#### Avoiding January Blues...

Research shows that not only adults but children (even little kids), who are grateful, are happier and have higher rates of optimism. It increases your dopamine and serotonin!



Research suggests there are four parts to the experience of gratitude, but we rarely teach all of them to our kids. For full article:

#### FOUR PARTS OF GRATITUDE



**NOTICE:** What have you been given or what do you already have in your life for which you are grateful? Are there gifts behind the material gifts for which you are grateful, like someone thinking about you or caring about you enough to give you the gift?



**THINK:** Why do you think you received this gift? Do you think you owe the giver something in return? Do you think you earned the gift because of something you did yourself? Do you think the gift was something the giver had to give you? If you answered no to these questions, then you may be more likely to be grateful.



**FEEL:** Does it make you feel happy to get this gift? What does that feel like inside? What about the gift makes you feel happy? These questions help the child connect their positive feeling to the gifts that they receive in their lives.



**DO:** Is there a way you want to show how you feel about this gift? Does the feeling you have about this gift make you want to share that feeling by giving something to someone else? Prompting children after experiences of gratitude in order to motivate acts of gratitude, whether they be acts of appreciation or paying it forward, may help children connect their

experiences and actions in the world.

- Students in grades 4 through 6 are eligible to create a sculpture of recyclable, reused and reduced materials.


#### CONTEST RULES

- Students need to write an artist statement to describe the sculpture in 3-5 sentences.

- St. Clair County Garden Club Members will judge the sculptures on Thursday January 25th (bring entries to Mrs. Fischer)
- Three monetary prizes will be offered-\$25, \$15 & \$10, plus multiple honorary mention certificates.
- Winning sculptures will be photographed and sent on to the Illinois State Garden Club contest
- Judging Criteria
  - Creative use of materials and self expression: 60%
  - Description of sculpture and materials used: 30%
  - Craftsmanship and technique: 10%


