Annual Cleaning and Maintenance Shutdown

The Westlake Recreation Center will be closed for its annual maintenance and deep cleaning from Monday, Aug. 4, through Sunday, Aug. 10. During this time, front desk staff will be available for business transactions only from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., Aug. 4–8. While our indoor pools remain closed for renovations through August, members can access the Rocky River indoor pool, except during its closure from July 21–Aug. 3. During that brief window, Westlake Recreation Center members may use the Westlake Aquatic Center (no guests permitted). From Aug. 4–10, members can enjoy gym and fitness center access at both the Rocky River Civic Center and Fairview Park Gemini Center—membership key fob required for entry, and guest access is not permitted. Updates on Parkside Athletic Fields

The City of Westlake Recreation Department is excited to announce that construction is underway on the Parkside Athletic Field Complex, with completion anticipated in September 2025. This much-anticipated project will feature two premier artificial turf fields designed for full-size football and soccer games, with flexible lining options to support a variety of age groups and competition levels. The complex will also include a new playground, picnic shelter, and a combined concession and restroom facility. These upgrades reflect key priorities identified in the Parks and Recreation Master Plan and are made possible thanks to resident support of the recreation levy. Once complete, the complex will provide more opportunities for youth sports, community gatherings, and healthy outdoor recreation for all ages, while enhancing neighborhood connections and supporting active lifestyles across Westlake.
