

Needed Items for Food Bank

This year instead of doing the traditional food drive for Christmas for our community, KMS is going to focus on personal care products. The **Ellsworth County Food Bank** is low on these items right now. Each child is asked to bring ONE item only and bring it to school by Friday, December 15th.
