

## KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE IN AND AROUND THE SCHOOL BUS

While the school bus is the safest way to travel to and from school, children still need to be careful as they get on and off the bus. Obstructed views and distracted drivers put children at risk. It's important that parents teach them ways they can stay safe in and around the school bus.

- Show children how and when to stay at a safe distance.
- Younger children should be supervised at the bus stop.
- Children who rush are particularly vulnerable, so make sure to get to the bus stop early.
- Show children how to stay three giant steps away from the road until the school bus comes to a complete stop and the door opens.
- Children should never walk behind the school bus.
- Children who cross in front of the school bus should stay at least five giant steps (10 feet) away from it and make sure that the bus driver sees them before they step off the curb.
- Teach children to wait until no cars are coming from either direction before they cross the street.
- Make eye contact with the driver and wait for the OK signal to cross the road.
- Explain to children why conversations and play time should wait until they are safely seated, or safely away from the school bus.
- Children should use handrails when getting on and off the school bus and secure any loose or hanging objects, like straps or drawstrings.
- If a child drops something outside the school bus, tell them to NEVER try to pick it up. They should always tell the driver and wait for his or her instructions.


## It's estimated that over 10 million drivers illegally pass school buses every year.

- Children should not yell while riding the school bus. The bus driver needs to be able to hear other vehicles on the road.

## TIPS FOR STAYING SAFE

- The most dangerous area around the school bus is within a 10 -foot radius on all sides. Show children how and when to stay at a safe distance.
- Younger children should be supervised at the bus stop.
- Children who rush are particularly vulnerable, so make sure to get to the bus stop early.
- Show children how to stay three giant steps away from the road until the school bus comes to a complete stop and the door opens.
- Children should never walk behind the school bus.
- Children who cross in front of the school bus should stay at least five giant steps (10 feet) away from it and make sure that the bus driver sees them before they step off the curb.

- Teach children to wait until no cars are coming from either direction before they can cross the street.
- Tell children that conversations and play time have to wait until they are safely seated, or safely away from the school bus.
- Children should use handrails when getting on and off the school bus and secure any loose or hanging objects, like straps or drawstrings.

Motorists risk children's lives when they fail to stop for the school bus as it loads and unloads its passengers. Yet it's estimated that over 10 million drivers illegally pass school buses every year. To keep children safe, start by learning the laws in your state. It's illegal to pass a school bus within the roadway as it drops off or picks up passengers-regardless of the direction of approach. Remember that there is no "safe" way to illegally pass the school bus, so be cautious when sharing the road with it. Finally, let others know that putting kids' lives at risk is not OK. ## LISTEN TO THE BUS DRIVER, FOLLOW THEIR DIRECTIONS IMMEDIATELY

 DO NOT WEAR HEADPHONES/EARBUDS WHEN BOARDING OR EXITING THE BUSDO NOT USE YOUR CELL PHONE WHEN BOARDING OR EXITING THE BUS

ONCE YOU ARE ON THE BUS, QUICKLY FIND A SEAT, SIT DOWN AND STAY SEATED

KEEP HEAD, HANDS AND ARMS INSIDE THE BUS KEEP AISLES CLEAR, BACKPACKS, BOOKS AND INSTRUMENTS MUST BE OUT OF THE WAY OF THE AISLES KEEP YOUR SPEECH POSITIVE AND UPLIFTING (WORDS CAN HURT AND BELITTLE
DO NOT SMOKE-THIS INCLUDES VAPING AND SMOKELESS TOBACCO
