Tips on how to talk about Bullying at Home

- Help them define bullying.
 - Often times students confuse bullying with other relational conflict. A bully is someone who intentionally tries to harm someone over a consistent period of time in order to gain control or power.
- Teach your child how to be assertive. Encourage your children to express their feelings clearly, say no when they feel uncomfortable or pressured, stand up for themselves without fighting and walk away in dangerous situations.
- Empower them to take a stand.
 - Come up with a plan to stand up to bullying. Tell your child to take action when they see bullying behavior. Tell them to speak out against the bully and inform a teacher if the behavior doesn't stop. Bullying continues only when we allow it to.
 - If they are not comfortable speaking up, encourage them to reach out for support. Talk to them about who their support system can be. (Parents, Staff Members, Friends, Etc.)
