


#### **HCPS APP**

**ELEMENTARY & MIDDLE** 

#### No Personal Wireless Devices Permitted

All wireless devices must be powered off or in airplane mode during the entire school day, beginning when they arrive on campus, including passing periods and lunch.

#### **HIGH SCHOOL**

All wireless devices must be powered off or in airplane mode during the school day, from bell to bell, unless authorized by teacher for instructional purposes.

## STEWART WIRELESS POLICY


