

# Hesperia High School 2024-2025 Cheerleading Constitution

### **General Tryout Information**

#### **Eligibility:**

- Any incoming freshman, sophomore, junior or senior is eligible to tryout and be placed on either team JV or Varsity. All cheer candidates must tryout
  in order to make the team. Being a member of the HHS Cheerleading squad one year in no way guarantees placement on the squad/team for the
  following year.
- Cheer candidates must be cleared through Athletic Clearance PRIOR to attending Tryouts, including the Tryout Practice Dates. (Visit scorpioncountry.com for Athletic Clearance Registration details.)
  - a. If the candidate is not cleared, they are not eligible to participate or tryout and therefore not eligible to make the team.
  - b. Returning members that have already completed this process this year do not have to redo it.
- 3. Cheer candidates must be CIF GRADE ELIGIBLE. CIF Grade eligible is a minimum grade requirement enforced by the California Interscholastic Federation for all high school athletes and therefore exceptions cannot be made. In order to be CIF Grade Eligible, you must be passing at least 4 classes with a minimum of a 2.0GPA. Grade clearance will be double checked once the candidates are selected
- 4. Cheer candidates must submit pages 9 and 10 of this packet signed by a parent/quardian and the candidate
- 5. Cheerleader should provide <u>3 Teacher Evaluations</u> forms as they will be added into the Cheer Candidates Tryout score. They are to be filled out and signed by the Cheer Candidate's current teachers or coaches and <u>TURNED IN by April 4, 2024</u> at the latest.

#### **Tryout Details:**

- Candidate must be cleared through Athletic Clearance PRIOR to DAY 1 of practice in order to participate! Please allow a few days to receive clearance candidates should complete and submit all necessary forms, including physicals, the week <u>prior</u> to tryouts at minimum! Physicals must be dated from May 2023-present. IF YOU RECEIVED A PHYSICAL ANYTIME IN THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR, DO NOT GET A NEW ONE BEFORE TRYOUTS! (All students will be required to get a new physical for the 2024-2025 school year, and that physical will have to be dated after May 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2024!)
- Cheer candidates will be taught all necessary tryout material during the three practice days on April 2, April 3, and April 4 from 4:00 6:00pm in the Hesperia High School Gymnasium. Tryout material includes at minimum:
  - a. One Dance (with counts and with music)
  - b. One Cheer
  - c. Kicks and Jumps Toe Touch, Double Toe Touch, Jump of your choice
- 3. During the three practice days, candidates should wear:
  - a. Comfortable school-appropriate workout attire that allows the candidate to jump, kick, and move without restriction
    - Low cut tops, midriff tops, baggy shorts which reveal undergarments, short-shorts (less than 3" inseam) or briefs, or "revealing" practice wear will NOT be permitted.
  - b. Lace-Up athletic tennis shoes
  - c. No jewelry, including any facial or body piercings are allowed (due to safety).
  - d. Hair must be pulled back into a ponytail, and should not fall into your face.
  - ANY CHEER TEAM ATTIRE IS NOT PERMITTED!
- 4. Tryouts will be CLOSED to all spectators, family, and friends. No cameras or videotaping equipment will be permitted without permission.
- Tryouts will occur on FRIDAY April 5th beginning at 4:00pm in the Hesperia High School Gymnasium. Candidates will be given their tryout time on the final practice day. Candidates will tryout in groups of no more than 4. Candidates may select their group members.
- 6. Candidates must arrive at least 15 minutes prior to their tryout time. Candidates are encouraged to arrive even earlier in order to warmup and practice. Tryout organizers will be available to assist candidates with practice/preparation beginning at 3:00pm. Candidates are free to leave after they tryout.
- 7. ONLY tryout attire will be permitted on tryout day. If the cheer candidates are not wearing the correct tryout attire, candidate may not be allowed to tryout.

  Tryout Attire is as follows, NO EXCEPTIONS!:

- a. No jewelry, including any facial or body piercings are allowed (due to safety).
- b. Plain Black Athletic Shorts (no writing or design permitted)
  - i. School appropriate no briefs, short-shorts, baggy shorts which reveal undergarments, or other inappropriate attire
- c. Plain White T-shirt (no writing or design permitted)
  - i. School appropriate No low cut tops, midriff tops, or undergarments showing.
- d. Plain white or Black Socks (no knee-high permitted)
- e. Lace-Up athletic tennis shoes
- f. Hair must be pulled back into a ponytail, and should not fall into your face. Members are encouraged to wear a bow.
- 6. Cheer candidates will be assigned a tryout number prior to the day of tryouts to keep anonymity and fairness among judges. This number will be safety pinned onto the front of the shirt the day of tryouts. Team placement will be announced by tryout NUMBER, so it is very important that the candidate remembers their number after they tryout.
- 9. Cheer candidates will be evaluated by a panel of judges. This panel includes 1-6 judges. Placement on team will be determined by a final score and announced by tryout numbers. Scores will be determined by combining points from jump/skill execution, flexibility/tumbling skills, performance cheer execution, dance routine with possible introduction execution, spirit/rally, observations and the attitude displayed by the candidate throughout the week.
- 10. COACH DECISIONS ARE FINAL. All scores and professional opinions of the judges will be kept private and WILL NOT be made public.

### **General Information / Rules for Participation**

#### I. Scorpion Cheer Philosophy:

A Hesperia High School Cheerleader should first and foremost be a leader on campus, in and out of uniform. They are expected to represent Hesperia High School to the highest degree by having outstanding sportsmanship, and a positive, helpful, friendly and respectful attitude. Cheerleaders should lead their peers in school spirit by attending multiple campus and community events. Hesperia High School Cheerleaders are held to a higher standard of excellence, requiring them to have excellent time management skills, excel in their academic work, and maintain positive relationships with their teammates, coaches, peers and school staff.

#### II. Purpose

It is the purpose of the Hesperia High School Cheerleaders to:

- 1. Promote school spirit and leadership
- 2. Represent Hesperia High School to the highest degree.
- 3. Set an example of good behavior at all times, in and out of uniform (in class, games, school, etc.)
- 4. Promote sportsmanship between members of the squad, all HHS athletes, and opposing teams at all times.
- 5. Participate in <u>all</u> cheerleading squad activities including but not limited to: fundraisers, unity meetings, pep rallies, practices and performances.
- III. Eligibility and Responsibility of Team Members: The Hesperia High School Cheerleading Coaches do not discriminate on the basis of sex, race, creed or religion. This is an equal opportunity activity for those students who meet and follow the rules and requirements of the ILILS. Cheerleading Squad. All students interested in becoming cheerleaders are encouraged to participate in the tryout process.
  - i. All Members Must Tryout
    - i. Varsity and Junior Varsity teams are open to all grade levels.
    - ii. EVERYONE is encouraged to try-out; including returner candidates, new candidates, and candidates from previous seasons who left/were dismissed from the team. Being a member of the H.H.S. cheerleading squad one year in no way guarantees placement on the squad/team for the following year.
    - iii. Selection for team will be based upon a final score. JUDGES/COACHES DECISIONS ARE FINAL. All scores and the professional opinions of our judges will be kept private and will NOT be made public.
  - 6. Grades: A 2.0 GPA with no more than two "Fs" is required for tryouts and must be maintained throughout the year. Failure to maintain this academic standard (quarters and semesters) will result in immediate dismissal from the squad. All Cheerleaders are expected to carry a full class load of at least four on campus classes. Home school students are not eligible for cheerleading.
    - i. A GPA of 1.99 or below will result in immediate dismissal from the team. Having more than 2 F's at the end of a grading period will also result in immediate dismissal from the team.
    - ii. If a team member has a D or F in any class, they are required to turn in weekly progress reports until the grade is a C or higher. In addition, the team member is encouraged to attend morning tutoring until the failing grade is up. After school tutoring should only take place on non-practice days.
    - iii. IT THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE TEAM MEMBER AND PARENT/GUARDIAN to remain aware of the team members' grades/G.P.A.; if a team member is dismissed due to grades, it is the responsibility of the team member to inform parent/guardian, not the coaches.
    - iv. There is no refund/dismissal of any payments if the team member is dismissed due to grades.
  - c. Athletic Clearance:
    - i. Complete the necessary clearance forms of Athletic Clearance prior to tryouts
      - 1. Go to scorpioncountry.com
      - 2. Select "MENU"
      - 3. Select "ATHLETICS"
      - 4. Follow the provided information for Athletic Clearance Registration
    - ii. Provide and maintain a current physical for the duration of the cheer season (1yr)
      - 1. Current physical must have been completed AFTER May 24, 2023.
      - 2. Please note: all members will have to receive a physical AFTER May 23, 2023 for the upcoming cheer season.
    - iii. This should be done the week prior to tryouts to allow a minimum of two work days to receive clearance!
  - d. Students who fail to uphold the minimum requirements of State and C.I.F. eligibility will be dismissed from the team immediately.

#### IV. ATTENDANCE: Team Members are to attend/participate at ALL IIHS Scorpion Cheer Functions. Included but not limited to:

a. Summer practices (A summer calendar will be provided at the earliest convenience.) Due to the importance of building a new team, only 2 practices will be allowed to be missed over summer. Please plan vacations around the cheer calendar.

#### b. Regular Season Practices

- 1. The cheerleading season is YEARLONG and includes fall, winter, and spring quarters.
- Cheerleaders will be placed in 6th period Physical Education, and will receive P.E. credit. The purpose of this class is to
  eliminate the majority of after-school practices. Cheerleaders will practice every day in 6th period, but may also have after
  school practices.
- 3. Cheerleading is considered a TEAM sport. By working in stunt groups, when one member misses a practice or game, the entire stunt group is affected and sometimes cannot perform.
- 4. Cheerleaders are allowed to miss a maximum of 5 practices. ALL ABSENCES MUST BE PRE-APPROVED/Coach must be notified PRIOR to the absence! Once a member has missed more than 5 unexcused practices, they will not letter (Varsity) and will be dismissed from the team.

#### A. EXCUSED ABSENCES:

- a. A Dr.'s/Dentist's note or a full-day absence from school with Attendance Office verification and clearance are the only valid excuses that will be accepted and will not be counted towards your 5absence limit.
- b. A school activity, such as Drama/Choir/Spring Athletic Team practice or performances, will not be counted towards your 5-absence limit if it is pre-approved by Coaches with a note from the event teacher/instructor.
- Absence due to death in the family will be excused by a parent phone call/written note/email.

#### B. UNEXCUSED ABSENCES:

- a. An absence is considered unexcused when a team member does not notify coaches prior to missing the practice, does not have the proper documentation, or does not have a valid excused for missing, including but not limited to: tardiness, transportation, lack of material knowledge, incorrect attire, homework, after-school jobs, babysitting, etc.
- b. It is the team member's responsibility to manage time efficiently and keep coaches informed.
- The coaching staff understands that there are "family emergencies" that arise; However, please be considerate of the team when deeming/calling family emergencies. A family emergency is still considered an unexcused absence.
- d. If a team member misses a practice unexcused, she/he will be benched for a portion or all of the following game/performance/event. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 5. If a cheerleader misses a practice, excused or unexcused, they could not perform in that week's performance.
- 6. Practice Schedule A calendar will be provided via Google Classroom at the earliest convenience.
- Location: Practices are held in the Dance room, cafeteria, gym, and/or on the field and are CLOSED practices (no friends and/or family are allowed, unless prior notification/approval is given)

#### d. Games (HHS Athletic programs): ALL GAMES ARE MANDATORY!

- 1. ALL team members are required to be at any scheduled game/event which includes but is not limited to: football games, basketball games, wrestling matches, select cross-country meets, baseball, soccer, volleyball games, and CIF events
- 2. This includes: set-up and tear down/clean up. Team will not be dismissed until all tasks are completed!
- Cheerleaders are suggested to arrive 5-10 minutes early. Cheerleaders must be fully dressed with jewelry removed at the designated start time or will be considered late.
- 4. If C.I.F. games are scheduled, this might call for extra practices/games/events outside of the normal cheerleading schedule. You will be notified of this itingrary/schedule of events as soon as possible.
- 5. Games and Events may require travel over Fall Break, Thanksgiving Break or Spring Break

#### 6. Performances, Events, Pep Rallies, Spirit Week, Decorating the School, and/or other Select Public Appearances

- ALL team members are required to be at any scheduled performance/event to which includes but is not: Back-To-School Night, Oak Hills Bonfire Night, Pep Rallies, before school events, decorating the campus, Relay for Life, Elementary School Reading Night, Woman's Day, Great Hesperian Workout, etc. In order to promote school spirit, team member is required to be in the assigned uniform/attire along with participating/dressing up during spirit week.
- Cheerleaders must be present and involved in any times set aside to prepare team posters, prepare "goody" bags for athletes, stadium and school decorations, tailgates, carnivals, etc.
- f. Tutoring: School-wide tutoring is available in the morning and should not interfere with practice time.
- Injury: Team members on a medical/injury leave/suspension or on disciplinary or academic suspension are required to attend and dress for all practice games, events, and functions unless prior approval is given ahead of time by the coach and documentation had been provided. Not attending will count as an unexcused absence.

#### h. TARDIES/LATE:

- 1. If a team leader is TARDY (under 5 minutes) to a practice, he/she will be required to condition after practice and could possible by benched for a portion of the following game/performance/event.
- 2. If a team leader is MORE than 5 MINUTES LATE without reason, he/she will NOT be allowed into practice, which will be marked as an unexcused absence against the team leader.
- 3. If a team leader is LATE or TARDY to a game/performance/event, he/she will be required to condition after the game/performance/event and could possible by benched for a portion of the game/performance/event.
- 4. Arriving unprepared/dressed will result in being marked tardy or late and will have consequences.
- 5. Arriving tardy/late 3 times will count as one unexcused absence.
- 6. Repeatedly arriving late or tardy could ultimately result in dismissal from the team.

#### i. LEAVING EARLY: Leaving practice earlier than the dismissal without approval from coach

- 1. If a team leader leaves earlier than the dismissal time unexcused, he/she will be required to condition after the following practice and could possible by benched for a portion of the following game/performance/event
- 2. Leaving early 3 times will count as one unexcused absence.
- 3. Repeatedly arriving late or tardy could ultimately result in dismissal from the team.
- j. BEING BENCHED: If a team member is "Benched", they will be required to sit out of dance/cheer performances, including quarter and/or halftime performances. However, a cheerleader may still be required to stunt during the performances in order to not affect other team members. Members may be benched for reasons that may or may not be laid out in this contract, and at the discretion of the HIIS Cheer Coaching Staff.
- k. EMPLOYMENT: Squad Members are encouraged to have employment/job. Squad Members are to notify employers of practice schedule, games dates, camp dates, performance dates, fundraiser dates, etc. Work is not a valid reason to miss practice. Squad Schedules will be given out in advance in order to minimize any schedule conflicts.

#### DISCIPLINES, SUSPENSIONS AND DISMISSALS ARE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE HHS CHEER COACHING STAFF

#### V. COSTS/PAYMENTS OF TEAM MEMBERS

#### A. UNIFORM/EQUIPMENT

- a. All team members will be wearing a school issued uniform. Members may also be issued equipment, such as cheer boxes. Upon checkout, the parent/student is responsible for its care and will be responsible for any costs due to damage/wear and tear to the school issued items. Cost of uniform or any other rented items ranges from \$20.00 \$1,200.00.
- b. Students do have the option to purchase their own uniform, though the cost of the uniform will be applied to the cheerleaders account and cannot be ordered until full payment has been received. Uniform ordering takes up to 8 weeks, therefore acknowledgment of uniform purchase and payment should be placed as soon as possible. \*Please note: the uniforms may/may not change throughout the following years
- c. UNIFORMS MUST BE RETURNED at the end of the season. If a member quits/is dismissed, they have one week to return their uniform. Not turning in uniforms will result on the member being placed on the debt list, which will result in the member not being allowed to attend school events such as dances, as well as a withhold of transcripts and diplomas.
- d. A COMPETITION UNIFORM will need to be purchased by athletes on the comp team, which is optional for sideline cheerleaders. FUNDRAISERS WILL BE OFFERED TO COVER THIS COST

#### B. SPIRIT PACK COSTS

- a. Spirit pack items vary depending on team placement, previous year placement, etc. A complete breakdown will be sent home upon candidate being placed on a team. Spirit Pack items include but not limited to camp/practice wear, spirit wear, appropriate cheer shoes, team bows, backpacks, sweatshirts, warmups, Activities Card, etc. The Activities Card is the last item to be purchased from the Spirit Pack, therefore the spirit pack must be paid off for students to attend any school events.
- b. Specific detailed information will be sent home after the candidate is placed on a team.

#### C. CHEER CAMP

- a. Hesperia High School coaches are waiting on further details before booking a camp. Currently, the team is leaning towards an AWAY camp through United Spirit Association. If we move forward with this camp, it will take place July 28-30<sup>th</sup> and will cost \$550.00 per athlete. Final camp determination will occur by May 25<sup>th</sup> at the latest.
  - i. Varsity members and Junior Varsity members are ALL required to attend camp.

#### D. COMPETITION

a. Competition fees are NOT included initially. Additional fees will have to be fundraised and/or paid. Members will be able to opt out of competition if needed.

#### E. PAYMENT SCHEDULE

- a. All spirit pack items are ordered within the first few weeks of making the team so candidates have them for practices and prior to camp. Therefore, payments must be collected as soon as possible, since the money is spent right away.
- b. The payment schedule represents the MINIMUM amount of money due. Payments CAN EXCEED the minimum amount due to pay the account off sooner.
- c. Currently, payments INCLUDE the price of an AWAY CAMP. This may change if camp changes!
- d. Female Junior Varsity members: Total for Spirit Pack and away Cheer Camp = \$1,650.00
  - i. Due May 9. 2024: \$500.00. Due June 6, 2024: \$500.00. Due: August 10, 2024: any remaining balance (if any). The account needs to be paid off prior to the end of the first full week of school in order for the team member to participate.
- c. Male Junior Varsity members: Total for Spirit Pack and Away Cheer Camp = \$1,550.00
  - i. Due May 9. 2024: \$500.00. Due June 6, 2024: \$500.00. Due: August 10, 2024: any remaining balance (if any). The account needs to be paid off prior to the end of the first full week of school in order for the team member to participate.
- f. Female Varsity members: Total for Spirit Pack and a Home Cheer Camp = \$1,650.00
  - i. Due May 9. 2024: \$500.00. Due June 6, 2024: \$500.00. Due: August 10, 2024: any remaining balance (if any). The account needs to be paid off prior to the end of the first full week of school in order for the team member to participate.
- g. Male Varsity members: Total for Spirit Pack and Away Cheer Camp = \$1,550.00
  - Due May 9. 2024: \$500.00. Due June 6, 2024: \$500.00. Due: August 10, 2024: any remaining balance (if any). The account needs to be paid off prior to the end of the first full week of school in order for the team member to participate.

#### F. FUNDRAISING: OUR GOAL IS TO MAKE CHEERLEADING ACCESSIBLE AND AFFORDABLE TO EVERYONE!

- a. Cheer cannot occur without fundraising, It is crucial that each member participates in the required fundraising activities.
  - Individual Fundraisers: An individual fundraiser is a fundraiser where money goes specifically towards the cheerleader. Individual fundraisers will be offered beginning in April! An example of an individual fundraiser would be Program Ad Sales, the POPCORN Fundraiser or the Calendar Fundraiser. Any funds raised during an "individual" fundraiser will be deducted from the Spirit Pack cost for that individual member. This means, a cheerleader can pay off the ENTIRE cost of their Spirit Pack COMPLETELY with fundraising! If a candidate raises

- more money on an individual fundraiser that is owed to the program for Spirit Pack costs, that money will be put into the Cheer Club General Account to cover miscellaneous expenses.
- ii. <u>Team Fundraisers:</u> every team member is required to participate. In order for the program to run properly, we must have team money in the account. This money will be used for items such as but not limited to: game snacks, pregame meals, Christmas party, end-of-year banquet, etc. Team Fundraisers include but not limited to: Club Fair, Fantastic fundraising card sales, Snack Bar sales, car washes, restaurant fundraisers, and clothing sales. Team fundraisers must have every team member actively participating.
- iii. Fundraising after a payment: If a team member fundraises individually (individual fundraisers) after submitting payment, they will be issued a refund ONLY AFTER their entire account has been credited/paid off.

#### G. FAILURE TO PAY

- 1. If a team member does not pay by the deadline, the member will not receive gear or equipment which will result in athlete not participating in events.
- 2. Final payments will need to be submitted to Coach at practice on the first day of school. Any payments that are not made will become debts in the system starting the second day of school.
- 3. If a team\_member remains on the team but does not pay by the set due date, the team member may be benched until account is up-to-date on all payments. The member is still responsible for payments once items have been ordered even if the member quits or is dismissed from the team.
- 4. If a team member quits or is dismissed from the team after spirit items have been ordered, they are still responsible for paying off their balance. Due to the fact that each item is individualized each year and ordered in the sizes designated by the member, the items are non-refundable and will become debts through the system. Competition fees are non-refundable regardless of eligibility at time of competition.
- 5. <u>Debts:</u> Having a debt means that the student will be ineligible to purchase and attend school-sponsored functions, such as the Homecoming Dance, Winter Formal Dance, and Prom, until the debt is paid off.
- 6. It shall be the policy of the school administrators according to Board Policy 5340-1 to withhold grades, diplomas and transcripts of pupils responsible for financial liabilities as indicated in Education Code Section 48909(a).

#### VI. DRESSCODE:

Team member is responsible for maintain the following dress code requirements for practices/events/ spirit days/etc. Team member is also required to maintain all regular dress code guidelines established within the Hesperia High School student handbook.

#### A. BASIC DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

- a. All team members (female/male) must adhere to HHS dress code requirements as explained in the Hesperia High School handbook while on campus. Receiving a dress code violation will result in disciplinary actions and could lead to suspension/dismissal. No hats / visors / bandanas / etc. are allowed at cheer related events unless approved.
- b. NFIIS Section 3 Article 4 states: Fingernails, including artificial nails, must be kept short and near the ends of the fingers.
- 6. NFHS Section 2 Article 9 states: Participants must not chew gum or have candy in their mouths during practice or performances.

#### B. PRACTICE ATTIRE

- c. Practice clothing will be athletic clothing that should properly cover and support the body and should not "expose" midriff, buttocks or chest when bending over, squatting, jumping, stretching, running, raising arms during activity. Low cut tops, midriff tops, spaghetti strap tops with exposed bra straps, short-shorts (less than 3" inseam) or briefs, or "revealing" practice wear will not be permitted. "Street attire" like jeans, sandals, inappropriate words/graphics etc. will not be permitted. Don't miss a practice due to inappropriate attire!
- d. Athletic shoes and socks must be worn at all times. Practices in socks, sandals, slippers, slides, boots, dress shoes, Crocs (even in sports mode), or barefoot is NOT allowed.
- e. NO jewelry is allowed to be worn at practice. This includes but is not limited to: earrings, facial piercings, belly button piercings, necklaces, bracelets, rings, or watches. An exception may be made for medical-alert medals. NFHS Section 3 Article 1
- f. Hair that falls below the neck must be placed in a ponytail NFHS Section 3 Article 5
- g. If a team member sits out due to inappropriate attire it will count as an unexcused absence.

#### C. GAME/PERFORMANCE DAY ATTIRE

- h. Team members are required to wear FULL UNIFORM on performance/event/game days. FULL UNIFORM INCLUDES ALL of the following: BOW, Uniform Skirt/Warm-Up Pants, Sleeves, Shell, WHITE ANKLE socks and Cheer Shoes. Hair must be all the way up, unless otherwise designated by coaches. Jewelry such as necklaces and watches cannot be worn with uniforms. Uniforms are not allowed to be rolled or altered in any way.
- i. Team members NOT in FULL uniform on the required day at the designated time WILL BE BENCHED for the following game/performance/event.
- j. No jewelry is allowed on game days NO EXCEPTIONS

#### D. SPIRIT DAY ATTIRE

- a. Team members are required to dress spirited every Thursday or Friday (depending on JV or V) during football season, as well as during the school day of every home wrestling match and other miscellaneous days throughout the year. Spirit attire will be designated by the Coaches, and placed on the calendar. Spirit attire includes ALL of the following: BOW, assigned shirt, Cheer sweatshirt/jacket (if applicable), jeans with NO holes, WHITE socks and Cheer shoes.
- b. Team members NOT in Spirit Wear on the required day will be benched for the following game/event/performance. Team members may also be required to complete extra conditioning at the spirit day event.
- E. If team members continuously do not follow dress code, team members may also be required to wear a Coach-provided bow at the following event/game, or may be benched. Not following dress code could also result in disciplinary action/dismissal from the team.

#### VII. CONDUCT

#### 1. Conduct

- a. As a representative of Hesperia High School and as a member of the Cheerleading Squad, the cheerleaders are now accountable to the team and the coaching staff for their actions. All cheerleaders are expected to promote sportsmanship and team unity, uphold a high standard conduct and behave in positive, friendly and moral manner. Team members accept the high standard of discipline required as a member of the HHS Scorpion Cheer Team and will conduct themselves as such, both in and out of uniform, when representing themselves, the team, the school and the community.
- b. As a coaching staff, we reserve the right to take any course of action that we believe necessary to maintain the positive image of Hesperia Cheerleading. This may include suspension or termination of a team-member for actions in or out of uniform, on or off campus, that reflect negatively on the other members of our team. We also reserve the right to take NO ACTION in certain circumstances that require investigation. Discipline will be on an individual basis, yet consistent with the team.
- c. All of our team-members will show proper respect to all teammates, coaches, school authorities and opponents. DISRESPECT in any form could result in suspension and/or termination from the squad. It is important to exercise self-control at all times, to set a positive example for others to follow.
- d. Unacceptable citizenship in any class will not be tolerated, and will have consequences.
- Cheerleaders will at all times BE KIND, USE YOUR MANNERS AND THINK OF OTHERS FIRST as well as cooperate with the
  coaches and the other cheer team members.
- Personal conflicts with other team members are to be immediately brought to the coach's attention and kept OUTSIDE of cheer time
  to help maintain safety and a positive attitude during practices and performances.
- 2. Social Media: Maintaining a higher standard of conduct also includes ensuring team member's websites are appropriate. The internet is a worldwide, publicly accessible form of communication. Any communications on social media site, photo sharing, chat rooms, blogs, etc. appearing on the internet are public domain, even if it's marked private. Team members are responsible for their personal websites, accounts and postings as well as for postings on other students' websites. Areas of appropriateness that will be subject for disciplinary action include but are not limited to: Inappropriate Language and profanity (abbreviated or alluding to), inappropriate pictures, suggestive poses, inappropriate clothing, references to tobacco, alcohol, drugs, comments about cheer members and/or coaches, or any type of/perceived cyber bullying.
- 3. <u>Drugs, Alcohol & Tobacco:</u> A cheerleader may not unlawfully possess, use, sell, furnish or be under the influence of any alcoholic beverage, intoxicant, controlled substance, or tobacco on the campus or at any school sponsored activity, in or out of uniform. Cheerleader may be suspended or expelled and/or issued a clean sweep citation. (PC 308, PC647F, HS11357e, Ed Code 48900.1) Cheerleader will be dismissed from the team immediately. NO EXCEPTIONS!

#### Being Benched

- a. A cheerleader may be benched from a game or performance due to behavior, attendance, grades, or other reasons. Being benched means that the team member may be required to sit out of dance/cheer performances, including quarter and/or halftime performances. However, a cheerleader may still be required to stunt during the performances in order to not affect other team members.
- b. If a cheerleader is benched, they are still required to attend the game/performance on time and in complete uniform.
- 5. Causes for Immediate Suspension or Dismissal from practice, games, events/functions, and/or HHS Cheer Team
  - a. Disciplines, suspensions or dismissals are at the complete discretion of the IIHS Coaching staff.
  - b. The following actions and/or behaviors will NOT BE TOLERATED (in or out of uniform) and could result in immediate dismissal from the team. This includes, but is not limited to:
    - Displaying or perceived disrespect of coaches, captains, other team members and school staff (includes social media)
    - Failure to meet the requirements, attendance and eligibility of a team member or follow HHS Scorpion Cheer Team Rules and Regulations
    - Any violation of Duties and Conduct
    - Defiance of coaches/Insubordination: verbal or written instructions or directions
    - Failure to meet the requirements of the Hesperia High School Rules and Student Handbook
    - Parental interference with cheer program
    - Any disciplinary action taken on behalf of Hesperia High School
    - Lying / intentional deceiving / cheating
    - Complaining excessively
    - Using cell phone without asking permission
    - Constant use of profanity, inappropriate language, behaviors, actions
    - Lack of knowledge of cheers or performance material (can also result in being benched or count as an unexcused absence
    - Inappropriate or revealing practice wear, incorrect Team Wear or Performance Wear (Team Dress Code)
    - Failure to maintain expected sideline behavior and etiquette
    - Taunting or "cheering at" other teams
    - Lack of focus, behavior or acting in an unsafe manner as determined by coaches
    - Ignoring arrival and dismissal times for games, events, or buses
    - Displaying public affection during school, school events/activities or while representing HHS Cheer
    - Exhibiting, alluding to or perceived conduct that does not exemplify a good role model, such as information displayed on social media, behaviors on campus or in the community
    - Fighting, verbal, or physical altercations (including participation, association with, or threatening), or bullying, both on and
      off campus
    - Intoxication or under the influence of alcohol, controlled substances or illegal substances participating in unlawful or illegal activities etc.
    - Violation of Hesperia High School Rules or the HHS Student Handbook
    - Any actions/behaviors deemed unbecoming of an IIHS Cheerleader by the coaches at their discretion

- C. If a cheerleader is suspended, they are still required to attend practices and games/performances on time and in proper attire, unless otherwise deemed by the coach.
- d. If a cheerleader is dismissed, they must turn in their uniform within one week, or the uniform will be debted to their account.

  DISCIPLINES, SUSPENSIONS AND DISMISSALS ARE AT THE DISCRETION OF THE HHS CHEER COACHING STAFF

### VIII. CELL PHONE POLICY

- a. Cell phones must be off and out of sight during school hours at Hesperia High School. As leaders on campus, it is expected that a cheerleader obeys all school rules, including the cell phone policy.
- b. Cell phone usage, texting and photo/video taking are a distraction during cheer practices, games and events and will not be permitted. Cell phones will be asked to be put away on silent and may be collected prior to cheer practices and functions to prevent unauthorized photo and video taking/sharing. Parents need to be aware of this policy. Team members must ask to use their phone and will be asked to step out during use. In an emergency, parents may contact the coaches during a cheer function. Failure to do so will result in disciplinary action.
- Coaches are to be contacted via email or through the designated contact site. Text messages to coaches should only be used in case of
  an emergency.
- d. Members will be sent text messages/emails/called from coaches, captains, or combination of both. All messages are to remain professional at all times. All text messages/emails/calls are to occur between the hours of 6:00am 8:00pm. Only emergency texts/phone calls are to be made out of the designated time frame.

#### IX. FOOD AND DRINK POLICY

- a. Being a part of the cheer team means being an athlete. Please consider all food and drink options as an athlete to properly fuel your body. An athlete should also eat meals and/or snacks throughout the day. If at any time a coach, a staff member, or member of the team feel that there is an eating disorder taking place, the appropriate authorities will be contacted immediately.
- b. Practices There is to be no Gum, Candy, or eating during practice times. Food/Soda are NOT allowed in any practice area. Water and Gatorade/Sport Drinks are allowed only.
- **Games/Performances/Events** There is to be no gum allowed during a game/performance/event. Food is only allowed at the designated times (such as halftime after performances).
- d. If gum or food is out/seen during times it is not allowed, the cheerleader will have to condition after the game/performance and could possibly be benched.

#### X. INJURY

- a. All precautions are taken at practice. However, accidents do occur. If a cheerleader gets injured at practice, it is crucial that the cheerleader informs the coach as soon as the injury takes place. The athlete will then be sent to the on-site Athletic Trainer to evaluate the cheerleader. If the injury is deemed serious, a phone call home will be placed. Make ensure that the phone number on the student's physical form is accurate.
- b. If a member needs to go to the doctor, the doctor may complete a pre-designated sheet of clearance that the team member received either from coach or the Hesperia High School's athletic trainer. A doctor's note received from the doctor must clear the athlete to return to PHYSICAL ACTIVITY. A note that clears a student to return to school does not clear the student to return to cheer.
- c. Notes must be signed by a doctor, and not a nurse or P.A.
- d. Team members on a medical/injury leave are required to attend and dress for all practice games, events, and functions unless prior approval is given ahead of time by the coach and documentation had been provided.

#### XI. TRANSPORTATION

- a. All athletes must travel to and from athletic events in transportation provided by the athletic department. In extreme situations an athlete may request permission from the athletic director to ride home from a contest with a parent/guardian by completing a Parent/Guardian Responsibility From. This form requires signatures from parent/guardian, coach, and the Athletic Director and must be submitted to the Athletic office 48 hours prior to the start of the event. The exceptions to this protocol are traveling to schools within the Hesperia Unified School District with the approval of the Athletic Director. The Parent/Guardian Responsibility Form in available in the Athletics Office. For further information please contact Athletic Department at 760-244-9898 ext. 3911
- b. If a member is late for ANY away bus or car pool, they will be left behind and will result in an absence from a game
- c. Some cheerleading events go late into the evening. When the team is dismissed from events, such as Friday night football games, away games, competitions, etc., the coach will remain with the cheerleaders until the last member is picked up. Team members must be picked up within 15 minutes of being released. If a member is still not picked up after 15 minutes, the police may be called. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to arrange for a ride home for the cheerleader.

#### XII. ATHLETIC LETTERING

- . <u>Varsity Requirements -</u> In order for a Varsity member to letter, the requirements are as follows:
  - i. CAN NOT miss more than 1 game for entire cheer season
  - ii. CAN NOT miss more than 2 Frosh/JV football games (participation/squad support)
  - iii. CAN NOT be suspended from more than 4 games all season
  - iv. CAN NOT quit prior to end of season or be dismissed from team for any reason
  - v. Must maintain academic G.P.A. of 2.0 all season
- b. <u>Iunior Varsity Requirements</u> In order to be eligible to receive participation certificate, squad member:
  - i. CAN NOT miss more than 1 game for entire cheer season
  - ii. CAN NOT miss more than 2 Varsity home Football Games (participation/squad support)
  - iii. CAN NOT be suspended for more than 4 games all season
  - iv. CAN NOT quit prior to end of season or be dismissed from team for any reason
  - v. Must maintain academic G.P.A. of 2.0 all season

- XIII. CAPTAINS: Captains will be selected by the advisor/coach, based on leadership skills and prior dedication to the squad. Only members who display respect for the team and have respect from the team will be considered. All squad members are expected to treat their captains with their full cooperation and respect. Assignment of captains is at the discretion of the coaches.
  - a. Being a captain is a privilege that can be revoked by the Coaches if the Cheerleader does not meet the requirements of the squad. In addition to following all squad requirements outlined in this contract, all captains are also required to:
    - i. Attend ALL games and practices on time
    - ii. Be a leader and positive role model for all other members. This includes being uplifting and supportive of members, being excited to attend all practices and games, and stressing the importance of maintaining good grades
    - iii. Supporting and enforcing the rules set by the Coaches without argument or attitude
  - b. Failure to abide by the additional responsibilities of Captain could result in removal of the position.

#### XIV. PARENT INVOLVEMENT

- a. The most important contribution a parent can make to the team is support towards your cheerleader, coaching staff, and the rules and regulations set in place for the team. Please help instill in your cheerleader the importance of commitment, responsibility, discipline, punctuality, dependability, trust and respect for each other, their community and their superiors.
- b. Parent involvement and support is key to any successful cheer program. Parent volunteers are needed to help in fundraisers, chaperones, transportation, and "half-time" snacks.
- c. <u>Practices are closed</u>. (sorry parents) Family members (including parents and siblings), friends, boyfriends/girlfriends are not permitted to attend for any reason. If an extreme situation arises, please notify coaches and certain accommodations can be made.

#### XV. CHEER COACH/ADVISOR

- a. It is the cheer coach(es) responsibility to maintain a well-respected program; in order to effectively run a respected program it is the coaches responsibility to, but not limited to: adopt and execute a comprehensive and safe program, approve all cheer/dance routines, material, and music prior to public display, keep attendance, see that the team members abide by the HHS Scorpion Cheer Rules and Regulations as well as HHS Student Conduct Codes, set and uphold disciplines, advise team members/ authorities/ parental figures/etc. whenever necessary, and any other duties deemed necessary.
- b. ALL COACHES ARE MANDATED REPORTERS!

#### XVI. ATHLETIC PHYSICAL EDUCATION CLASS

- a. Coach Walker will have a 6th period Athletic P.E. class for Cheerleaders. Students in this class will receive physical education credit (therefore being exempt from general P.E.). If the student has already completed the required two years of physical education, they will receive elective credit for the course that will count towards graduation.
- b. Please ensure that when you register, you inform your counselor that you are trying out for the cheer team. Only members that are on the team will be allowed into the class.
- c. It is crucial that every member is in this class. The purpose of this class is to eliminate the numerous hours spent after school practicing. Although after hour practices will still be required, the amount of those practices and length of those practices will be significantly decreased due to the hour of practice built into the students' schedules during 6th period. This class is mandatory however, the coaching staff understands that this may cause scheduling conflicts for some students. <u>Please speak to Coach if you have a conflict</u>.
