PK-3 & PK-4: Full-Day Program

WHO MAY REGISTER?

All students must be 3-4 years of age on or before October 1, 2024 to enroll in the program. Open Registration is designed to streamline the registration process by allowing parents and guardians to pre-verify basic demographic information about students online, before they visit a school or district office to complete the registration process. Open Registration does not replace in-person registration; it streamlines it and should speed up and shorten the actual visit a parent or guardian makes to the school or district office where the registration process is to be completed. 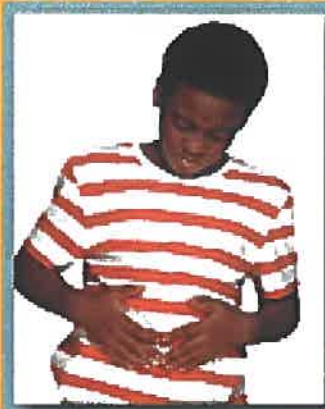

When Should Children Stay Home From School?



When the Child:

- Seems ill
- Is not able to comfortably
- participate in school activities



- Is sweaty (when the weather is not hot)
- Has a fever



- Coughs or sneezes more than usual
- Has pain in ears, throat, head or chest



- Has thrown up in the past 12 hours
- Has had diarrhea two or more times in the past 24 hours

Check with your child's school for their stay home policy.
