Mission and Values

‘Ohana Mālama Hours - MHPCS Parent Participation Policy

- 10 hours per ‘ohana per semester; 5 hours per single parent ‘ohana per semester
- Must sign in on the day of service to receive credit for Mālama hours
- Mālama Hours may include kula cleaning, classroom support, fundraising, event support, etc.
- Parent participation is expected in school-wide fundraising (Chicken Sale and Benefit Fundraiser). There are a variety of ways to participate, but participation is required.

Diverse Learning Opportunities at Mālama Honua Public Charter School

Our family understands that MHPCS is a Hawaiian Culture focused, ‘āina (land) based learning program. This entails students getting into school vans and having opportunities to swim, work in the lo‘i (taro fields), loko ‘ia (fish ponds), kula (farmable lands), uka (mountain lands), interact with animals, as well as learn in and on the ocean. While the school, its staff, and partners will take all the necessary safety precautions and require parent approval with necessary waivers before participation, these activities have inherent risks. Our family further understands that questions or concerns will be directly communicated with the school- Kumu and administration and NOT with community partners. The school will work with the family and the community partner to find a resolution to ensure all parties' safety and well-being.
