### What is the Talent Search Program?

Talent Search is one of the Federal TRIO Programs dedicated to assisting high school students in furthering their education.



Our counselors work with over 2,000 Pennsylvania middle and high school students a year to provide services, information, and guidance for your education after high school.

### Who is eligible to receive services?

Talent Search is primarily available to students who are from low-income households, and whose parents did not go to college, but <u>anyone can apply</u>.

- Your family's current financial information (No requirement to provide documentation.)
- Are you a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or in the process of applying for citizenship?
- Do you want to attend college or get a certification after high school?

# Sharon High Spanish One Students Learn about the Columbian Exchange

As part of "Hispanic Heritage Month," the students in Nora Songer's Spanish One Classes at Sharon High School learned about some of the Positive effects of the Columbian Exchange. The Columbian Exchange refers to the widespread transfer of plants, animals, precious metals, commodities, culture, human populations, technology, diseases, and ideas between the New World (North, Central and South America, Plus the islands of the Caribbean) and the Old World (Asia, Africa, and Europe), following Christopher Columbus's voyages in 1492. Some of the exchanges were purposeful; some were accidental or unintended. The cultures of both hemispheres were significantly impacted by the migration of People (both free and enslaved) from the Old World to the New. The new contacts among the global population resulted in the interchange of a wide variety of crops and livestock, which supported increases in food production and population in the Old World. New World crops such as corn/maize, potatoes, tomatoes, tobacco, cassava, squash, sweet potatoes, chili peppers and chocolate became important crops around the world. Old World crops such as rice, wheat, and sugar cane, and the introduction of livestock (cattle and Pigs, in Particular), became important in the New World.

The students in Spanish One learned that without corn, tomatoes, and Peppers, some of their favorite foods could not be made. As part of their lesson, they learned how to make tortillas de maiz (corn tortillas) and salsa fresca (fresh salsa). Students took turns rolling the corn masa (dough) into balls, flattening them on a prensa tortillera (tortilla press), and cooking them on a comal (griddle). While the tortillas were being made, other students mixed together the ingredientes (ingredients) for the salsa. Fresh tomates (tomatoes), cilantro (coriander), cebollas (onions), sal (salt), limon (lime), pimienta (pepper) and chiles picantes (hot peppers) were mixed together in just the right combination to create the tasty mixture. In addition to the tortilla and the salsa, the students also sampled frijoles refritos con Quesito (refried beans with cheese). All agreed that everything was Muy Delicioso!
