The holiday break has allowed us to recharge our batteries and we welcome 2024 with a bright chipper attitude. The nice weather we had in November and December has certainly shortened the winter season (and ice fishing too②).

The staff have been attending trainings and working diligently to develop a multi-tier system of supports (MTSS) for every student in the school. This process has required staff to attend workshops and spend countless hours analyzing data. Much of this training has been funded by the \$65,000 grant that the school received for being a high performing Title I school in ND. As part of this process, a trainer from the South East Education Cooperative (SEEC) will be coming out to work with staff on Jan 17. GSPS will be holding professional development just one day in January. Instead of having a late start on Jan. 17th and the 31st, the 17th will be a FULL DAY professional development day. That means there will be NO SCHOOL for students on the 17th. However, on the 31st school will be in session ALL DAY. Thank you for understanding and being flexible. Big credit to Mrs. Buckeye and the staff for all of the hard work that has gone into this process.

Please come out and enjoy an evening of boys basketball on Jan. 13rd and a girl's game one Jan. 19th. The highly anticipated soup/chili cookoff will also be Jan. 19th. Kindergarten News




In ELA classes we have been working on letters, rhyming, beginning and ending sounds, blending and segmenting.

Reminder: AR book bags will start coming home with your child after Christmas. The bags will include all instructions.




