#### **FALL & FESTIVE**


After lessons on Fall Crops, Ag Natural Students decorated ACTC for Fall! Thank you for your hard work, it looked great!

#### AGRICULTURE POWER & MACHINERY










#### **HEALTH SCIENCES**


#### HEALTH SCIENCES

## aCIC Teacher of the Year

This Fall, ACTC Faculty & Staff voted Mr. Rodney Fagan the 2023-2024 Teacher of the Year. Mr. Fagan is the Agriculture Power & Machinery Instructor. Since taking over the program in the 2022-2023 school year, he has sparked a revival of the Ag Power Program within the center and his students. His excitement for his program, students, and learning is evident. When asked about his time at ACTC, Mr. Fagan said, "I just have a passion for Career Tech Education and love what I do..." ACTC is proud to highlight Mr. Fagan as our Teacher of the year.





In the Summer of 2023, Mr. Fagan applied for and received a \$25,000 grant with Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce to start a wild hog trapping program. Since receiving the grant, Mr. Fagan and his AG Power Students have used the funding to purchase materials and equipment needed to build traps to begin their hog trapping program. The program will work in partnership with landowners to train and trap wild hogs causing issues on farms and to property. Mr. Fagan hopes this new venture will teach his students the importance of working in partnership with landowners, customer satisfaction, as well as serving for our community.
