments, which are critical services, and provide advice to the Select Board on long-range planning and the considerations for these departments which form the largest part of our town's budget (excluding the school, which represents over 50% of the overall tax burden; residents vote separately on the school budget).

In collaboration with the Herring Gut Coastal Science Center, and the Maine Coast Fishermen's Association, the school, and local restaurants, the town sponsored a series of Working Waterfront events focused on the future of our working waterfront, seaweed harvesting and uses, and cooking locally harvested seafood. Community understanding of our working waterfront industry is critical to fostering tolerance and commitment to the long-term viability of this industry.

The town continues its collaborations with the school to increase workforce training and development through the CTE/Makerspace program, and to explore with the St. George Development Corporation ways in which the town might facilitate increased access to more affordable workforce housing in St. George.

In all, there are 14 town boards or committees, consisting of over 100 volunteers who invest countless hours to improve the quality of life in our town, protect the way of life we cherish, and plan for our future.

Most of the natural and socioeconomic changes that face our community cannot be solved by town government alone and instead require collaboration and resources from all of us - individuals, local businesses, educational institutions, the non-profit sector, town, state, and federal government resources - working together.

We are fortunate to have an energetic and dedicated town manager, Brandon Leppanen, leading these efforts alongside the Select Board. The hard-working town staff keep the town running day to day. The town's new website is a tremendous tool for ensuring that residents can remain engaged and informed and how you can be involved. But the responsibility for our realizing the shared vision of our future rests with all of us.

Planning Board

The members of the Planning Board for 2024 are Alison Wholly Briggs, Jane Brown, Anne Cogger, Anne Cox (chair), Michael Jordan, Richard Moskowitz, and Elaine (Dolly) Taylor. In October, Judi Hyde took over recording secretary duties from Tammy Taylor. We continue to work with Code Enforcement Officer, Terry Bracket, and Clerk, Magan Wallace.

In 2024 we had six site visits, conducted eight public hearings, approved six building permits, two piers, and one subdivision. Additionally, after conversations regarding a seasonal float application and a building permit application in the Shoreline Zone both applications were withdrawn. Of particular note was the proposal for rebuilding the Port Clyde General Store, which had been destroyed in the 2023 fire. The Board also heard pre-application presentations on a few projects, and had several workshops/discussions regarding subdivision regulations, short-term housing issues, and a few specifics regarding Shoreland Zoning ordinances.

Meetings are normally the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month at 7 pm, and are all open to the public, and can be accessed via Zoom.

Conservation Commission

Town and Land Trust Trails and Preserves:

The Conservation Commission creates and maintains trails in St. George in collaboration with landowners, George's River Land Trust (GRLT), and Maine Coast Heritage Trust (MCHT). Information on the trails is posted on the Conservation Commission section of the town webpage and is updated as required to provide trail conditions and closures.

In 2024, 14 active trail volunteers put in a total of 225 hours working on our town trails. A big effort early in the Spring was to create the Robinson Trail. We did this in conjunction with volunteers from GRLT. The Robinson Trail is an out-and-back lollipop-loop trail on the St. George Historical Society property at the Andrew Robinson Homestead.

Maintenance in 2024 included repairing kiosks at Town Forest and Ft. Point trailheads. We also had the usual clearing of blown down trees at most of the trails.

Old Woods Farm Preserve Project:

Old Woods Farm Preserve is an 84-acre property in Tenants Harbor. This property, when open to the public, will offer a 2.5-mile network of trails through marsh, forest and open rock ledges. The Conservation Commission and volunteers expended a significant number of hours working to prepare the preserve for opening in 2025.

Work began in earnest in June with trail clearing and addressing crossings for streams and wet areas. We continued to have many volunteer work days through the end of the year. We expect to officially open the preserve to the public in the Spring of 2025.

The project was partially funded by a grant from Land for Maine Futures (LMF), which covered 50% of the assessed value of the property. The Town and donors provided the remaining funds.

We thank our donors and volunteers that helped make the trail a reality. We hope the trail will be enjoyed by all for many years.

Fort Point Trail Rehabilitation Project:

On June 1, National Trails Day, the Conservation Commission held a grand opening celebration and ribbon cutting for the Fort Point Trail. The Universal Access Compliant Trail begins at the Route 131 trailhead and culminates around the perimeter of the Fort St. Georges Historic Monument. The trail has seen significant use this past year including many families with strollers and those individuals with mobility challenges. The project was largely funded by a Recreational Trail Program grant from the Maine Bureau of Parks and Lands. Town and donor funds and in-kind labor by commission members and volunteers made up the match required for the grant.

Educational Programs:

A series of articles were published in the town newsletter covering the many invasive plants invading the town and taking over our gardens. Each month a specific invasive was highlighted, including how to identify them and ways to get rid of them.

On November 23, a program was held on nighttime light pollution at the Camden Library. The program featured a showing of Defending the Dark, by local filmmaker Tara Roberts, and a presentation on the impacts of nighttime light pollution by Jacob Gerritsen, amateur astronomer and astro-photographer. It was co-sponsored by the Conservation Commissions of Camden, Rockport, Thomaston, South Thomaston, Owls Head, and St. George. The program was attended by over fifty people and was positively received.

Knox County Conservation Commissions (KCCC):

The commission continued to participate in a working group of six local conservation commissions that was formed early in 2023 and meets quarterly. The mission of the group is to share experiences and collaborate on educational events.

Comprehensive Planning Committee

The Comprehensive Planning Committee has met frequently over the past 18 months. The purpose of a Comprehensive Plan is to identify the community's values and priorities, providing a roadmap to guide town leaders in the coming decade. The Plan also serves as critical documentation of our needs and goals for such purposes as State and Federal grant applications.

The Committee has collected input from the community over a one-year period through a wide variety of means. We interviewed over 20 key community members, sought input from all town committees, and launched multiple surveys about a broad range of topics. A preliminary Postcard Survey gathered 105 responses from town members, followed by a survey of St. George business owners that received 19 responses. The most significant outreach effort was the 100-question Summer Survey, which garnered 433 responses from year-round and seasonal residents. Committee members spoke to school groups, held a public meeting on the Comp. Plan process, and even staffed a booth on St. George Days to encourage participation. The underlying purpose of all of this work was to ensure that the final Plan truly reflects the values and priorities of this community.

In addition, the Committee collected and analyzed demographic and other data necessary to inform the Plan and meet state requirements.

Every step of this process has been fully documented and open to the public.

The Committee has been supported by 3 Colby College interns, who received college credit for their work with us, as well as Island Institute Fellow Erin Dent. Our award of an Island Institute Fellow has given the town full-time planning support for 2 years at a much lower rate than hiring a consultant for comparable work. (Erin will work on other planning projects in her second year with us.)

As of the publishing of this Annual Report, the draft Comprehensive Plan is nearly complete, and is undergoing review from town staff and committee members. Once that input has been incorporated, the draft will be submitted to the Select Board for its review and approval, then to the State. Once approved by the State, the Plan will be posted on the town website and hard copies will be available for review at the library and town office. There will be a public hearing prior to a vote on the Plan. This vote will occur at a special town meeting in the fall of 2025.

The Committee has worked hard to prepare a Plan that reflects community sentiment, and we thank all of you who have provided your valuable input. This has been a tremendous effort, but the Plan is only the first step. Realizing our goals for the future of St. George rests with all of us.

Community Resilience Committee

Richard Bates gathered the first Resilience Committee for St. George in 2022, drawing from the good work done by an ad hoc Sea Level Rise Committee and other concerned citizens. With the help of Meg Rasmussen, St. George joined the Community Resilience Partnership, a part of Midcoast Council of Governments (MCOG). Through the Community Resilience Partnership, St. George was given a grant to study local areas of vulnerability in both infrastructure and places of cultural interest. The work was performed by Sebago Technics in 2023 and 2024. Sebago Technics added a great deal of pro bono work to the money provided by the grant and St. George was presented with a report that became a blueprint for areas that will become more and more vulnerable as time and tide progress. Sebago Technics made a number of presentations in town in 2024 and their report is available on the town website. Committee members John Maltais and Richard Bates worked with students at the school to create a presentation for the school's Celebration of Learning. Other work was done in 2023 under Richard's guidance such as the installation of the EV charger at the library and a green energy tour to show how local homeowners and service providers are gearing up to use alternate energy sources.

In 2024, the Resilience Committee completed a list of priority areas for resilience design, repair and possible retreat over time. In January we presented this list to the Select Board and two days later the first of the two devastating January storms made the case for preparation even clearer. Since then the committee has applied for and received a grant from MIAF (Maine Infrastructure Adaptation Fund) for design options for Cold Storage and Factory Roads in Port Clyde; the first two roads on our list as the Select Board was already working on Drift Inn Road. Committee advisors prepared and the committee reviewed a Request for Proposals that went out to a number of engineering design firms in February 2025. Along with So. Thomaston, St. George has applied for a grant to fund a consultant to create Climate Action Plans for both towns. We should hear if we are successful in March of 2025.

The Resilience Committee is an ad hoc committee of the town and we welcome your participation. Either with ideas, questions, and concerns or as an alternate member of the committee. The committee thanks Richard Bates and Leticia vanVuuren for their enormous contributions.

Harbor Committee

First of all, our Harbor Master Ryan Cline continues to perform his duties diligently for the town. He has responded to many calls at all hours of the day and night and has saved the town thousands of dollars by building floats and maintaining the town's shoreside facilities. He also serves on the fire department. Thank you, Ryan.

The Harbor Committee is happy to report that the new Port Clyde Landing is essentially complete, and will be ready for use during the 2025 summer season.

The project, which had its start in 2014, was planned to connect the current town landing with the former St. George Marine property to create a single facility that doubled the amount of usable space. It provides additional space for recreational and commercial users, a safer traffic pattern and more parking in a highly congested area.

Once the plan was approved by local, state and federal regulators, and with the assistance of our Congressional delegation, we were able to obtain a \$4.8 million grant. When combined with the \$2.6 million bond approved earlier by the town, the winning bidder, CPM, began construction.

During the construction, the Committee spent many hours working with our consultants, CPM, and the town's administration resolving unforeseen engineering issues, change orders and other details. The project is also under budget. A green space/picnic area is being planned for the upper part of the lot overlooking the harbor.

The Committee wishes to thank everyone who contributed to this project, particularly those whose assistance was critical to its success. First and foremost, the taxpayers of St. George. The many Select Board members and their respective Chairs: Richard Bates, Van Thompson and Jane Conrad. Town Managers, John Falla, Tim Polky, Rick Erb and Brandon Leppanen. Harbor Masters, Dave Schmanska and Ryan Cline. Select Board representatives to the Committee, Randy Elwell and Van Thompson. Our Consultants, Noel Musson and Greg Johnston. Our Congressional delegation: Senators, Collins and King, and Representatives, Pingree and Golden. Our DMR Commissioner, Pat Keliher.

And finally, to the Harbor Committee members, past and present. Two members, Glenn Hall and Bill Illife, passed away during this project. They, along with our current members, Dave Schmanska, Bill Mroz, Ben Norton, Carl Danielson, Peter Henderson and Hale Miller have all contributed hundreds of hours of their time and energy.

We all shared a vision that this project protected, not only the public's access to St. George's most important asset, the Atlantic Ocean, but our heritage working waterfront as well. We hope this project will help to make St. George a better place to live, work and play for our future generations.

Budget Committee

The Town of St. George's Budget Committee is a group of dedicated volunteers from around the community who advise the Select Board on the town's annual budget and other financial matters. The committee brings together volunteers with diverse backgrounds and experiences which contribute to the financial wellbeing of the town. We understand the burden that taxes are on every family in the community and we do not take that lightly. Our committee aims to be transparent and available to answer questions and listen to community member needs. We are excited about the incoming town website which will allow this committee to continue to collaborate closely with the Town Manager and staff to encourage more clarity and communication through the budgeting process in the future.

The committee strives to find the delicate balance between a town that has everything it needs to thrive and keeping property taxes as low as possible. St. George has a broad spectrum of citizens: old and young, richer and poorer, from here and from away. That means funding all of the town community members from the multi-age programs at the library and school to the new ambulance department. It is a challenging endeavor that we take seriously.

The municipal portion of the town's expenses are about one third (37%) of the total tax burden, with the largest percentage of expenses (52%) coming from the St. George Municipal School and an additional percentage (11%) coming from the town's contribution to the county's budget. The committee recognizes the advantage of keeping town wages competitive to support having continuity in our excellent employees at all levels. Wage increases are mostly policy driven (based on existing Select Board policy). In addition to wages, some benefits such as health care costs are outside of the Budget Committee's control. New equipment costs are often prioritized to protect the safety of citizens or of the employee using it. We find those expenses necessary for the benefit of a healthy town workforce.

In 2024 the Budget Committee met quarterly to review actual expenditures to what was prescribed in the annual budget and took those reviews to the Select Board. As expected, our Town Manager, Financial Director and department heads continue to use their funds responsibly and any small questions about those expenses were easily resolved. We also held several additional meetings to work with the Town Manager on developing a municipal budget for presentation to the Select Board for fiscal year 2025-26.

Looking forward we will continue with our quarterly review work and respond to Select Board requests to examine other aspects of the town's finances, such as investment portfolios, reserve savings, and more. The work is meaningful and interesting. If you enjoy finances and have time to volunteer for the town, please consider joining us for a meeting to see if you would like to participate as we need a new alternate member. HEART & STRENGTH

After 10 years, much about our district has changed, but the core of who we are remains the same. St. George Municipal School Unit (MSU) is a community school district and the **heart and strength** of our district is the town of St. George. Our students, families, teachers, school staff, community members, civic and town organizations, and local businesses – the people of St. George – are the **heart** of who we are, what we do, and where we're headed.

This report brings together a variety of voices to tell the story of our school district. To begin that story, we thought it only appropriate to hear from our students. This February, Ms. Wilgus's and Ms. Beal's 3rd grade classes interviewed students and asked them, "What makes St. George School special?" Ben Lord, a 7th grader, explained,

I think that our school is really, really special because we do lots of different things in it. I feel like most schools around the world just don't really have the chances we do. Even though it might not be the biggest school or might not have the most classes, we really put our time into those classes and we really put our time into extracurricular activities. **We just have lots of different options to make us feel wanted in this school** and it's really, really great.

Fifth grader Grace Wall, asked the same question, said,

What makes this school special is the people that are inside of it because they're really nice, like your friends and teachers. And **you're the luckiest person alive if you get to go to this school**. Before, I was not the luckiest person alive because I did not get to go to this school. But now that I'm at this school, I realize how good it is and never want to leave.

These sentiments echo a response given by a 1974 St. George School alum in a survey that asked alumni what made their experience at St. George special,

It was such a small close-knit school community and I loved my teachers.



Caring. Engagement. Connection. Community. Over the decades, the heart of our school has remained rooted in the same core values. You can **hear it** in the voices of our students and alumni. You can **see it** when you visit classrooms. You can **feel it** when you walk in the door.


MISSION

Our mission is to do whatever it takes to ensure that every single student thrives and to contribute to the vitality & resiliency of the Town of St. George. We focus on students' **academic growth, character development, and health/wellness**. We recognize that health/wellness – which we define as students' physical & mental health, social-emotional well-being, and food security & basic needs – is a prerequisite for academic growth and character development. Finally, we believe that **for a student to thrive** – to demonstrate mastery and find meaning in education – **they must share their learning in ways that positively impact their community**.



DEMOGRAPHICS

St. George MSU serves **304 students in PreK-12** with **207 students attending PreK-8** at St. George School. **Ninety-seven students in grades 9th-12th** enjoy high school choice and attend Camden Hills Regional High School (54), Oceanside High School (17), Lincoln Academy (20), Medomak Valley High School (5), and Wayfinder (1). No matter where our students go to high school, they remain St. George students. **Once a Dragon, Always a Dragon!**



IMPACT

Standardized tests are one measure of student growth. Although the data they provide are limited to a narrow snapshot of students' ability on a particular day and time, we use these data points – along with many others – to assess students' growth in the areas of **academics, character development, and health/wellness**. Some positive data points showing growth and achievement include:

- **State Assessment:** As measured by last year's state assessment, about **70%** of St. George 1st-8th graders were at or above grade level in Reading and Math.
- **Academic Growth:** As measured by the NWEA Measure of Academic Progress, our 1st-8th grade students' growth in Reading and Math **EXCEEDED** the national average.
- **Special Education:** The number of PreK-8 students receiving special education services **DECREASED** from 55 students last year (2023-24) to 46 students this year (2024-2025).
 - o Over the past year and a half (Fall of 2023 through today), **20** students have been **dismissed from special education** because interventions worked and they no longer required services.
- **Early Intervention:** Since we started our PreK Program three years ago, **47** four-year olds have received high-quality, play- and nature-based instruction focused on social, emotional and intellectual growth.
 - o 46% of the 2023-24 PreK class qualified for special education. Today, as Kindergarteners, that percentage has **almost been cut in half** with only **24%** receiving special education services.
 - o 44% of the 2022-23 PreK class received special education. Today, as 1st graders, it's **down to 18%**.
- **Growth Mindset & Teacher Relationships:** On an assessment of **growth mindset**, 3rd-5th graders scored in the **90th percentile nationally**. The same assessment measured the **connection between students and teachers**; 3rd-5th graders scored in the **99th percentile**.
- **Inspiring Educators Across Maine:** This fall, **20** educators, administrators, and school board members from across Maine spent the day at St. George School to learn about our PreK-8 Career & Technical Education programming and the CTE/Makerspace Project.
- **Rural School Design Community:** St. George MSU was selected from a large applicant pool of districts from across the nation to join the third Rural School Design Community, which brings together visionary school districts to design learning experiences that meet the needs of all students.
- **FastForge Hackathon:** In October, **6 St. George high school students** traveled to Boston to compete in the first annual FastForge Hackathon. Students worked alongside marketing, AI, and business professionals to design, prototype and pitch a consumer product. Our students, working almost nonstop from 8 a.m. – 6 p.m., came up with a cutting board that would weigh and store ingredients as you prepare a meal.



BUDGET & FUNDRAISING

Each year, we approach the budget with three priorities: (1) improve student education, experience, and outcomes; (2) increase the district's fiscal sustainability and resilience; and (3) contribute to the vitality of the Town of St. George. This year (FY25), the total PreK-12 budget is \$7,642,231. Of that total, about **70% (or approximately \$5 million) is in two cost centers: Article 1 – Regular Instruction at about \$3.3 million and Article 2 – Special Education at \$1.7 million.**

- Article 1 (Regular Education) includes grade level and unified arts (e.g., Art, Physical Education, Music & Band, STEAM, and World Language) teachers and educational technicians, curriculum, field trips, classroom supplies & equipment, programs with partners such as the Apprenticeshop and Camp Kieve, and high school tuition.
- Article 2 (Special Education) involves all costs associated with special education such as teachers and educational technicians; occupational therapy, speech, and counseling services; and specialized curriculum, assessments, equipment, and supplies. High school special education tuition (which is charged in addition to regular education tuition for students who receive services in grades 9-12) is also found in Article 2.

Over the past ten years, most of the district's budget increase has been in response to the rising number of students with severe needs. Especially in the earlier grade levels, we are seeing many more students who require intensive services such as specialized programming delivered in a different setting, occupational and speech therapy, counseling services, 1:1 support throughout the day, and behavior support programs. Most of these services are provided through the special education program, thus Article 2 (Special Education) has grown much faster than any other cost center. Districts across the state and nation are facing similar challenges – rapidly rising special education costs in response to growing student needs, especially among the youngest learners (PreK-2).

However, there is hope – our early intervention and special education programs are working. As noted above, because of the dedication and talent of our educators; the PreK program; reading, math, and behavior interventions in PreK-2; and a world-class special education program led by Dr. Jessica Berry, **students' needs are being met, they are being dismissed from special education, and the number of students receiving services is dropping!** Next year (FY26), we're **anticipating special education costs to remain the same or decrease.**

Finally, we are constantly working to **raise money through grants and donations** so we can provide programs for students while reducing the impact on taxpayers. We have **raised over \$4.6 million for the CTE/Makerspace Project**, which will cover the full cost of construction and provide additional funds for personnel, programming, equipment, and supplies. Through the PreK Pilot Program, we'll bring in over \$180,000 this year in state funding for 3- and 4-year-old special education services. Over the past few years, the St. George School Fund has disbursed tens of thousands of dollars for innovative projects such as the 6th- 8th Apprenticeshop Program, a 5th grade trip on Monhegan Boat Line to study puffins, and 1st graders building wooden bird feeders.

SCHOOL BOARD – VOICES & REFLECTION

A school board plays a critical role in shaping the vision, work, and character of a district. For the past decade, St. George MSU has been led by school board members who not only believed in the mission of our district, but also did the work necessary to help us realize that vision. The original School Board in 2015 included Bill Reinhardt, Jennifer Garrett, Margot Kelley, Sherm Hoyt, and Terry Driscoll. Today, Jeniffer Garrett is the Chair of the Board and serves alongside Kristin Falla, Emily Chadwick, Mallary Tripp, and Chris Polky. Below, each Board member talks about their experience on the board and what drives them to do this work.

Jennifer Garrett, Chair
Connections & Community

The positive moments for me all have to do with **connections with other people**. I am fortunate to serve on the Board with other members who have a lot of energy, expertise, and really care about our school. I was able to participate in the beginning school workshop day on Allen Island and the Thanksgiving Celebration at our school. There were a number of volunteers who helped set up tables, bake pies, and wait on staff and students and clean up. The students made cards of thanks for the staff and many said what a fun day it was. I have had an opportunity to mentor a student a couple of times a week, and it is **great to walk into a school where you feel welcomed by the students and the staff**.

Kristin Falla, Vice Chair
Building a Future Rooted in our Past

It's hard to believe my journey with our municipal school district dates back nearly 15 years. **I was part of the St. George Town Education Committee (TEC)** as the recording secretary well before we became our own independent school district. Fast forward all these years and I'm about to complete my second three-year term on the school board, and seeking a third.

The independence and do whatever it takes vision that came out of the TEC is what still guides our community school and district today. During the TEC process, St. George community members shared a variety of thoughts, but one issue continued through the years – a desire to have trades-based education back in St. George School, like the shop and home economics programs provided by the **Lilius Grace Institute**. It's those community voices that helped build the inspiration of the St. George CTE/Makerspace building project.

To date we have raised over \$4.6 million for the building and project. The funds were raised through community support, private donations, grants, and federal funding. It was our objective to privately raise the construction funding, so it would not impact the district's budget and taxpayers. Construction began last spring and is on target to be completed by this summer and **the building will be open to students when they return to school this September!**

Our St. George CTE/Makerspace project has generated so much excitement in our school, community, state and across the country. Our goals are to

- **Re-engage students in their learning** through hands-on/ minds-on, technical learning connected to career & community;
- Ensure students have the academic, technical, and social-emotional skills **to thrive in today's workforce** and create the jobs & industries of the future; and
- Build a **more diversified and resilient local economy** that supports a thriving year-round community.

As we approach the opening of the CTE/Makerspace Building, our district continues to focus on planning for and improving the overall St. George School facility. Our aging building is facing substantial HVAC repairs so we began reviewing our long-term options. We recently completed an energy audit and were **awarded a School Revolving Renovation Fund award to upgrade the school's HVAC system**. St. George MSU received the largest SRRF award in the state this year – a **\$1.9 million no-interest loan, of which 30% (or about \$584,000) will be forgiven**. The new system we're installing will use VRF units, heat pumps, and advanced controls to improve efficiency and even provide cooling! Other school improvements include more energy efficient lighting, replacing the school's walk-in cooler, and paving the upper and lower parking lots.

Mallary Tripp
Wellness, Early Childhood, & a Community that Cares

As a member of the St. George MSU School Board, I have had the opportunity to be involved in various committees and working groups within the school community. Two of the most active groups I am a part of are the **Wellness Committee** and the **Early Childhood Working Group**. I would like to highlight some of the work I have had the privilege of being a part of so far this school year and how I believe it has **enriched the lives of our students, staff and community**.

During the first half of this school year, I took part in several events or initiatives aimed at staff wellness, supporting the needs of students and creating community events that foster the strong connections vital to making St. George MSU the school that it is.

In August, with the Early Childhood Working Group, we planned a **Back to School Bash**. This event was aimed to bring our students and community members together before the start of school and celebrate the year ahead. We provided free haircuts for students, new school supplies and backpacks, licensed car seat checks, and information on programs for students and families run by Jackson Memorial Library and Child Development Services. We had several of our newly hired staff attend the event to meet families and students for the first time. From the free haircuts, to the car seat checks, to the setup of the tent - **all was made possible by members of our community who volunteered their time to help get children prepared to go back to school**.

In November, the Wellness Committee hosted a traditional Thanksgiving meal where **staff and students sat side-by-side and enjoyed a family-style Thanksgiving**. The meal was served by administrators, School Board, parents and community volunteers. We had volunteers cover recess duties, bake pies, wash dishes, set tables and help to create decor for the event. To say this was a community event, would be to put it lightly. It was a wonderful thing to see our **students sitting alongside their teachers and school staff with big smiles** enjoying a piece of homemade pie.

In December, the **Early Childhood Working Group hosted our first annual Night Tree event**. This event was aimed to kick off the holiday season for our community and spread some cheer in a way that **could be enjoyed by community members from ages 0-99**. We provided materials to create animal friendly ornaments that could be hung on trees after following a lighted path through the forest. There was popcorn and hot cocoa served by DragonHeart volunteers and St. George MSU staff. Middle level and high school students helped to light the way with lanterns and flashlights. Despite the very cold night, **our community showed up in strong support for our students and families**. It was a special night enjoyed by all!

During Christmas break, I worked alongside administrators, parents, and community volunteers to clean out and **redecorate our staff lounge. This was a Wellness Committee project aimed at supporting our wonderful staff** by providing them a relaxing, clean and organized space to gather with one another for meals, a break or a meeting. The room was repainted, furniture was donated by various community members and the cupboards were stocked with snacks and coffee.

I have seen first-hand the positive effects of having a school so tightly linked to their community. Our community cares, which in turn **creates students who care** and are invested in their learning and eventually how they will one day be a part of this community. **Our community cares**, so we **have staff that feel supported** in their work and encouraged to meet the needs of every student. They know the work they do every day is making a positive impact on children and thus the community as a whole.

Being able to leverage local resources to support students' education and development is exactly what the CTE/Makerspace program will promote, ultimately contributing to a stronger more supportive community over all.

Despite the many changes in education from when you and I were in school, St George has remained consistent and true to their belief that community is everything.

Local Plumbing Inspector

The Plumbing Inspector is responsible for reviewing Subsurface Wastewater system designs and permitting them along with reviewing Internal Plumbing permit applications and permitting them. There is a mandatory 2 inspections for a septic system, however that can easily become 3 inspections or more, if the septic tank gets put in at a different time. Internal Plumbing permits also require 2 inspections. One for the rough-in and the other after the fixtures have been installed upon completion. I am very willing to discuss with you questions or concerns regarding your plumbing or septic system. The Internal Plumbing comes under the Uniform Plumbing Code and Septic Systems fall under the Subsurface Wastewater Disposal Rule 10-144 of Maine Rule Chapter 241.

Code Enforcement Officer

This has been a busy year for the Planning Department. We are seeing more permit applications for Heat Pumps and Solar. Permits are required for all building projects including Heat Pumps and Solar, both roof mounted and ground mounted.

While St. George has not voted to accept the International Building Code (IBC), it is a state-wide accepted code in Maine. This means all structures, both new and additions, must be built to the International Building Code. The State of Maine is now using the 2021 version of the IBC.

We have been using IWORQ, a computer generated Building and Plumbing Application program for a couple of years now. It is pretty popular with contractors and is gaining popularity with our residents.

St. George EMS

In 2024, we continued to provide 24-hour paramedic coverage. Throughout the year, we responded to 325 emergency medical calls in the town of St. George. We responded to South Thomaston 96 times to provide ALS care in support of their crew. 56 times we responded to calls for non-emergency services to the community or to assist other departments such as the Fire Department or Sheriff's Office.

2024 brought updates to our Community Paramedicine Program, including the approval of a grant which allowed for the purchase of a CP-vehicle and equipment purchases. We performed 209 Community Paramedicine visits.

We are proud to share that many of our providers have pursued further knowledge and training, advancing license levels and gaining new certifications. These members include: Katie Jacob, Hannah Sisk, Ryan Colson, Shawn McBrien, Rebecca Doyle, Noah Carlson and Taber Twitchell. Many others not listed here have also expanded skillsets. We consider ourselves fortunate to have such a dedicated crew.

We want to thank you, St. George residents, for the support we received in our first year as a Town Department. We are grateful to the Town Office staff and Town committees for helping to make the transition as smooth as possible. Our goal in 2025 is to continue working together to provide high-quality emergency services, to bring the continued growth of existing programs in St. George, as well as the implementation of community-education events and classes.

We would like to express our greatest appreciation to Amy Drinkwater, who served as the EMS Director in St. George, both for the Association and the Town, for over a decade. Our service wouldn't be where it is today without her many tireless years of dedication. She was influential in supporting many St. George providers who have since "licensed up," thanks to her encouragement. Thank you, Amy! We wish you the best on your next endeavors.

Parks and Recreation

It is with great pride that I have the opportunity to present the 2024-2025 town report for the Parks and Recreation Department for St. George. With just 5 months under my belt as the director, I have been utterly overwhelmed by the support from my fellow town employees and the members of our community. This report is organized around the main sections the department oversees from February 2024 to January 2025. These sections include: youth programming, senior programming, and community and adult programming.

Youth Programming:

During the fall our soccer programs offered teams for grades 5th/6th and 3rd/4th. For our 1st/2nd graders, we offered an intramural program with a focus on fundamentals. We had two teams for 5th/6th, three teams for the 3rd/4th, and averaged 30 participants in our intramural 1st/2nd-grade program. This was a welcomed increase in numbers from the previous year.

Basketball season was a success with considerable improvements in each age group. We had one boy's 5th/6th-grade team, one girl and one boy's 3rd/4th-grade team, and averaged 30 athletes for our 1st/2nd grade intramural programming. Spring softball and baseball season included teams for: tee-ball, farm league, and little league softball and baseball, also referred to as Majors and Minors.

Thank you to our volunteer coaches and referees for all your time and dedication. Without your assistance, these programs would not see the success they do. Animal Control Officer

In 2024, as St. George Animal Control Officer, I received 62 animal calls for service. Around 50% were dog complaints, 25% cat complaints, and 25% farm animals/wild animals or birds. Most cases involved loose or lost dogs.

In 2024, there were two dog bite and two cat bite cases. Both cat bites involved feral cats (one was hit by a car and injured), so please do not attempt to pick up feral cats and use extreme caution dealing with injured animals. One dog bite was an out-of-state dog whose owners rented a cottage for a week and the dog got loose.

I took five dogs and three cats to Pope Memorial Humane Society.

There were no confirmed rabies cases in St. George in 2024. I took one cat to the Augusta State Lab for testing.

I received multiple complaints at one address regarding the welfare of farm animals and dogs.

I picked up a couple dead birds and deceased cats for disposal.

I warned people on dogs at large, dogs not being licensed, and dogs barking.

I also reached out to several people regarding the welfare of their dog(s) being left outside.

I aided in looking for lost dogs on a couple of occasions.

I let residents borrow a Havahart Live Cage Trap to try to catch their missing cats. I advised those residents not to leave the trap out during the night due to wild animals going into the trap. If they did catch a wild animal, they would have to remove the animal themselves, or hire a professional. As Animal Control Officer, I only handle domestic animal complaints involving pets or farm animals.

Anyone that has a complaint involving wild animals should call the Maine Warden Service.

Any complaints involving water species you should call the Maine Marine Patrol.

Any complaints involving birds go to Avian Haven out of Freedom, Maine. They have volunteers in the area.

If you catch a skunk/raccoon/fox, etc. in a Havahart Live Trap, it is your responsibility to release it, do not call me.

Lincoln Academy

To the Residents of St. George,

Thank you for your continuing support of Lincoln Academy, an independent school serving students from midcoast towns since our founding in 1801. The school is thriving thanks to our supportive community, vibrant and diverse student body, and hardworking faculty and staff.

Lincoln Academy “By the numbers”

- Total 2025-26 enrollment: 587 students
- 18% of juniors and seniors attend vocational programming at BRCTC
- 22% of students take one or more AP classes
- 25% of students qualify as low socioeconomic status (SES)
- 44% of LA students play at least one sport
- 20% participate in band, choir, and/or theater programs
- 5% of students are in alternative education programs

Enrollment: 587 students from 23 towns and 18 countries are currently enrolled at LA, with our current ninth grade class size exceeding last year’s predictions. The incoming Class of 2029 is expected to be larger than the graduating Class of 2025, so we anticipate total day student enrollment to grow again next year. Our dorm will soon be at full capacity with 50 international and domestic students in residence, contributing income to the overall school budget.

Academics: Lincoln Academy offers 135 classes, including over 40 STEM classes, more than 30 Performing and Visual Arts classes, 33 Advanced Placement (AP) and honors classes, and 11 vocational certificate programs through the Bath Regional Career and Technical Center (BRCTC).

Athletics: In 2024 LA sports teams won conference championships in wrestling and boys tennis. We had four KVAC Coach of the Year awards, two Good Sportsmanship awards, and school records broken in several sports. Individual athletes won KVAC and state championships in wrestling and track and field. The boys basketball team made it to the Class B South Regional Finals for the first time since 1989.

2024-25 Facilities Upgrades: We are thrilled with the bell tower repairs completed by alum Robin O’Brien ‘93 and his team. The bell was rung at Homecoming in September, 2024 with nearly two hundred alumni in attendance. We replaced three HVAC units in the Ryder Science Wing, upgraded our fire alarm system for the entire campus, overhauled and modernized the electric panels in the original building, and replaced the sound system in the gymnasium. We installed new lights on the turf field and the Boosters donated a new speaker system as well as a refresh and upgrade for the indoor fitness center.

Of the 132 graduates in the class of 2024:

- 81 enrolled in 4-year colleges
- 36 enrolled in 2-year colleges
- 15 entered the workforce

Two members of the class were National Merit Semifinalists and 45 were AP Scholars. Graduates were awarded over \$375,000 in scholarships through school endowments and local, statewide, and national foundations.

Performing Arts: The theater program staged a production of Macbeth in the fall of 2024. 13 musicians (including band, choir, jazz, and orchestra) qualified for All-State music festivals, while 45 qualified for District III Honors music festival.

Faculty Credentials: 57% of Lincoln Academy faculty have their Master's or other advanced degrees

Career Preparation

- The 3rd Annual Peter J. Benner Job Fair was held in April 2024 and included 30 local businesses with immediate openings for employment. We also invited 8th graders from AOS 93 schools as well as seniors from Wiscasset High School to join us for the job fair. The 4th Annual Fair is planned for April 2, 2025.
- Through the Community-Based Learning Experience (CBLE) program, students have the opportunity to learn about a profession and gain valuable work experience, academic credit, and sometimes hours towards a professional certification. In 2024 17 students worked with 13 businesses, and we are planning to increase this number in 2025.
- Lincoln's online Jobs Board connected dozens of students and recent graduates with summer and year-round jobs at local businesses and organizations.

Accreditation: Lincoln Academy is accredited by the Maine Department of Education and the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). In 2024 we completed our 10-year accreditation process, which involved an extensive written report and two site visits. This process involved the entire faculty and staff in a reflection process, and the final report details long-term goals for the next decade.

Jackson Memorial Library

The Jackson Memorial Library (JML) continues to grow and serve the community of St. George not only as a center for learning and enrichment but as a center for activities for children, adults and volunteers. In addition to books, electronic media, computers and information services, we offer space for people to come together for programs and meetings, places to chat, and quiet areas for research and study. We have also worked hard to expand our outdoor opportunities, including our hoop house, community gardens, playground equipment and Story Walk.

2024 has been a busy year for Jackson Memorial Library. We had 15,608 visits. We loaned out 7,824 books. The interlibrary loan program obtained 193 books for our members.

Library director Sharon Moskowitz started The Power of Play, a nationally recognized program designed for our youngest patrons (infants to four years old) last year. The focus is on exploratory, sensory, and literary needs of this group. It has met with great success.

JML continues to provide library services for St. George School. Our halls are abuzz with energy and curiosity as the students make their weekly visits to take out books and learn how a library operates.

For adults, we host a weekly tech time, Mahjong, Cribbage, French, Book Clubs, Knitting/Crafts, Men's group, Qi Gong exercise, Cooking and Literary Series. We continue to offer free Wi-Fi high speed computers, and use of a printer and copier for a small fee. This past year, through a generous donation and a grant, 2 EV-charging stations were added. We offer the only EV charging station open to the public on the St. George Peninsula.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Alice Gorman who is stepping down from her many years of coordinating the Literary Series which has been highly successful. The Summer Literary Series will be continuing with programs being held at the Jackson Memorial Library.

As we ended 2024 our Library Director Miss Sharon announced her retirement, effective June 2025. The JML Board of Directors has started the search for a new director. A challenging position with lots of opportunities.

All our services at Jackson Memorial Library are made possible by town support, individual generosity and other fundraisers, and years of careful stewardship of the JML endowment. It runs smoothly thanks to Sharon Moskowitz, Library Director, Rebecca Olson, Administrative Assistant, and our 58 volunteers, spearheaded by Connie Hammermeister. If you are interested in volunteering or serving on a Library Committee, please let Sharon or Connie know. Remember, we are open 6 days a week!

2024 was a banner year for the St. George Historical Society! Along with the overwhelming support of our local community and beyond, we continued to preserve, present, and display the deep, thought-provoking backstory of St. George.

Our year was filled with presentations, tours, and open houses that engaged hundreds of former visitors and newcomers alike. Topics ranged from teaching and learning days at the St. George Annex in the 1970s and 80s, tales of Sea Captain Anders Anderson, the former Hocking Granite Quarry in Clark Island, complete with a tour of its more recent designation as Wheeler's Bay Wildlife Sanctuary, and first-hand accounts of the history of lobstering and its challenges moving forward. On a hot, humid July afternoon, the Historical Society Museum held its first annual Open House, where close to 90 attendees enjoyed snacks, socialized, viewed exhibits, and made connections with other historical societies. Our season wound down with a talk on local music and dance venues from our past, then in September an engaging and well-attended tour of Mosquito Harbor and Donut Point, both in Martinsville. The 2024 season came to a close at our annual meeting in October at which officers were elected for 2025.

Our monthly open houses enthralled the masses at the Andrew Robinson Homestead, some of which are now annual events, such as the Tea, Fiber Arts Day, Arts In the Barn, and our ever-popular Apple Day in October. We also enlightened participants with a display on St. George history, and tempted the taste buds with a Harvest Day, where crops from our ARH community garden and other local veggies were roasted and enjoyed by the public. A description of our ARH season would not be complete without mention of the many delicious theme-inspired snacks and treats prepared by our volunteers and enjoyed by visitors each month.

The Schoolhouse Museum was open on several occasions and hosted inquisitive school groups. One student quote that comes to mind is, "This place is AMAZING!". We hope to make some interior improvements at the Schoolhouse this year. After a challenging winter of catastrophic storms, Marshall Point Lighthouse and Museum continued to pull in thousands of visitors from around the U.S. and the world. Marshall Point has always been and will always be a popular destination! Stay tuned as 2025 will surely offer something for everyone at our four venues.

Many thanks to all those who continue to donate and loan items that enrich our collections. We now have an expert Collections Committee that is working diligently to digitize and catalog our ever-expanding inventory of artifacts. An example is the tireless work put into the Watts Family Collection that is now complete and available online. The Jim Skoglund Collection is being thoroughly sorted and will be digitized for the public to enjoy. Please consider donating or loaning items to us to scan and enter into our archives. At the end of 2024 we had 226 people on our membership list, 535 email subscribers, 1,200 Facebook followers and 1,000 likes! Our website saw 6,401 visits, which included 648 in the last month. Word continues to spread about all the great things we are doing.

The St. George Historical Society Museum was open 10 to 2 on Saturdays from Memorial Day weekend into early October. In addition to the same Saturday schedule in 2025, we hope to have regular Wednesday hours from 9 to noon. If the open flag is flying, come on in! Please continue to look on local media, Facebook, and our website at stgeorgehistory.com for program schedules and updates. When you visit our website you can make purchases, pay dues, and make donations. Donations are our main source of revenue for meeting our operating expenses and investing in future endeavors. With your help we achieved this year's fundraising goal of \$25,000!

Once again, thank you for your continued support in helping the St. George Historical Society thrive. As we continue to preserve and protect history that would otherwise be lost, please join us in-person or online. As we navigate through a lease process with the town that will hopefully give us longer lease terms and a clearer path forward, we ask for your assistance by contacting local officials to reinforce the value we bring to St. George and beyond as we enter our 45th season!

The Marshall Point Lighthouse and Museum



This year's report is dedicated to the memory of Craig Parsons, Assistant Curator and Longtime Volunteer.

I want to thank the Town and especially Steve Jarrett for making timely repairs to the upper part of The Marshall Point Access Road, clearing off all the rocks and debris tossed up on the lawn, reestablishing the 4' foot of shoreline lost and assisting in the repair of The Fisherman's Memorial. All this damage was caused by the devastating January storms. As you know, the structures(piers) supporting the Walkway to the Lighthouse were also severely compromised and the Walkway remains closed. Engineering specifications for the repairs have been created and a Request for Proposals (RFP) had been issued by the Town. The deadline for submission of bids passed with some interest but no concrete bids for the repairs were received. That process has now been given to Gartley and Dorsky, the Town's engineering firm to administer. FEMA has viewed the damage and their estimated cost to repair the Walkway, \$90,000 has been submitted by the Town to them along with other Town storm-related costs. It was my fervent hope that a contractor could have been found, and the repairs made this early spring by Memorial Day. At this point, it looks like the repairs will have to wait till this fall. Stand by!

The 2024 season started off slowly with an intermittent number of visitors but finished strong in September and October. We saw 22,000 visitors this year, about 1,000 less than our record breaking 23,000 last year. I'm not sure if it was the economy or the fact that the Walkway was closed and the "Forrest Gump Fans" couldn't reenact his run. Visitors came from all 50 States + DC, Puerto Rico & the Virgin Islands. Our International Destination status continues and we saw visitors from 36 countries Turkey, Argentina, New Zealand and Macedonia were among those on the list.

Our Gift Shop had a solid year, with new inventory choices under the leadership of Kellie Myracle, our Gift Shop Manager. We look forward to more new items this year!

Volunteers are our life's blood and I am appealing for more of you to consider joining us, as age and attrition are taking a toll on our ranks. 52 dedicated volunteers under the direction of Jan Dougal, our Volunteer Coordinator, staffed our Museum and Museum Shop this year. It's a fun and rewarding experience, as you meet visitors from all over. Most important, we can accommodate your schedule. If you have some free time, please contact Jan at 603-801-3471 to join our diverse group.

We continue to give back to our community through our Annual Scholarship Program, administered by Michael Hagenbach, Scholarship Chair. First year awards are **\$1,000** followed by a **\$500** award upon completion of each successive college year. **Class of 2024: Mark and Betsy Bartholomew Memorial Scholarship - Lelani Myers - Camden Hills High School, David Percival Scholarship - Ella Cushman - Camden Hills High School, Lorraine Hupper 2 year Scholarship - Brian Mattox - Oceanside High School.**

Class of 2023: \$500 Scholarship for continuing their studies Margaret Gill, Willow McConochie, and Lydia Myers. **Class of 2022: \$500** Scholarship for continuing their studies Anna Kingsbury, Audrey Leavitt & Liam O'Neal. The MPLH&M Committee is proud to be able to dedicate a portion of our income, investing in our students.

We are asking the Town to renew our lease with a 20-year lease instead of a 10 Year term. This lease must be voted on by you, the Voters, at the Town Meeting in May. The premises are under the care of The St. George Historical Society and are administrated for the Town by their Marshall Point Lighthouse & Museum Committee. **We encourage you to support this lease as it is key for us continue to Display and Preserve our Town's Heritage.** Since 2011 the MPLH&M Committee, per the lease agreement, has spent over \$300,000 in repairs and improvements to the premises. The funds for these projects are generated by museum shop sales, donations, rent, bequests and other miscellaneous sources of income. We are just finishing up replacing the old wooden gutters and had found large areas of wood rot. This planned project was in preparation for the scheduled maintenance of painting the Keeper's House this summer.

We rely heavily on **DONATIONS from YOU, our Supporters** to carry out our mission. We do not charge admission to the Museum and our only paid staff are our bookkeeper and seasonal Museum cleaning person. Georges River Regional Shellfish Management

Georges River Regional Shellfish Management was established as an Interlocal Agreement in 1996 for the conservation of waterways in which shellfish are harvested in the towns of Cushing, South Thomaston, Saint George, Thomaston, and Warren.

Rainfall is a big factor in water quality, as it brings pollution off the land into the brooks that run into the rivers and ocean. With that being said, every town has to educate the residents on picking up dog waste and taking care of other animal waste like horses, cows, poultry, etc.

We were able to get Four Winds Housing Development in South Thomaston, which has a healthy biomass (clams), open this year. Testing Site 34 in the Bay needs to be monitored and make sure the people living in the cottage put in a leach field as human waste was found with DNA testing this summer. A few other areas around Georges Island were opened up this year.

In the last five years G.R.R.S.C. has spent 25,000 in DNA testing. A lot more testing is needed, but lack of help makes it hard to get more areas done. I've been talking with DEP about Byron's Brook in Thomaston about pollution coming from the brook. We met with DEP on December 20th to look over Byron's Brook. We'll probably need monthly testing for a year on top of what we have already done to establish a pattern of pollution.

Due to the pollution, Georges River will need a lot more work on the upper half of the river as we have lost from Hospital Point to almost Smiths Cove from January to June.

Overall, water scores seem to be improving slowly. There are 5,980 acres of a very fragile ecosystem within the five towns. The GRRSM is committed to conservation of this precious resource.



Our drivers are volunteers who live or summer in St George, and who generously donate their time and the use of their vehicle for this purpose. In return, they get to meet new neighbors and hear interesting stories.

This year we want to highlight our Driver Coordinators Susan Vaughan and Dave Percival, and for the first part of the year, Suzanne Hall. These folks provide tremendous support for our new and seasoned drivers. They meet with new drivers and review our policies and procedures and provide materials that they will need to do their rides. The DCs continue to keep in touch with all drivers and become the drivers' go-to person for information and problem solving. Hats off to these folks for a wonderful job!

In late spring, on a bright and sunny evening, folks gathered for our first food event held at Blueberry Cove Camp. The sun was shining on the water and supporters got together for a feast of glorious food prepared and served by generous local vendors at reduced cost. Our thanks also go out to the Stephen and Tabitha King Foundation for their substantial grant for the purpose of this event. It was a great success.

On Labor Day, we again gathered at the St. George School parking lot for a free concert for about 125 people. Entertainment was generously provided by Adam Ezra, leader of a Boston-based Americana band, who recently moved with his family to Martinsville. It was another beautiful day and a good time was had by all.

St. George Community Sailing Foundation



The nonprofit St. George Community Sailing Foundation was founded in 2001 to teach sailing and seamanship to young people on the St. George peninsula. The summer of 2025 will be our twenty-fifth season! Hundreds of children have had the opportunity to enjoy the thrills and challenges of sailing over the past twenty four years through St. George Sailing. We operate from Blueberry Cove Camp, sailing in and around Tenants Harbor.

During the 2024 season we enrolled 86 children overall, including thirty through our partner Blueberry Cove Camp. Local children have access to reduced rates and scholarships that make sure that sailing is available to everyone, as we are a community sailing program. Sixteen percent of our sailors in 2024 were St. George residents. Other sailors come to us from surrounding towns, the summer community, through grandparents who live here, and via Blueberry Cove Camp.

Casper Dicke, a long-time summer resident and student at Duke University, was our Head Instructor in 2024. He was ably assisted by US Sailing Level 1 Instructors Oskar Dicke and Liam Kinsella, and Junior Instructors Will Rice and Evy Elbana. All five of these instructors started sailing with us as young children and worked their way up to being employees. We ask a lot of these dedicated young mentors, and we are very proud of the work they do through the summer teaching the art of sailing in a safe and fun way to a new generation of sailors.

Sailing is a great way to get outdoors, to learn about winds and tides, and to explore our beautiful coast. St. George Sailing receives no money from the Town, but we are a community asset. Tuitions cover about half of our costs. The balance is covered through generous donations from friends, neighbors, and businesses who believe in giving our children the chance to experience the challenges and rewards of sailing. St. George Community Development Corporation

In 2024, the St. George Community Development Corporation continued to serve as a resource for organizations and volunteers pursuing initiatives that help keep St. George a vital, vibrant, year-round community. We seek to strengthen community infrastructure by supporting and partnering with existing organizations, by leading projects that support economic and community development, and by increasing access to education, healthcare, and workforce housing. Our work complements the services provided by the Town, the St. George MSU, and other local nonprofits, churches, fraternal, and community organizations.

The central aim of the Community Development Corporation is making the lives of our neighbors better and more sustainable. One way we do that is by ensuring people are well-nourished, especially in this time of rising food prices and rising need. The Community Cupboard now provides high quality food and hygiene products to approximately 50 families of St. George each week, and our Friday Free Fresh Market, where we share excess produce and other extra items from the Cupboard, is available to the whole community.

In 2024, our enthusiastic Night Kitchen volunteers prepared 800 meals at Blueberry Cove for distribution through the Cupboard. Families in need received heating assistance, gas cards, emergency funds, winter coats, and holiday gift support. And again this year, we provided free and low-cost dental care, including cleanings, assessments, and sealings for 24 children and 36 adults, some of whom had not had dental care in years.

Two of our new volunteer-led programs saw significant progress this year: Woodchuckers and Welcome Lil' Dragon. Already, our community wood bank has sourced, chopped, and donated 20 loads of wood to residents of St. George. The Welcome Lil' Dragon baby box program provides essentials and toys for newborns in our community and information and support for their caregivers. So far, 13 families have participated, receiving items ranging from diapers and outlet covers to hand-made hats, blankets and teddy bears created by talented St. George residents. And this year our Wellness Studio hosted free or low-cost programs like yoga, strength training, youth programs, and mindfulness classes for over 100 residents of all ages.

Housing has been a growing area of focus for us. The Community Home Repair program continues to work with residents to make critical repairs and safety upgrades. In 2024, our collaboration with Habitat for Humanity helped a family move into the rebuilt home at 40 Long Cove Road. And, even more exciting, the St. George Sustainable Housing initiative has taken a big leap forward. We acquired 30 acres on Route 73 near Jones Brook to develop significant workforce housing. Surveying and pre-development work has begun and we look forward to sharing more detailed plans for this new community as they evolve.

We continue to sponsor programming that brings the community together, like the annual Thanksgiving and Easter meals, which provide both sit-down and heat-and-serve to-go meals for hundreds of residents. In the summer months, the "Summer in St. George" bulletins help increase visibility for the many programs sponsored by local businesses and organizations. And beginning this year, we helped support the continuation and expansion of the much-beloved St. George Days.

We work in collaboration with partners and the community, acting as a fiscal sponsor for the St. George School Fund, the St. George School CTE project, Neighbor to Neighbor, the Midcoast Community Band, and Port Clyde Strong. And we see new partners and programming on the horizon, including opportunities to expand local childcare, adult education, and workforce development and training.

None of this would be possible without the hard work and support of our generous neighbors. We accomplish so much because over 150 community members volunteer their time and talents. Together, we are running programs, developing new opportunities, sharing meals, feeding our neighbors, and increasing our impact. We are deeply grateful to the Town, local organizations, and generous donors who help support these myriad efforts. This is a community invested in its own success.

The St. George CDC works to be accessible to all, sharing updates via email newsletter, Facebook, our website (www.stgeorgecommunity.org), through periodic postal mailers, in-person public meetings, and at our offices located at 47 Main St. in Tenants Harbor. Dear Friends:

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate, and I welcome this opportunity to share several key accomplishments for our state from the previous year.

As Vice Chair of the Appropriations Committee, I have secured nearly \$580 million for 230 projects across all of Maine's 16 counties to promote job creation, workforce training, and economic development; expand access to health care; support law enforcement; improve public education and infrastructure; and protect our environment. As the new Congress begins, I am honored to be taking the helm of the Committee, the first Mainer to do so in nearly a century, and I remain committed to ensuring that federal spending produces real results for our state and nation.

Maine has the oldest average age in the country, which is why I have long prioritized health-focused legislative efforts. There were more than 1,860 health care bills introduced during the 118th Congress. Only 15 health care bills were signed into law, and I was a lead sponsor of five of them. These bills will enhance care for individuals with Alzheimer's, autism, and substance abuse issues through improved research funding, strengthened public health programs, and increased support for rural first responders.

Another important bill that I coauthored was the Social Security Fairness Act. Since 2003, when I led the first-ever Senate hearing on the Windfall Elimination Provision and the Government Pension Offset, I have sought to end these provisions of the Social Security Act that unfairly reduce the Social Security benefits that public employees or their spouses have earned. I am pleased to say that with the passage of my bill, the Social Security Fairness Act, in December, public sector retirees will now receive the full Social Security benefits they have earned.

When the Maine way of life was under threat, I was certain to defend the interests of our state. I worked to protect Maine's potato farmers when the Department of Agriculture tried to reclassify the potato from a vegetable to a grain. I thwarted efforts to consolidate USPS mail operations at the Hampden postal facility, which would have disrupted mail delivery throughout our state. I sounded the alarm with leaders at the FBI and Departments of State and Treasury on the spate of illicit marijuana growing operations that are destroying properties and providing refuge to foreign criminals in our state. Following damage to our working waterfronts after last winter's storms, I secured \$15 million to help fishing communities recover. I championed funding to support the Maine Air National Guard base, Bath Iron Works, and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard.

As of last December, I have cast more than 9,100 consecutive votes, continuing my record of never missing a roll-call vote since my Senate service began in 1997. My ranking as the most bipartisan Senator reflects Maine's tradition of working with a spirit of cooperation and respect.

One year ago, our state was reeling from a series of unprecedented winter storms. Thanks to the efforts of local, state, and federal officials, we're starting to rebuild. The Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Small Business Administration approved more than \$10.7 million in federal assistance for Maine households, businesses, and homeowners in the months following the storms. In addition, Maine received a \$69 million grant from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration to support the climate-resilience goals outlined in *Maine Won't Wait*. In 2024, \$1.7 billion in federal grant funding came to Maine - encompassing everything from conservation efforts and home-heating assistance to resilient infrastructure and affordable housing. We also helped thousands of constituents file for work permits, veterans benefits, and passports, and wrote countless letters of support on behalf of our constituents.

I'm so proud of what we achieved in 2024, and I'm fully committed to building on those accomplishments in the 119th Congress. As ever, my team and I are ready to assist however we can. ARTICLE 8. To vote by secret ballot to enter into a lease of the property located at 178 Marshall Point Road (Marshall Point Lighthouse) with the St. George Historical Society.

Note: The property will be managed by the Marshall Point Lighthouse Association which is a subset group of the St. George Historical Society. The lease will be a 10-year term with the ability for the Select Board to renew for an additional 10 years. Upon the signing of the lease the lessee agrees to pay the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar and is responsible for the maintenance of the property as detailed in the lease.

ARTICLE 9. To vote by secret ballot to see if the Town will accept the gift of properties and structures currently owned by the St. George Youth and Scouting Council.

Note: The properties consist of two parcels of land located off of Wallston Road with an estimated combined acreage of 32.45, as well as a parcel located at 171 Snows Point Road which is a 8.5 acre lot with a 2,275 sq ft building that was built in the year 2000.



Except that the Municipal Officers shall use the special sale process required by 36 M.R.S. § 943-C for qualifying homestead property if they choose to sell it to anyone other than the former owner(s).

ARTICLE 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board, on behalf of the Town, to sell and dispose of personal property owned by the Town.

ARTICLE 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to carry forward and lapse certain municipal budget balances as of June 30, 2025.


ARTICLE 25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board to spend funds up to 15% of the Unassigned Fund Balance as of the end of the most recent fiscal year to cover the cost of vital supplies, equipment and other items found lacking and needed for the protection of health, life and property during a proclaimed emergency.

ARTICLE 26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select Board, in its discretion as to reasonable terms, to enter into multi-year contracts. Said contracts shall no exceed three years in duration.

ARTICLE 27. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Select Board, in collaboration with the Cemetery Committee, to adopt policies, procedures and set prices regarding the operation of the town-owned Seaside Cemetery.
