

ONLINE MASTER OF SCIENCE DEGREE SPECIAL EDUCATION

The *Master of Science* degree program, is designed for practicing LBS special education teachers who have prior training and licensure in special education. The program is designed to meet professional goals of special educators who want to develop *teacher leadership skills and increase the use of best practices* for learners with disabilities. Courses are taught by graduate faculty who have both practical experience and expertise in special education. Each cohort will work with a faculty mentor for a culminating project.

Program Format

On-line courses (Online lectures, discussions, and group activities)

Cohort model

Personal on-line instructor conferences as appropriate for the class

Applied projects that assist candidates in bridging research to practice

30 total credit hours

Individualized culminating project

Admission Requirements (in addition to meeting ISU graduate study requirements):

Minimum of 3.0 GPA in the last 60 semester- hours of undergraduate work submit GRE scores if less than 3.0)

Current teaching license

At least one year teaching experience

Resume, cover letter, and two references

Our preferred application completion date is June 15 for the fall term. Applications received after June 15 will be reviewed if additional spaces are available.
