8:10	Doors open. Students report directly to the classroom.
8:10-8:30	Breakfast available
8:35	School begins, announcements are given.

3:30	Afternoon Announcements
3:35	Dismissal for Bus 1, 5 & 12 Riders; Car tag and Office Pick ups
3:40	Dismissal for Bus #2-4, 6-8, 10-11 Riders & Latchkey Students

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DOJO DISMISSAL REQUIREMENTS

When placing any dismissal change, all required information must be within the message or it will not be granted or confirmed.

Bus Information to include:

- *Bus #
- *Address
- *Name of person to be at the drop off location

Office Pick Up Information you must include:

- *State that it is Office pick up and the date
- *Name (First & Last name) of the person picking up your child

Car Tag Information to include:

- *Your child's Name
- *Child's Car tag number

If there are siblings, you must copy and paste the message into each child's individual dojo.

- Meeting with a teacher, you must have a scheduled appointment at the teacher's discretion. Reach out to the teacher via Dojo, e-mail, etc.
- Dropping off items for students must be dropped at the front office. Items must have the student's name and your child's room number

UPDATE YOUR STUDENT INFORMATION

- Take time to review the Parent/Student Handbook
- Update phone numbers, addresses etc. with the front office staff as they occur.
- Keep your student PICK-UP form up to date with the names of persons you approve to pick up your child(ren).
- **Always make sure ANY PERSON picking up your child has their Driver's License as it is required and will be checked.**

A.M. STUDENT CIRCLE DRIVE CAR DROP OFF PROCEDURES

- Pull all the way around the circle drive to the sign
- **NEVER PULL AROUND ANY VEHICLE!**
- You should be prepared for your child to exit the vehicle upon stopping
- **DO NOT** stop midway around the circle drive
- Remember there are others behind you ready to stop, drop, and pull away
- Remain in your vehicle, only your child should exit
- Staff members are on duty at 8:10 am to see your children into the building

VISITOR REQUIREMENTS

- **You MUST have a valid government issued ID (Driver's License)**
- You will be required to scan your Driver's License when signing into the Raptor Kiosk
