Students, parents, and teachers gathered for two special showcases at Margaret Chase Smith Elementary School this week.


These showcases featured the efforts of students in Ms. Wilson's, Ms. Cote's, and Ms. Devine's classrooms.


The Crucial Role of Maintenance and Custodians When Winter Weather Arrives


