Consideration will be given to what is best for students as well as what will be most cost effective.

Shapes: Introduce Oval and review circle, rectangle, square, triangle, trapezoid, crescent, and heart.


Colors: Introduce gray and brown. Review: yellow, orange, black, brown, orange, gold, green, blue, white, red, pink.


